M. E. Bernard states the event should exemplify what youth would like to see changed and to determine a "vision". She notes it is prudent to contact the school boards in advance of the event. She suggests a "clear idea" of what MYAC wants the speakers to talk about be communicated to the business leaders.

It is generally agreed a new website hosting service be investigated as the agreement with Go-Daddy will expire in early 2015.

M. E. Bernard suggests county-based schools also be invited to attend the event.

2014 Youth Leadershi!! Awards

2014 marked the third annual Youth Leadership Awards presented by Mayor Eddie Francis at the City Birthday Celebration in May. The committee worked hard to promote the awards to attract applicants, work with the external selection committee, and organize all logistics surrounding the Awards Ceremony. This was our first year using an online registration system to encourage youth to nominate themselves or others for a Youth Leadership Award. We received a record number of applicants and now have the mechanisms in place to continue to improve upon a process which has already shown results.

Myac involvement with Mayoral Debate and other local organisations
