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
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**Appendix G: Comments from the External Agencies** 

## 1 Introduction

The City of Windsor has retained IBI Group to undertake a 'Schedule 'C' Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) and Preliminary Design for the section of Banwell Road from Tecumseh Road East to CPR Tracks (see Exhibit 1). The study is being undertaken to investigate the need for additional north-south capacity and traffic management improvements along Banwell Road, while taking into consideration the adjacent land uses and plans for a pedestrian and cycling facility. The study is being conducted in accordance with the planning and design process for 'Schedule C' projects as outlined in the Municipal Engineers Association "Municipal Class Environmental Assessment," (October 2000, as amended in 2007 & 2011).

The fourth Public Information Centre (PIC) was held to receive public input, comments, and concerns on the design options and the preliminary preferred design. The public was encouraged to attend to learn more about the study and engage in discussions with project representatives.

### 2 Public Information Centre # 4

#### 2.1 Advertisement

The Notice of PIC # 4 (*Appendix A*) was published in the Windsor Star on June 17<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> 2015. The newspaper advertisement provided residents and stakeholders with information on how to participate actively in the study through the planned PIC. The Notice of PIC was also posted on the City of Windsor website (link shown below) which was accessible to all members of the public and external stakeholders.

#### 2.2 Notice to Public and External Agencies

The Notice of PIC was also mailed to owners of the properties abutting Banwell Road within the Study Area. An initial mailing list of property owners was provided by the City which was further appended by IBI with additional contacts obtained during/from previous PICs.

During the PIC session, the attendees generally expressed satisfaction with the proposed road design with an interchange. The majority of discussion with staff present at the session were regarding property impacts, the location of Multi-Use Trail and sidewalk south of EC ROW, & timings for road widening and building an interchange, existing traffic issues related to Banwell Road/EC ROW intersection. No major concerns were expressed to the staff during the session.

As such, the effectiveness of interim intersection improvements to accommodate a more modest, realistic rate of development has not been addressed.</li> <li>Based on the development threshold analysis (provided in Tecumseh Hamlet Transportation Study – January 2015), it is suggested that there is a value in undertaking interim improvements at this intersection.</li> </ul>

			The Town requests that the City consider acknowledging the benefits of undertaking interim improvements at the Banwell Road/EC ROW interchange until interchange solution is available.
