<b>NOTES &amp; KEY FACTORS FOR UNDERSTANDING RESULTS:</b> The figures used to illustrate performance measurement for both police operational measures and cost per capita figures alike must be taken and understood with one very important caveat. These figures correlate exclusively to permanent resident population only. Since Windsor is a city on the international border with the United States (via Detroit, Michigan) and is also home to a reasonably large university, a significant proportion of the population which utilize police resources and are involved in incidents of crime and disorder are not part of the permanent population. The impact this has is that a disproportionately larger amount of resources and incidents are therefore generated compared to just policing the area's permanent population alone. Therefore, the true crime rates and cost per capita figures to explain policing activity is not fully expressed in these figures and would actually be lower than what is expressed here.
