Roseland Area Traffic Calming Concept

Actions Undertaken Since Public Meeting

- IMPACT OF CONCEPTS CONSIDERED IN LIGHT OF COMMENTS RECEIVED
- GOVERNING PRINCIPLES DEVELOPED IN THE DESIGN OF A SOLUTION:
 - RESPECT EXISTING PEDESTRIAN AND CYCLING USES.
 - TRAFFIC VOLUMES SHOULD NOT BE
 INCREASED ADJACENT TO RESIDENTS' HOMES.
 - INCREASED TIME REQUIRED FOR VEHICLES TO CUT THROUGH NEIGHBOURHOOD / REDUCED SPEEDS
 - PROTECT EMERGENCY ACCESS AND PUBLIC SERVICE DELIVERY TO NEIGHBOURHOOD.

- APPROVAL BY CITY COUNCIL MAY 2011 (PROJECTED)

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Implementation Plan

- IDENTIFY LEVEL OF NEIGHBOURHOOD SUPPORT
 - •• 66% SUPPORT FROM NEIGHBOURHOOD REQUIRED FOR RECOMMENDATION OF PLAN TO COUNCIL.
- APPROVED BY COUNCIL (PROJECTED) MAY 2011, INCLUDING FUNDING.
- CONSTRUCTION OF EACH PHASE WILL PROCEED AS BUDGET IS MADE AVAILABLE.
- SPEED AND VOLUME STUDIES WILL BE UPDATED FOLLOWING EACH PHASE.
- SHOULD NEIGHBOURHOOD ACHIEVE REDUCTIONS
 BELOW THRESHOLD OF TRAFFIC CALMING POLICY
 AFTER A GIVEN PHASE, IMPLEMENTATION WILL BE
 CONCLUDED.
