New relationships will be forged, and old ones leveraged as we continue to navigate Queen's Park and secure the province's participation in the burgeoning interest in cycling across Ontario. Our Summit Queen's Park lobby day and reception will provide plenty of opportunities for discussion!

But we need you – to attend the Summit, to engage in the conversation locally as so many of you are, and to work with us as we all strive for more Bicycle Friendly Communities in a Bicycle Friendly Ontario!
