

This e-mail confirms the Ministry of Environment Southwestern Region's receipt of Landmark Engineers Inc.'s March 27th, 2013 Notice of Intent and Invitation for Comment with respect to the Central Grand Marais Drain Class EA in the City of Windsor, Ontario.

As I am sure you are aware, in addition to providing ample opportunity for public and agency consultation, the proponent must also ensure that First Nations are provided ample opportunity to consult with the proponent with respect to what interests they may have with respect to this proposed project. All of the opportunities and requests (Notices, Phone Calls, Offers to meet in person) to consult with First Nations should be fully documented in the Class EA Report. If any issues are raised, the Class EA Report should identify those issues, and how those issues were addressed / mitigated.

In that regard, I offer the following advice to you as to how proponents should contact Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) and the Ministry of Aboriginal Affairs (MAA). The advice that follows is consistent with the general directions provided on this ministry's web site and in the codes of practices but is somewhat more specific.

How to Contact INAC and MAA-Streamlined Assessment Processes

- · Proponent should first make a list of potentially affected communities. The list should be based on:
- · Review of links on INAC and MAA web sites related to historic Aboriginal occupation
- · Close proximity to any reserves

- · Results of any information in any archaeological assessments
- · Huron Wendat areas of interest
- · Existing Treaty areas (INAC web site)
- · Check Metis Nation of Ontario web site

- Refer to other links on ministry web site historically provided by INAC/MAA (see links below).
- · Proponent should then contact INAC and MAA early in process for assistance in determining which Aboriginal communities may have an interest in their project.
- · Proponent should send one letter to each of MAA and INAC providing a brief project description and a project location specifically requesting information on federal and provincial land claims and litigation. MAA will actually identify communities which should be contacted; INAC will focus on the federal land claims (comprehensive and specific claims) and federal litigation. The proponent should follow up with a phone call to get information. The proponent should also follow advice provided on the ministry's web site (see links below).

Further to our brief teleconference on May 29, 2013, and your prior request, we enclose herewith for your review, a hard copy of the study information that was presented at the Public Drop-In Centre that was held on April 18, 2013.

The attached information consists of reproductions of all of the information that was presented to the members of the public that attended the Drop-in Centre. It summarizes the proposed scope of channel improvements for five segments of the Grand Marais Drain. The improvements are needed to increase the flow capacity of the Drain in order to reduce the risk of flooding to existing properties and homes that lie within the flood plain of the watercourse.

In addition to relieving a real flood potential, the improvements present an opportunity to remove a substantial amount of contaminated sediments from the watercourse, and to implement significant fish habitat enhancements.

In an effort to obtain input from first nations, we contacted Caldwell First Nation, and others, on numerous occasions over the course of the Environmental Assessment process. Most recently, we contacted you by telephone, to inform you of our desire to conclude the Environmental Assessment process, and confirm that you had no further

Ministry of Environment Consultation

During early stages of the EA process, the Ministry of Environment (MOE) was invited to comment on a proposed strategy for completing improvements to Segment 3. A meeting was held between representatives of Landmark Engineers Inc. (Landmark) and MOE staff on March 6, 2013. The principal purpose of the pre-consultation meeting was to present a proposed strategy for addressing the accumulated sediment within Segment 3 and to request MOE's feedback on a proposal for managing the sediment.

By way of an email response to Landmark dated July 4, 2013, MOE indicated that additional information would be needed to further assess the proposal. MOE's response prompted further correspondence between MOE, ERCA, the City of Windsor and Landmark, which eventually led to a meeting between Landmark and MOE representatives on July 15, 2013. Meeting minutes that document the understandings reached between Landmark and MOE are enclosed herein. Correspondence that MOE submitted subsequent to the July meeting is also enclosed.

The July 15 meeting occurred prior to expiration of the notice of completion (August 9th, 2013). Correspondence between Landmark and MOE continued during the 30 day review period. The enclosed letters and emails present the understandings reached in the process of wrapping up this EA.

The following is a general summary of the items discussed and the understandings reached at the above-noted meeting. Subsequent to the meeting, the MOE issued two emails to clarify their position with regard to project status. The letter from Craig Newton dated July 25 and the e-mail from Teri Gilbert dated August 7 are attached hereto for the purpose of recording MOE's position.

<u>Item</u>

1.0 Schedule B vs. Schedule C Environmental Assessment (EA)

Craig Newton inquired as to how it was decided that the EA should proceed as a Schedule B project and not as a Schedule C. Craig suggested that the GeoBags being proposed as an option for Segment 3 could be considered 'treatment', which could constitute a Schedule C undertaking.

Dan Krutsch explained that when the project was being initially scoped out, the EA was to address maintenance and improvements to 5 segments of an existing drain. The culverts within the area designated as Segment 3, and the removal or management or the sediment within the culverts comprised only one component of the project. In stream management of the sediment through the employment of the GeoBags was not contemplated at that time. Furthermore, Landmark had not considered use of the GeoBags as a form of treatment, but rather an option for containment. Craig requested that Landmark provide further explanation for the justification of following the Schedule B process as opposed to the Schedule C process.



MOE stated that they do not object with 'going forward' with Segments 1,2,4 and 5 but consideration must be made by the proponent to the entire length of the drain, as it has been subject to historical contamination impacts. Measures should be taken to appropriately manage sediments in all areas of the drain and prevent migration of contaminants downstream. In addition, MOE is interested in the quality of the discharge from the bags and how it will be managed. MOE has stated that they still need to be convinced the sediments, including those that are anticipated to be placed in the bag, have been property characterized.

Action: Landmark

Post Meeting Commentary

The following points are made to further justify that the project can me properly categorized as a Schedule B activity.

 a) The Municipal Class Environmental Assessment document as amended on 2007 lists in Appendix 1 the types of activities that pertain to each Schedule. Item 19 on Page 1-15 of Appendix 1 indicates that Schedule B would typically apply for:

Works undertaken in a watercourse for the purposes of flood control or erosion control, which may include:

- bank or slope regrading
- deepening the watercourse
- relocation, realignment or channelization of watercourse
- revetment including soil bio-engineering techniques
- reconstruction or a weir or dam.
- b) The option of in-stream management of the sediments that have accumulated in the subject culverts was identified as a potential practicable and cost effect maintenance and channel improvement strategy, as compared to the potentially cost prohibitive option of completely evacuating all impacted sediment. In addition to the do-nothing and "evacuate and dispose" options, two options were identified for substantially capping and isolating the sediment in place. One of these options entailed hydraulically dredging the sediment and pumping the dredgate into containment bladders. The manufacturer of the GeoBags, recommended that the polymer be added to the dredgate to facilitate settlement and filtration. We understand that addition of the polymer and the action of filtration are causing MOE to regard this option as a form of treatment, and as such, consider that the project (or at least this component) constitutes a Schedule C activity.
- c) The additional of polymer and the action of filtration are the elements of this project that seems to be in question. If the proponent or MOE concludes that this constitutes a Schedule C activity, then we anticipate that the ERCA and City would prefer to discard this aspect of the proposal from further



consideration, <u>or</u> discard the option of capping the sediment with GeoBags entirely until the option can be properly assessed by way of an amendment to the EA.

2.0 Environmental Assessment Process

MOE does not wish to delay the completion of the Class EA process that is ongoing. However, they feel that formal comments should be recorded in the project file, to ensure that any conditions affecting future implementation are clearly and that a future obligation is placed on the proponent to consult with MOE prior to design and construction of Segment 3. MOE also does not have any issues moving forward with the remaining 4 segments (Segments 1, 2, 4 and 5).

It was agreed that if the future consultation regarding Segment 3 result in significant departure from what was represented in the Class EA project file, an addendum to the EA will be required prior to commencing design for Segment 3.

MOE expressed that they would like the EA file to include some discussion of the specific need for the City to monitor future sediment accumulation with Segment 2 (once completed) and propose some specific thresholds and triggers for evacuation of sediments from Segment 2.

Action: Landmark

3.0 Probable Timeline for Construction

Landmark reported that at this time, funding has been secured for construction of Segment 1 later in 2013, with funding assistance being provided from MNR through their WECI program. Design is being completed in anticipation of tendering within the next few weeks and construction commencement in late August.

It was also reported that while the timeline for implementation of the improvements in the other segments has not been determined, it will depend on funding allocations made through the City of Windsor's future budget deliberations.

It was further noted that the current Class EA recommends that implementation of the proposed improvements should being at the downstream end (Segment1) and progress upstream. Consequently, the absolute earliest that we anticipate Segment 3 being implemented is in two years (2015). This timeline allows for further planning and consultation with MOE, as well as sufficient time to undertake an addendum to the EA should this be deemed necessary through ongoing and subsequent discussions with MOE.



It was suggest that Landmark and ERCA arrange to have the preliminary timelines confirmed by the City of Windsor.

Action: City of Windsor

4.0 <u>Sediment Sampling</u>

Patricia Almost expressed some reservation as to whether the sampling and analysis undertaken by Golder Associates to date reflects the characteristics of the sediment within the culverts. It was noted that the samples were taken at the upstream and downstream ends of the culverts and that no samples were taken from within the culverts. MOE would like to have more confidence in the sediment composition within the culverts. This may require further sampling.

Patricia is also concerned with PCBs that may be trapped within the sediments. Landmark proposed that Golder Associates be consulted to discuss their testing methods and findings in more detail.

A teleconference with Golder Associates, MOE and Landmark will be arranged to further discuss the sediment sampling and testing methods and results.

Action: Landmark

Post Meeting Note:

In the interest of efficiently addressing this matter, Landmark has requested that Patricia articulate by way of an email to Landmark, her specific concerns/questions with regard to the sediment sampling and analysis that has been performed to date. Landmark will forward the questions to Golder Associates for a reply. Golder may need to consult with the laboratory that they utilized for this assignment, in order provide a comprehensive response.

A meeting with Golder, MOE, Landmark and proponents will be arranged to discuss the responses to Patricia's concerns and the existing and historical sediment situation. MOE has had significant involvement and knowledge of the entire Grand Marais/Turkey Creek drainage system leading into the Detroit River and would like to discuss/share further on the issues such as, sediment, contaminant, remediation, biomonitoring and waste management.

5.0 Contaminated Sediments

As a point of clarification, MOE indicated that their prior testing has concluded that the existing sediment is not migrating downstream. They further clarified that the security/stability of the encapsulated sediments is a critical factor in the short and long term acceptability of the status quo. Measures need to continue (and be led by the proponents) to ensure the security and the absence of downstream or offsite impacts. Continued monitoring by the City is expected by MOE to provide that assurance for both the Community and MOE.



However, should changes be made downstream that results in the destabilization and mobilization of the sediments downstream, then the MOE has the authority to order the City to take appropriate steps to mitigate the condition. In such instance, MOE could order the City to remove the sediments or take acceptable measures to stabilize the material.

I am writing you today to acknowledge a) this ministry's receipt of your July 5th, 2013 letter which included, as an attachment, the Notice of Completion of the Class Environmental Assessment for the Central Grand Marais Drain and b) follow-up on the draft minutes of this ministry's meeting / teleconference with Landmark Engineers Inc. and the Essex Region Conservation Authority at this Ministry's Windsor Area office on July 15th, 2013. City of Windsor staff did not participate in the meeting rather relying on their consultant, Landmark Engineers Inc., to represent the City interests.

The Essex Region Conservation Authority (ERCA) and the City of Windsor (i.e co-proponents) retained Landmark Engineers Inc. to carry out an environmental assessment in accordance with Schedule B of the Municipal Engineers Association Municipal Class Environmental Assessment. The City of Windsor and ERCA are planning improvements to five segments of the Grand Marais Drain between Dougall Avenue and Walker Road, in the City of Windsor. The EA defines a scope of channel improvements, and a plan which includes the management of accumulated sediments

This ministry offers the following comments for Landmark Engineering Inc., and the two co-proponents of this project (namely the City of Windsor and the Essex Region Conservation Authority) for due consideration:

First of all, it is not this ministry's intent to unduly delay the completion of the ongoing Class EA process. As set out in the July 15th, 2013 meeting , this ministry does not currently have any issues with respect to segments 1,2,4 and 5 of this Class EA moving forward. The ministry does expect that this work is supported with all necessary sampling to confirm appropriate management of sediments and to protect, where necessary, any potential for migration of contaminants downstream. Consideration must be made by the co-proponents, in their development of the project plan, that the entire length of the drain has been subject to historical contamination (including metals, PCBs). Measures need to be considered to maintain and improve where necessary watershed naturalization where appropriate.

The July 15th, 2013 meeting minutes submitted to this ministry by Landmark Engineers Inc. are in draft and require redrafting to take in to consideration MOE comments before they are finalized. An MOE response to the draft minutes is being prepared, under separate cover, and will be forwarded to Landmark Engineers Inc. once complete.

This ministry's current issues with this Class EA, if you will, pertain primarily to Segment 3. This segment of the proposed project extends from the west side of the off-ramp/on ramp of the E.C. Row Expressway to the north side of the west bound off ramp to Howard Avenue. This segment of the drain consists generally of large concrete box culverts. It was reportedly designed to the same flow capacity standard as the concrete-lined portions of the drain that are located west of Dougall Avenue. This portion of the drain is reportedly larger and deeper than needed to provide for the 1/100 year storm capacity. The bottom portion of the culverts have been accumulating sediments since the 1970s.

Three options were considered to deal with the accumulation of sediments in the Segment 3 culverts:

- 1) Do nothing;
- 2) Remove all sediment
- 3) Remove some sediment and cap in place.

The preferred option being proposed through the EA is Option 3, to remove some sediment and cap in place. The two options being considered for stabilizing the sediments within the culverts are:.

- Sediment from the first culvert will be hydraulically excavated and pumped into geo tube bags in the other two culverts. These bags will reportedly trap the sediments in place creating a cap over the sediments below.
- 2) Sediment from the first culvert will be hydraulically removed and disposed of off-site. The remaining sediments will be capped with GeoWEb and the voids filled with concrete.

At this point in time, this ministry has not been provided with enough information for it to either agree to, or discount anyone of the three options considered to deal with the accumulation of sediment in the Segment 3 culverts, and/or either of the two options being considered for stabilizing the sediments within the culverts.

A number of questions remain unanswered with respect to Segment 3 both in the EA itself, and as a consequence of the aforementioned meeting of July 15th, 2013, including but not necessarily limited to:

- a) The need, if any, to have full and complete characterization of the materials inside the culverts;
- b) Details and confirmation of whether any of the materials subject to management may be designated as waste under ministry regulation;
- c) Details and confirmation that the preferred option proposal does not involve on site treatment of any kind that would be subject to ministry approvals and/or potentially elevating segment 3 of the project to a Schedule C, rather than a Schedule B project, as outlined in the Municipal Engineers Association Municipal Class EA;
- d) Details on the proposed plan for managing the materials (considering all options and outcome of the characterization work);

e) Details on a proposed plan for prevention of off-site and downstream impacts and confirm such success during any sediment management work and into the future operation of the conveyance.

Schedule B Projects, under the Municipal Engineers Association, require the establishment of a "Project File", rather than an Environmental Study Report, which is the requirement for projects that proceed through the Schedule C Planning Process. The Project File must contain a complete record of all activities associated with the planning of the project and shall include:

- Correspondence
- Copies of notices, letters, bulletins relating to public consultation
- Memoranda to file explaining the proponent's rationale in developing stages of the project
- Copies of reports prepared by consultants and others

When a commitment is made by a proponent to address concerns raised during the review period, the commitment shall be documented by the proponent and filed in the "Project File". The proponent, in this case, the co-proponents (ERCA and the City of Windsor), are required to fulfill any such commitments in the implementation of the project.

The draft minutes of the July 15th, 2013 meeting at this ministry's Windsor Area Office contain a number of action items that Landmark Engineering voluntarily imposed both on itself, and the City of Windsor, as a means of addressing potential issues raised by the MOE with respect to Segment 3. Resolution of these potential issues and the action items associated with them will take time, and would unduly delay implementation of other improvements to other Segments of this EA, if there resolution was considered a prerequisite to those other Segments (1,2,4 and 5) of this overall project proceeding.

The MOE considers the July 15th, 2013 minutes, and the action items referenced within the minutes, once finalized with ministry input, to be a part of the Project File and as such, the co-proponents of this project (ERCA and City of Windsor) are obligated to fulfill the commitments made therein. A couple of the commitments include, but are not limited to, a) undertaking an addendum to this EA should such be deemed necessary through ongoing and subsequent discussions with MOE with respect to Segment 3 and b) conceivably elevating Segment 3 of this current Project to a Schedule C Project if it should ever be concluded by the co-proponents that the use of polymer in the geotubes is a form of chemical, biological, or disinfection treatment.

In conclusion, this ministry currently has no issues with respect to segments 1, 2, 4 and 5 of this Class EA moving forward to implementation, as long as the co-proponents recognize and carryout the provisos referred to in the fourth paragraph of this letter. Furthermore, based upon the commitments voluntarily made by Landmark Engineering both on itself, and the City of Windsor in the July 15th, 2013 minutes and now included in the Project File to consult with this ministry prior to design and construction of Segment 3, this ministry will not make the resolution of this Ministry's potential issues with respect to Segment 3 a prerequisite to the implementation of segment 1,2,4 and 5 of this Class EA.

Please provide both myself, and this ministry's Windsor Area Office, with duplicate complete copies of the Project File for this project for both ministry office files, and future reference purposes. This should be in the form of both a hard copy and a CD copy for each office. Thank you in advance.

-MOE comments on minutes

Thank you for your response Teri. I have a few remaining questions that I would appreciate some clarification on.

1) I suppose I misunderstood which specific aspects of the Geotube option constituted possible treatment to MOE. MOE had introduced the view that the proposal to cap the sediment in situ with the Geotubes may constituted treatment. It seems that I had misunderstood that the reason this option was being viewed as possible treatment by the MOE was due to the introduction of a compound (polymer) to enhance settlement and filtration of the extracted sediment. I understand that if this option is deemed treatment, then it would not be considered a Schedule B undertaking, and proper approval would likely necessitate further assessment of the proposal as a Schedule C undertaking and possibly the subsequent issuance of a CofA by the Ministry after final design is completed. I am interpreting from your email that the Ministry considers the use of the geotubes alone to be more than a containment system, but a filtration system, which may constitute treatment, regardless of the addition of a polymer.

I'm having some difficulty comprehending how we obtain certainty with regards to whether or not the proposal is or isn't characterized as treatment. You indicate that it is the responsibility of the owner/proponent to make this determination. Does MOE have specific criteria that it uses to make such determinations which you could refer me to? Furthermore, if the proponent makes the final determination, what is MOE's role or authority to contend the decision?

- 2) We certainly acknowledge that the proposal to cap sediments in place through the use of the geotube bags is not in any way a routine or standard practice. We take no exception to conducting a test to "proof" the effectiveness of the strategy on a small scale, if this is what the MOE means by a pilot study. I am assuming that the City and ERCA would not take exception. This would clearly allow the collection and analysis of raw sediment, discharge water, and filtered sediment to establish better certainty with respect to the likely outcomes. The fact is that we believe it is the only affordable strategy, unless of course the Ministry has access to funding that would substantially cover the cost of the complete removal and disposal option. Further dialogue will be needed to establish the process that would be involved to proceed with a pilot study.
- 3) MOE is still expressing concern with regard to the characterization of the subject sediment, in situ and after extraction. I recall that MOE expressed this concern in their initial email response, and that Patricia reiterated this concern during our meeting. In my email to you on July 19th, I had requested that Patricia articulate her specific questions/concerns regarding sampling and analysis procedures and protocols by way of an email to me, which I would then forward to Golder. I felt that this was a more efficient way of obtaining some clarification on the sampling and testing conducted to date. For clarification, Golder did not characterize the material as waste based on the testing that they conducted and I am relying on their abilities to properly make this determination. Can you confirm whether it is MOE's intention to respond to this request, in the interest of achieving some closure on the value of the testing and sampling that was completed as part of the EA process?

I await you further reply. In the meantime, we will amend the minutes and forward a copy to the meeting attendees.

Hi Dan

Sorry for the delay, as promised, below are the MOE comments related to the draft meeting minutes of the July 15 meeting. As outlined in a memo from Craig Newton, dated July 25, 2013 it is the expectation of the ministry that you address/note these comments into final meeting minutes which are to form part of the Project File. A number of items related to the EA process were addressed in the C. Newton memo. Below are some remaining items, related to the July 15, 2013 minutes:

1. Re page 2 (b)

Landmark refers to MOE questions re polymer addition constituting "treatment" - The ministry considers Landmark's comment to be an over simplification as the polymer is not the only portion of the proposed work that may be considered "treatment". Consideration, as outlined in the meeting, should be given to the idea that the action of filtration itself may be considered treatment. It will be the responsibility of the owner to determine if the proposed activity is "treatment" and therefore subject to an instrument allowing that activity to occur. The ministry also has remaining questions regarding the proposed plan for the management of filtrate materials and outlined the potential need for proper characterization of the materials and presented the idea of conducting a pilot study.

As outlined in meeting, the ministry does not object to the "going forward" with Segments 1,2, 4 and 5 but consideration must be made by the proponent to the entire length of the drain, as it has been subject to historical contamination impacts (including metals/PCBs) and measures should be taken to appropriately manage sediments in all areas of the drain and prevent migration of contaminants downstream. The ministry further outlined, due to these historic known issues and the associated work being undertaken by the Detroit River Cleanup Committee, it is the ministry's preference that measures be considered to maintain/improve and when appropriate consider watershed naturalization.

As outlined in the meeting, the ministry is interested in the quality of the discharge from the bags and how it will be managed. The ministry still needs to be convinced the sediments, including those that are anticipated to be placed in the bag have been properly characterized.

2. Page 4

Post Meeting Note –The ministry continues to encourage a meeting with Golder/Landmark and the proponents to discuss the existing and historical sediment situation. As raised in the meeting, the ministry has had significant involvement and knowledge of the entire Grand Marais/Turkey Creek drainage system leading to the Detroit River. Ministry would like to discuss and share further on the issues such as, sediment, contaminant remediation, boimonitoring and waste management.

5.0 "if sediments remain in current state and location it does not require removal." to clarify, the security/stability of the encapsulated sediments is a critical factor in the short and long term acceptability of the status quo. Measures need to continue (and be led by the proponents) to continue to ensure that security and the absence of downstream or offsite impacts: continued monitoring is expected to provide that assurance to both the ministry and the community.
