2. <u>BACKGROUND</u>:

On April 8, 2013 City Council adopted Report No. 119 of the Environment, Transportation & Public Safety Standing Committee to cancel the delivery of the bi annual Taxicab Course and Vehicle Standards Inspection Lanes conducted by By-law Enforcement Officers and endorsed by the Windsor Licensing Commission, attached as Appendix "A".

On February 19, 2014 the Environment, Transportation & Public Safety Standing Committee adopted the following resolution in response to Amendments to Schedule 5 of Public Vehicles Licensing By-law 137-2007:

"THAT City Council approve amendments to Public Vehicles Licensing By-law 137-2007 which are necessary as a result of By-law Enforcement no longer providing the taxicab driver training course and no longer conducting semi-annual vehicle standards inspections on taxi vehicles in the City of Windsor"

On April 23, 2014, The Windsor Licensing Commission approved the Administrative report recommending that By-law Enforcement Officers conduct meter seal inspections on all licensed taxicabs twice a year to ensure meter accuracy.

3. <u>DISCUS</u>SION:

On December 20, 2012 a meeting was held with Administration from Licensing, Building and the Taxicab Industry to discuss the delivery of the taxicab driver training course. At that time all parties agreed that the taxicab driver training course would be delivered by independent brokerage companies as a pilot project to be re-evaluated on its progress after 12 months.

Veteran Taxicab started administering the taxicab driver training course in July 2013 through the utilization of an international program called "Taxicab, Limousine & Paratransit Association" (TLPA) and have been successfully delivering the taxicab training course since then. The TLPA taxicab driver training course is available to potential drivers on a first come first serve basis through a computer program consisting of self paced courses instead of a four day course scheduled bi-monthly as previously delivered by By-law Enforcement. As of April 16, 2014 Veteran Taxicab processed 59 potential drivers. These figures are very comparable to the Licensing Department 2012 statistics whereby 68 applicants took the City of Windsor delivered taxicab driver training course. According to feed back from Veteran Taxicab, the initiative has been working exceedingly well.

It should be noted that no other independent brokerage companies are delivering the taxicab driver training course and that no complaints or concerns have been made to By-law Enforcement or the Licensing Department.

LICENCE COMMISSIONER'S COMMENTS

An application to be placed on the Drivers' List was submitted by Taxicab Driver Saqib Mehmood on July 17, 2009.

Applicants that are on the Drivers' List are required to renew their application annually and pay the required fee. Mr. Mehmood failed to renew his application and pay the fee by his anniversary date of July 17, 2014. Administration was required to have his name stricken from the Drivers' List per the guidelines set out in Schedule 5 to By-law No. 137-2007. Mr. Mehmood has since exercised his right to file an appeal, petitioning the Windsor Licensing Commission to re instate his name back on the list.

REGULATORY AUTHORITY

Schedule 5 to Public Vehicle Licensing By-law No. 137-2007, Part III Section 7.2 thru to 7.5 states:

- 7.2 An applicant whose name has been placed on the Drivers' List shall be stricken from the Driver's List if at any time after being placed on the Drivers' List:
 - (a) the applicant acquires, by any means, a taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible vehicle plate licence or an interest of any kind, whether direct or indirect, in a taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible plate holder licence, or

becomes a shareholder in, or a partner in, or acquires some other interest in, a company or firm holding a taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible plate holder licence;

- (b) the applicant's taxicab driver licence lapses or is revoked;
- (c) the applicant ceases to earn his or her living in the City of Windsor on a full-time basis as defined in 7.1(c), where an applicant whose taxicab driver's licence has been suspended under this By-law shall be deemed not to cease to earn his living on a full-time basis as a taxicab driver during the period of his suspension; or,
- (d) the applicant fails to renew the application annually, including the signing of a statutory declaration as provided in 7.1(d) and the provision of the letter described in 7.1(d) and the payment of any required fees to maintain his or her status on the Drivers' List as required by the Licence Commissioner.
- 7.3 Any applicant on the Drivers' List who is determined by the Licence Commissioner not to comply with the requirements of this By-law, shall be notified in writing by the Licence Commissioner that his or her name is to be removed from the Drivers' List, and may appeal this removal by requesting a hearing before the Licensing Commission no more than fourteen (14) days following the date of issuance of the notice.
- 7.4 Where an applicant on the Drivers' List requests a hearing before the Licensing Commission under 7.3, the onus of proving compliance with the provisions of this Schedule shall rest with the applicant.
- 7.5 When a request for a hearing before the Licensing Commission has been made, the Licence Commissioner shall:
 - (a) not remove the name of the applicant appealing from the Drivers' List until the Licensing Commission has heard the appeal and City Council has finally disposed of it;
 - (b) note beside the name on the Drivers' List that an appeal has been requested; and,
 - (c) not issue any taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible plate and associated taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible plate holder licence until such time as the Licensing Commission has disposed of all outstanding appeals, except in the case of permitted transfers of taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible plates and associated taxicab or taxicab wheelchair accessible plate holder licenses under this Schedule.

BACKGROUND

• Thursday, May 1, 2014 a letter was sent by registered mail to Mr. Mehmood reminding him to renew his application and pay the required fee by his anniversary date of July 17, 2014. The letter indicated that failure to do so would result with his name being removed from the Driver's List.

- Canada Post tracking confirms that Mr. Mehmood accepted the registered letter on May 5, 2014.
- Wednesday, July 23, 2014 a letter was sent by registered mail to Mr. Mehmood advising him that his name has been removed from the Drivers' List for failing to renew his application.
- Tuesday, July 29, 2014 Mr. Mehmood provided the Licensing Division with an appeal letter petitioning the Windsor Licensing Commission to place his name back on the Drivers' List

SUMMARY

Mr. Mehmood has been on the Taxicab Drivers' List since July 17, 2009. Mr. Mehmood failed to renew his application by his annual deadline. Administration is obligated under Schedule 5 to Public Vehicle Licensing By-law No. 137-2007, Section 7.2 (d) to remove his name from the Drivers' List.







LICENCE COMMISSIONER'S COMMENTS

An application for a Taxicab Driver licence was submitted to the Licensing Division on July 24, 2014 by Ali Hussien Al-Ghezi of 748 Tuscarora Street, Windsor, Ontario. Licensing Division records indicate that Mr. Al-Ghezi has never been licensed before.

The Applicant (Ali Hussien Al-Ghezi) provided an Enhanced Criminal Records Check with his licence application that consisted of the following criminal conviction:

2014-04-23 Windsor, ON Excise Act 2001 \$8,942.00 fine, 3 Years Probation

REGULATORY AUTHORITY

Section 5.1 (g) (ii) of Schedule 5 to Public Vehicle Licensing By-law No. 137-2007 states:

- "5.1 Every Applicant in the first instance for a Taxicab Driver Licence shall:
- (g) provide:
- (ii) the original search results of a Vulnerable Sector Criminal Record Check, enhanced screening for those employed in positions working with vulnerable persons, from each jurisdiction in Canada in which the applicant has been resident

during the prior 365 days that is satisfactory in form and content to the Licence Commissioner. In the case of a renewal, the criminal record check must be dated no more than one (1) year prior to the date of the application for a licence renewal. For new applications, the criminal record check must be dated no more than thirty (30) days prior to the application for a licence (Amended by By-law 127-2011, dated June 20, 2011)"

Part III – Applying for a Licence or Renewal, Section 10 (a) of Public Vehicle Licensing By-law No, 137-2007 states:

- "10. Upon receipt of a complete application in the prescribed form for a licence or a renewal, the Licence Commissioner shall make all investigations deemed necessary or required by law and
- (a) if the Licence Commissioner's investigation discloses any reason to believe that the applicant is not of good character or that the carrying on of the licensed activity by the applicant will likely result in a breach of the law or be adverse to the public interest, the Licence Commissioner shall recommend to the Licensing Commission that it not issue or renew the licence, or that it impose conditions on the issuance of a licence, otherwise the Licence Commissioner shall recommend to the Licensing Commission that it issue or renew the licence"

BACKGROUND

- On Thursday, July 24, 2014 an application was submitted to the Licensing Division for a Taxicab Driver licence, being Appendix "A".
- On Thursday, July 24, 2014 a Windsor Police Declaration of Criminal Record was submitted to the Licensing Division, being Appendix "B".
- On Thursday, July 24, 2014 a Windsor Police Criminal Records Check was submitted to the Licensing Division with a criminal conviction dated April, 4, 2014 under the Excise Act (2001), being Appendix "C".

SUMMARY

Administration has identified a concern with the results of Mr. Al-Ghezi's Enhanced Criminal Record Check. We have a responsibility to ensure that licensees operate with honesty and integrity and in accordance with the law. Administration does not oppose the issuance of this licence, but suggests that the Windsor Licensing Commission impose certain conditions on the licence in order to protect the public.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT, Taxicab Driver licence application #14-192395 to Mr. Al-Ghezi **BE APPROVED** with **CONDITIONS**:

- Mr. Al-Ghezi must provide the Licensing Division with an updated Enhanced Criminal Record Check by March 31, 2015 that is not more than thirty (30) days old.
- Mr. Al-Ghezi must provide the Licensing Division with an Enhanced Criminal Record Check upon the renewal of his taxicab driver licence in August 2015 that is not more than thirty (30) days old.
- Any criminal charges or convictions will result with the immediate suspension of his Taxicab Driver licence pending review at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Windsor Licensing Commission.

LICENCE COMMISSIONER'S COMMENTS

A dangerous dog designation appeal was submitted to the Licensing Division on May 21, 2014 by Kyle and Kassandra McKnight of 1356 Langlois Ave., Windsor, guardian of a one year old German Shepherd called "Chevy". Licensing Division records indicate that this dog did not have a current 2014 dog tag licence at the time of the incident.

REGULATORY AUTHORITY

Dangerous Dog is defined by By-law Number 245-2004, a By-law for the Registration and Licensing of Dogs and for the Control of Dogs Generally Within the City of Windsor as follows:

"Dangerous Dog":

- i. "means a dog that, in the absence of any mitigating factor has attacked, bitten, or caused injury to a person or has demonstrated a propensity, tendency or disposition to do so;
- ii. means a dog that, in the absence of any mitigating factor, has significantly injured a domestic animal; or
- iii. means a dog, previously designated as a potentially dangerous dog, that is kept or permitted to be kept by its guardian in violation of the requirements for such dog;

Section 17 to By-law Number 245-2004 states:

- 17. If an Animal Control Officer designates a dog as a dangerous dog, the Animal Control Officer shall serve notice upon the Guardian, requiring the Guardian, upon receipt of such notice to comply with the following requirements:
 - a) to keep such dog confined;
 - i. within the guardian's dwelling, or
 - ii. in an enclosed pen of sufficient dimension and strength to be humane shelter for the dog and to prevent the dog from coming in contact with or making a real and substantial threat of attack on a person other than the guardian of the dog;
 - iii. conspicuously display on his or her property a sign provided by the City warning that there is a dangerous dog on the property.
 - b) to securely attach a muzzle to such dog at all times when it is not confined in accordance with section 17(a);
 - c) to obtain and maintain in force a policy of public liability insurance issued by an insurer licensed by the Province of Ontario providing third party liability coverage in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000.00 for any damage or injury caused by such dangerous dog and to provide to the Animal Control Officer a Certificate of such policy and each subsequent renewal of it. Such policy shall contain a provision requiring the insurer to immediately notify the Animal Control Officer should to policy expire, be cancelled or be terminated for any reason; and
 - d) to permit the Animal Control Officer to have a veterinarian insert a microchip implantation in such dog, at the Guardian's expense, for the purpose of identifying such dog as a dangerous dog;
 - e) To restrain the dangerous dog in accordance with any written directives which may be given by an Animal Control Officer.

BACKGROUND

- April 8, 2014 Windsor Police Occurrence Report # 2014-24119 was submitted to the By-law Enforcement Unit.
- April 5, 2014 at approximately 8:00 pm, Donald Meloche was walking his Shih Tzu dog
 "Luna" in front of his residence located at 1355 Langlois Ave. Windsor, ON. "Luna" was
 walking behind Mr. Meloche when he suddenly heard his dog cry out. Mr. Meloche
 observed a large black dog biting his dog.
- Windsor Police later identified that the large black dog was a 1 year old German Sheperd named "Chevy". The dog guardians were identified as Kassandra and Kyle McKnight of 1356 Langlois Ave. Windsor, ON.
- Windsor Police discovered that "Chevy" dug a hole and was able to escape the fenced rear yard prior to biting "Luna".
- The Windsor Police report was sent to the Windsor Essex County Humane Society for investigation.
- May 16, 2014 OSPCA Agent Amy Reaume from Windsor Essex County Humane Society attended the property at 1356 Langlois Ave. and designated the dog Chevy dangerous.
- May 21, 2014 the guardians of Chevy, Kyle and Kassandra McKnight, attended the Licensing Division and appealed the dangerous dog designation.

- June 17, 2014 the file was returned to By-law Enforcement to complete.
- June 20, 2014 statement received from guardian of Luna.
- June 23, 2014 copy of invoice from Lauzon Veterinary Hospital received as well as photographs of Luna.
- August 26, 2014 Information and Summons sworn before the Justice of the Peace under the Dog Owners Liability Act for full restitution of Veterinary bill being \$1,138.32.

SUMMARY

The Windsor Licensing Commission may determine whether or not there were any mitigating factors that would give reason for the dog to attack and bite. Based on the information provided by Windsor Police, the By-law Enforcement Officer, and OSPCA Agent, Administration is of the opinion that there are no mitigating factors. Therefore Administration is recommending that the dangerous dog designation remain in place.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the **DANGEROUS DOG** designation **REMAIN IN PLACE** for 1 year old German Shepherd known as "Chevy" which currently resides with guardians, Kyle and Kassandra McKnight at 1356 Langlois Ave. in Windsor, Ontario, and further, that the following actions **BE REQUIRED** as a result of this designation:

- 1. To keep such dog, when in or on the property of another person with the person's consent, on a leash and under the control of that person who is sixteen years of age or more.
- 2. Conspicuously display on his or her property a sign provided by the city warning that there is a dangerous dog on the property.
- 3. To securely attach a muzzle to such dog at all times when it is not confined in accordance with section 17 (a).
- 4. Obtain and maintain a policy liability insurance coverage in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for any damage or injury caused by such dangerous dog and to provide to the animal Control Officer a Certificate of such policy and each subsequent renewal of it.
- 5. Insert a microchip implantation in such dog, at the Guardian's expense, for the purpose of identifying such dog as a dangerous dog.
- 6. To restrain the dangerous dog in accordance with any written directives which may be given by an Animal Control Officer.

NARRATIVE:

On Sunday April 06, 2014, at approximately 0744hrs, I (PC TURNER) was dispatched to 1355 Langlois for an animal complaint. Information was received that the complainant's dog was bit on the neck by another dog while out for a walk. Further, this incident occurred last night and the complainant brought her dog to the vet for care.

At approximately 0753hrs I arrived and was met in the lobby of the apartment building by the complainant Roseanne DENNY () and her fiancee Donald MELOCHE (). DENNY advised that MELOCHE had been walking their shih tzu "Luna" last night when the bite happened. MELOCHE went on to explain that at approximately 2100hrs last night he exited the front doors of the apartment building with Luna. He went down the walkway to the sidewalk and as he began to walk southbound Luna was walking behind him. Suddenly he heard Luna cry out and when he looked back he observed a larger black dog biting her. MELOCHE grabbed Luna and attempted to break her free from the grasp of the other dog. He eventually separated the dogs and he noticed that Luna was bleeding from the side of her neck. A female

emerged from a residence across the street at 1356 Langlois and called out to the other dog. The dog immediately ran towards the female and went into the residence. The female approached MELOCHE and advised him that she owned the dog.

MELOCHE brought Luna back into their apartment and police were called. The call was put over until this morning as MELOCHE and DENNY brought Luna to Lauzon Animal Hospital to receive stitches for her injuries. Luna spent the night at the vet and it was unknown how many stitches she received.

After speaking with MELOCHE and DENNY, I attended 1356 Langlois in an attempt to speak with the owner of the other dog involved. A female answered the door and identified herself verbally as Kassandra CLAREY (). I advised CLAREY that I was investigating the incident with the dogs from last night and she advised that she owned the dog in question. CLAREY advised that she was doing laundry last night and let her lyr old German Shepherd "Chevy" out in the back yard. When she heard yelling out front she looked out and saw that Chevy was across the street. She called out to Chevy and he ran back into the house. She approached MELOCHE and told him that she was Chevy's owner at which point he advised her that he was calling the police.

I asked CLAREY to see the area in which Chevy had been kept and led me to the rear yard. I observed the yard to be fully fenced with a gate on the south side of the house. Just beside the gate I observed a section of dirt that appeared to be freshly dug up. This created a gap between the bottom of the fence and the ground large enough for a dog to fit through. CLAREY advised that the ground had not been like that before, however it was likely how Chevy got out of the yard. She stated that she didn't notice this last night as it was dark at the time of the incident. I advised CLAREY that a report would be filed in relation to this matter. Further, I recommended she fix the gap in the fence before letting Chevy back into yard to prevent him from getting out again.

After speaking with the parties involved, it did not appear CLAREY was negligent in regards to this matter. The dug up area appeared fresh and likely occurred just prior to Chevy escaping from the yard. DENNY inquired as to how she could be reimbursed for the vet bills and I advised her that it would be a civil matter between her and CLAREY.
