

ENGINEERING BEST PRACTICE - BP2.2.3

1. SUBJECT: TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION ACCESS (TCA) – NEW RESIDENTIAL BUILDING

2. **DEFINITION**

A temporary access in the right-of-way from the municipal roadway to private property for the purpose of providing vehicular access during a construction period (ie home building in new developments or infill lots).

3. DRAWINGS

AS-542-A – Maximum Curb Cut for Residential Driveways with Single/Double Car Garages

AS-542-B - Maximum Curb Cut for Residential Driveways on Corner Lots

4. BEST PRACTICE

- 1. During construction activity a temporary construction access (TCA) may be constructed to provide vehicular access to a construction site. Permit and indemnity fees will be applicable.
- 2. TCA shall be located at permanent driveway location.
- 3. Curb may be cut to approved width.
- 4. TCA may be granular material.
- 5. TCA shall be formed to approved width from curb to property line, boulevard graded and level.
- 6. A separate Street Opening Permit for permanent driveway is required to replace TCA permit, or notice is provided by the City to the new owner to obtain a separate street opening permit for a permanent driveway.
- 7. TCA permit may be finalized if #2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 above are complied with, there is no damage to the right-of-way (including curbs), and the boulevard area is restored.
- 8. Property owner will be advised at final inspection of TCA that a permit is required for a permanent driveway.
