Re: CLARIFICATION ON REGULATIONS FOR TEMPORARY ELECTION SIGNS

This letter is to advise you of the City of Windsor regulations for temporary election signs as prescribed by the Windsor Sign By-law 250-2004.

- 1. Election signs are not to be displayed prior to May 2nd, 2022.
- 2. Election signs do not require a permit on private property.
- 3. Candidates must seek an owner's permission before placing a sign.
- 4. All election signs are subject to the following restrictions:
 - Election signs are not to be within the property where a voting place is situated including the public road allowance and parking facilities connected to the voting location.
 - If a voting place is located at a major commercial centre i.e. Devonshire Mall, election signs must be 20 metres from the perimeter of the voting area.
 - Elections signs must not be displayed on any public road allowance or public property that would create a dangerous and undesirable situation that would cause distraction to the motorist or interfere with vehicular traffic sight lines and maintenance activities.
 - Elections signs must not be displayed on any public road allowance or public property that would interfere with pedestrian traffic.
 - Election signs are not allowed on or next to the airport lands, including the private properties that abut the south side of County Road 42 across from the airport property.
 - Election signs cannot be placed on roofs, fences, utility poles, or fastened to any tree.
 - Election signs are allowed on vacant properties that are owned by individuals who have given permission to the candidate to place them there.
- 5. Signs found to be obstructing sight lines will be removed by the City of Windsor and will be disposed of accordingly.
- 6. Election signs must be removed within 72 hours immediately following Election Day.

Attempts will be made to contact the candidate's office directly in the event a complaint is received regarding an election sign. Immediate action, however, may be taken by City staff to remove signs that create dangerous or undesirable situations without any prior notice.
