The installation of barrier free rubber surfacing at the playground swings in Atkinson Park. This is the second phase of the project to convert the existing sand surfaces to rubber at the swings to allow for the installation of accessible swing seats. The first phase involved the conversion of the play unit safety surface from sand to rubber
