



South Windsor Recreation Complex / Community Centre Consolidation




## Summary of Discussion with WAAC Members (May 29<sup>th</sup>, 2015)

1) Description of Barrier Removal Project and how it promotes universal access to all persons with disabilities (include appropriate references to attitudinal, informational, physical, technological, and architectural or policy barriers):

The Peace Lutheran Church is located on the northwest corner of Tecumseh Rd East and Rossini Boulevard. The Church fronts onto Rossini Boulevard and the main entrance has a concrete at grade entrance off of Rossini Boulevard. The entrance is also connected to the church parking lot located on the north side of the building by a concrete walkway. The church is located directly on a bus route with a drop off / pick up located on Tecumseh Rd East immediately adjacent to the building. Access to the church entrance by patrons using public transportation is by walking directly on Rossini Boulevard to the church

entrance. Rossini Boulevard is a road separated by a median boulevard resulting in room for a travelling car and a parked car in each direction. When cars are parked on the street there is little room to walk safely down the road to the entrance to the church. This condition is worse in winter when there is built up ice and snow on the road. The placement of a sidewalk along the west side of Rossini from Tecumseh Rd East northerly to the church entrance would provide a route of safe passage for all pedestrians attending the facility.



Excavation and preparation:  $60 \text{ m}^2 @ $20 / \text{m}^2 = $1,200.00$
