**1. CALL TO ORDER**

The Chair calls the meeting to order at 2:05 o'clock p.m. and the Committee considers the Agenda being Schedule "A" **attached** hereto, matters which are dealt with as follows:

**5. BUSINESS ITEMS**

**5.3 E-mail from Mike Cardinal to the Chair**

An excerpt from the e-mail from M. Cardinal relating to "police presence policies and crime reporting policies" is as follows:

*"Currently, the west side is down because of a culture of "no snitch" therefore we have more unreported crime. Personally, five times in the last 4 years upon reporting a theft at our business the patrol officer challenged the decision to make an official report.*

*Therefore the T and G needs to officially question the police presence policies and the crime reporting policies."*

M. Cardinal indicates police are asking "do you really want to report this?" when a citizen has called in regarding an incident. He suggests one patrol car be assigned to the west end of the city.

Inspector LaBute states if officers are dissuading residents from making reports, this will be forwarded to the Staff Sergeant. If a bicycle theft occurs, the report is taken over the phone. In terms of noisy parties, he states serious crimes take top priority.

J. Boyd thanks Inspector LaBute and states his successor "will have large shoes to fill". The Chair thanks Inspector LaBute for his expertise at the Town and Gown Committee meetings, also for his professionalism as a Police Officer.

4.1 The Town and Gown Association of Ontario September 2013 Newsletter is received for information.

### 5.1 2013 Town & Gown Symposia Verbal Update

The Town and Gown Symposia –Bridging Our Future Financial Statement as of October 15, 2013 is distributed and attached as Appendix "A".

R. Barlozzari states score cards to rate the success of the Symposium were sent to the members. The results showed 3 poor, 15 good and 11 excellent. J. Boyd was impressed with the best practices but comments by the participants revealed interaction was missing.

The Chair reports City Council was very impressed with the effort put forth by the Town and Gown Committee with respect to hosting the 2013 TGAO Symposium.

R. Barlozzari advises \$22,000 had been earmarked by Council for the TGAO event through the Budget Stabilization Reserve Fund however; this earmarked funding was not required. The event was self sufficient and required no funding.

M. Cardinal suggests that an early bird registration be held when it is hosted again by the City of Windsor.

### 5.3 (cont'd)

M. Cardinal in his e-mail dated September 27, 2013 requested the Committee to *"officially pass a motion calling for the update of the front yard parking bylaw to include reasonable laws about side yard parking on corner lots."*

M. Cardinal states he is requesting the front yard parking bylaw be amended to include side yard parking (for the entire city). He notes people are parking 5-6 cars wide on non-address spaces or on a corner. He indicates there is no law prohibiting this activity.

A. Kalinowski distributes a flyer which states "WARNING Parking of a Vehicle in the required Front Yard is PROHIBITED under By-law 8600 Section 24.128.1", attached as Appendix "B". She reports the flyers are issued, however, By-law Enforcement has no authority to issue a ticket.

In response to a question asked by M. Cooke regarding if cars are "jumping the curb" as it relates to front yard parking, M. Cardinal responds affirmatively and notes jumping curbs is prohibited. There is a need to stop this activity.

L. A. Doyle states if the bylaw is amended to include side yard parking, there will be limited resources as there are only 12 By-law Enforcement Officers to patrol the entire city.

Moved by M. Cardinal, seconded by J. Boyd,

That Administration **BE REQUESTED** to review the Zoning By-law and to develop governance relating to side yard parking on a corner and to report back to the Town and Gown Committee.

Carried.

M. Cardinal asks if there is a methodology for the Commissionaires to add enforcement of front and side yard parking to their duties before their contract expires. L. Doyle states she will contact the Executive Director of Operations to inquire when the Commissionaire's contract expires and will report back.

M. Cardinal in his e-mail dated September 27, 2013 requested the Committee to *“officially pass a motion calling for the updating of building bylaws so that monster houses (double duplex) like 207 Askin are prevented from being created to use every maximum allowed and every minimum avoidable.”* M. Cooke indicates the issue with 207 Askin relates to the number of bedrooms which they are attempting to restrict. M. Cardinal states some of the residences house at least 15 students along with their guests. He suggests the number of bedrooms be changed to “4 legal bedrooms”.

M. Cardinal in his e-mail dated September 27, 2013 requested the Committee to *officially pass a motion calling for increasing the street lighting within 500 metres of all 3 city campuses to the level of “high pedestrian” standard and implementing a strategy to catch up (budget).* M. Cardinal reports he met with Enwin along with Tiffany Pocock regarding the diminished lighting off the University of Windsor campus. He states the lighting represents the 1950’s standard. He is requesting the City replace the current lighting with high pedestrian lighting. T. Pocock states Enwin has undertaken an LED pilot project to identify energy savings.

T. Pocock advises additional light poles can be added but it is essential to be cognizant of trees, and residents’ driveways.

In response to a question asked by L. Angelidis regarding if the existing poles can be utilized, T. Pocock responds affirmatively. The Chair requests T. Pocock to prepare a report for the budget deliberations outlining the costs to increase the street lighting within a 500 metre radius in the University of Windsor area.

J. Boyd expresses concern that some residents may not be in favour of high pedestrian lighting. She suggests neighbours be consulted before implementation of high pedestrian lighting is in place.

Moved by M. Cardinal, seconded by J. Boyd,  
That Administration **BE REQUESTED** to investigate the feasibility of upgrading the street lighting from standard to residential standards in the 500 metre area of all 3 city campuses on the periphery of the University of Windsor and to report back with the findings.

Carried.

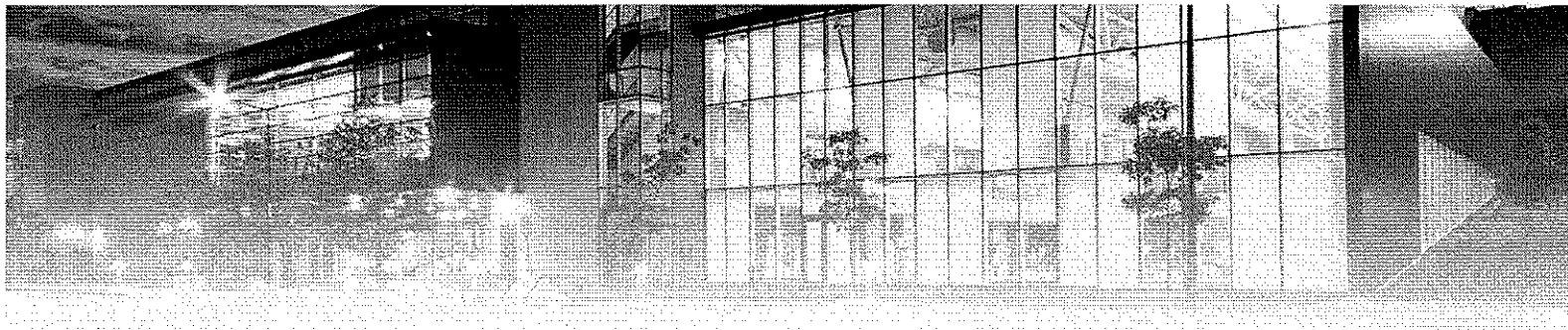

It turned out to be a good thing that there were a few people able to take things right away, otherwise we might still be trying to figure out how to store things.

We had someone from the church drive around the area on Monday to see what the streets looked like. He said that with the exception of one house that had a mattress and a chair out front, that the streets looked relatively clean. So hopefully we can take that as a sign that we've made a significant dent in the issue of refuse being left behind at the end of spring term.

Overall, I think it was a success, and probably something that we will continue to do in the future. We may make a few adjustments (i.e. this year we rented a UHaul truck in order to do pick ups that were out of our immediate area. Rather than doing that we may see if we can partner with a few other organizations to expand the clean up area) but I'm quite sure you can plan on us doing this again next year!

I had mentioned to Dr. Smith that we are planning on doing another community involvement day on Saturday, June 6th, but are still looking for a project. We are just beginning our brainstorming now, but if any of you have any ideas or feel that there is a way that we can serve the campus or the surrounding neighbourhood, please feel free to let us know! We would love to work together going forward!
