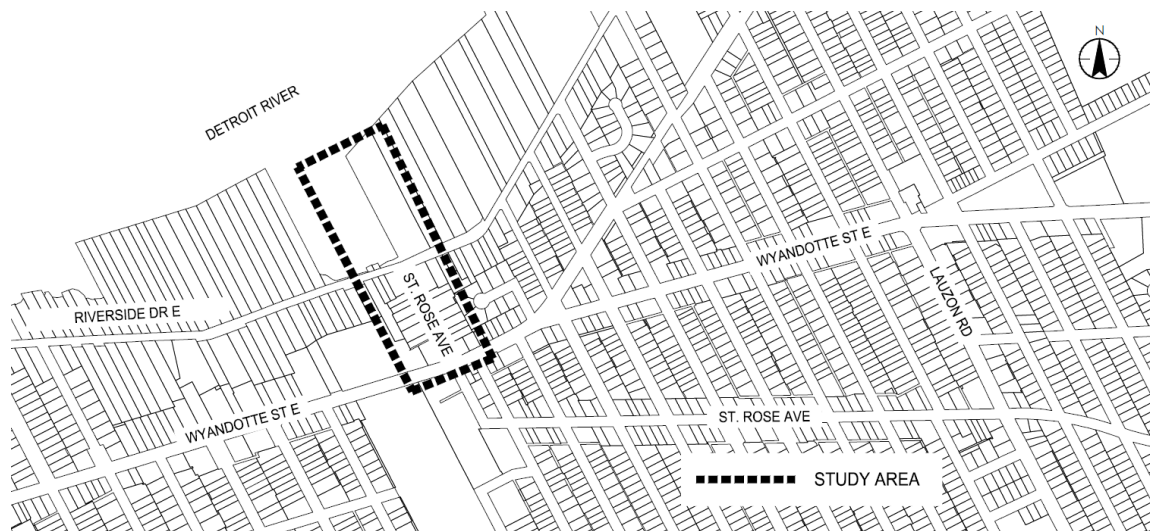




ST. ROSE STORMWATER PUMPING STATION MUNICIPAL CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT NOTICE OF STUDY COMPLETION

The City of Windsor undertook a Schedule C Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) for the proposed St. Rose Pumping Station. This study satisfied Phases 3 and 4 of the Class EA process which involved the evaluation of the site location and alternative design concepts for the proposed St. Rose Stormwater Pumping Station. An Environmental Study Report (ESR) has been completed and documents the planning and decision-making process for this study. By this Notice, the ESR is being placed in the public record for review in accordance with the requirements of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process. Subject to comments received as a result of this notice, the project may proceed to the next phase of design.

The City of Windsor endorsed its first comprehensive Sewer and Coastal Flood Protection Master Plan (SMP) in 2020. The SMP was completed in accordance with Phases 1 and 2 of the Class EA process. The SMP identified specific improvement projects that can be undertaken by the City to improve efficiency and reduce the risk of flooding caused by severe storm events. It is outlined in the SMP that a new stormwater pumping station within the study area (refer to key map) is required to discharge excess water during major storm events in the expanded St. Rose drainage area.



This ESR is being placed on the public record for a 30-day review period from April 21, 2023, to May 22, 2023. The ESR will be available for review online on the City's website:

Interested persons may provide written comments to the project team by May 22, 2023. All comments and concerns should be sent directly to the City of Windsor and/or the Consulting Engineer.

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A request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an Order requiring a higher level of study, or that conditions be imposed, only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate, or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests should include the requesters contact information and be received by May 22, 2023.

Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for additional conditions or a request for an individual/comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate, or remedy those potential adverse impacts on Aboriginal and treaty rights, and any information in support of the statements in the request. This will ensure that the ministry is able to efficiently begin reviewing the request.
