2015 Gross Operating Budget by Major Types of Expenditures

Total Gross Expenditures: \$746 Million

- [37.5%] Salaries & Benefits
- [23.6%] Transfers for Social Services
- [10.0%] Transfers to Reserves & Capital Funds
- [9.2%] Transfers to Education Entities *
- [7.5%] Purchased Services
- [3.6%] Utilities, Insurance & Taxes
- [3.3%] Transfers to External Agencies
- [2.4%] Operating & Maintenance Supplies
- [1.4%] Financial Expenses
- [1.2%] Minor Capital
- [0.4%] Other Miscellaneous Expenditures






How Will We Fund the Total Expenditures

- [4.4%] Other




















What is the 2015 Municipal Tax Levy Being Spent On?

2015 Total Net Municipal Levy: \$318,743,094









How Will Tax Payers Be Impacted by the 2015 Budget?

- The City will be collecting slightly less in total property taxes than in 2014.
- However, the impact on individual tax payers will depend on their MPAC assessment revaluation results compared to the average MPAC revaluation results, as well as the tax ratios that will be approved by Council in the spring of 2015.
- As part of the tax policies report, administration will provide City Council with a number of tax ratio modeling options for their consideration.











Sewer Surcharge

- No increase to rates
- Users that use the same amount of water will pay the same amount in 2015 as they did in 2014
- 5th time in the last 7 years there has been no increase
- Total revenues \$59.5 M
- \$26.3 going to fund sewer capital projects and equipment replacement








How Does Our Infrastructure Deficit Compare to Peer Municipalities?

Total Asset Consumption Ratio per Independent BMA Study



The percentages in the graph reflect the written down value of the tangible capital assets relative to their historical costs. A higher ratio may indicate significant replacement needs. It is a high level estimate of the municipalities overall infrastructure condition and replacement needs.











Capital Budget

- Total funding for the Capital Budget 5-Year Plan is \$496 million
- Capital funding for 2015 is \$98 million
- Total funding for roads and sewers in the 5-Year Plan is \$268 million or more than half of the total capital budget












Capital Expenditures

Total Funding Sources (2001 vs. 2015)












Long Term Debt Summary (in \$ Millions)

Debt Avoided = \$417 Million (\$515 M - \$98 M) Debt Avoided Per Capita = \$1,986 (\$417 M / 210,000)










Ontario Municipalities, Reserves as a % of Tax Revenues










Major Cost Increases Over the Last 10 Years














Negotiated Salary Increases (2008-2014)
