

## University Avenue & Victoria Avenue Environmental Assessment

CIMA+, on behalf of the City of Windsor, has completed an environmental assessment for University Avenue (Huron Church Road to McDougall Street) and Victoria Avenue (Chatham Street West to Park Street West). The study identified opportunities to optimize the right-of-way to achieve safe, efficient, comfortable and convenient travel for roadway users of all ages, abilities and modes within the study corridors for a 20-year study horizon. The study has followed the planning process for Schedule “C” projects, as outlined in the Municipal Engineers Association Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) document (2000, as amended 2015), approved under the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*. The study area is shown in the map below.



An Environmental Study Report has been prepared to document the planning and decision-making process for the study. By this notice, the Environmental Study Report is being placed on the public record for a 30-day public review period from and including, **September 1, 2022 to September 30, 2022**. A printed copy of the Environmental Study Report will be available for review from September 1 to September 30 at the locations noted below.

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**Section 16 Order**

In addition, a request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study (i.e., requiring an individual / comprehensive EA approval before being able to proceed), or that conditions be imposed (e.g., require further studies), only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally-protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests must be sent by **September 30, 2022**, in writing or by email to both the following contacts, as well as the project team contacts noted above.
