EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: NIA

2 BACKGROUND:

Recently, taxi vehicle colour schemes have been questioned due to the existence of cars that are not entirely painted in accordance with the two colours submitted to the Licence Commissioner by the broker. Bylaw Enforcement has expressed some difficulty in strictly enforcing the colour schemes as there are cases where a manufactured part is composed of a material that is not a paintable surface such as chrome or the porous, black or grey trim or bumpers. There are numerous vehicles on the road that exhibit such parts although the bylaw has no allowances for such cases.

3. **DISCUSSION:**

Adding the proposed wording to the bylaw will assist the Bylaw Enforcement Officers in the course of their business as it will remove subjectivity and provide a stricter guideline regardless of which officer performs the inspection. The wording in the amendment is good for vehicle owners as it allows vehicle owners to maintain the manufactured trim, bumpers, etc. that are made of materials which are not intended to be painted, so long as the manufactured colour is black, grey or chrome. Additionally, this will improve the appearance of all vehicles; a positive outcome for the taxi industry as well as the customers and visitors to the City of Windsor. It should be noted that replacement parts are not parts considered *"as originally supplied by the manufacturer"* for that vehicle and therefore would have to adhere to the colour scheme.
