Downtown Student Open House

The salient points of discussion relating to the. Downtown Student Open House are as follows:

- Suggestion to hold the Open House at the Windsor Star News Cafe.

5, <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

The.Chair indicates there are parking issues in the area along California Avenue, south of College near the University of Windsor's Human Kinetics Building as follows:

- Students wishing to park near the Human Kinetics Building have blocked driveways of residents in the area.
- J. Boyd to address this issue with the Dean of the University of Windsor.
- There is no permit parking in this area at present.
- Vehicle can be towed if blocking a driveway.
- Suggestion for the .Ward Councillor to provide information (education pamphlet) to neighbours regarding the process to acquire permit parking.
- Permit parking restricts the number of guests visiting one's.home.
- Suggestion to invite a representative from Transportation Planning to attend the next meeting, or for a City Councillor to ask a Council Question requesting options for public parking on a street.

Councillor Francis reports there is a gap in the fence near the Sportsplex at St. Clair College. He notes neighbours are concerned with the safety of the students.

M. Cardinal refers to the following two motions passed at the October 15, 2013 meeting of the Town and Gqwn Committee as follows:

"That Administration BE REQUESTED to review the Zoning By-law and to develop governance relating to side yard parking on a corner and to report back to the Town and Gown Committee".

"That Administration BE REQUESTED to investigate the feasibility of upgrading the street lighting from standard to residential standards in the 500 metre area of all 3 city campuses on the periphery of the University of Windsor and to report back with the findings".

A. Kalinowski advises the Building Department provides inspections of front and side yard parking and suggests a representative from the Building Department attend the next meeting to provide input relating to this matter.

The Chair invites Alan Richardson to speak and the following comments are made:

- Thanks the City for the City of Windsor's "Neighbourly Living" website.
- Requests the Town and Gown Committee meet on a quarterly basis.
- Requests members of the Town and Gown Committee attend the 2016 Town and Gown Symposium.
