Greetings,

The Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) is committed to ensuring that future and existing sources of drinking water are protected from contamination and depletion through the Clean Water Act, 2006 (CWA).

Source protection plans and their amendments are necessary to safeguard Ontario's sources of drinking water. However, after implementing the Act for 20 years, the ministry has determined that the processes in place to develop and amend these plans are lengthy and unnecessarily complex

To remove redundancies and accelerate protections for drinking water sources, MECP is proposing changes to the CWA and related regulations. We're sharing this information to invite your input on the proposal. The legislation has been introduced in the house and the legislative proposal notice is now posted for comment on the Environmental Registry under registry number 025-1060 until November 19, 2025. In addition, the Ministry is also consulting on a regulatory proposal under registry number 025-1104 until December 4, 2025.

The proposed changes would maintain a high standard of protection for drinking water sources, while:

- o Allowing local source protection authorities to approve certain routine updates to source protection plans.
- o Allowing additional minor types of plan amendments (such as modifications that are administrative in nature) to proceed without approval or consultation.
- o Setting clear timelines for approval by the Minister of source protection plan amendments.
- o Simplifying consultation requirements on plan amendments while ensuring the right people are engaged at the right time.
- o Enabling the use of new drinking water sources (such as wells and intakes) faster where protections are already in place.
- o Changing how policies affecting "prescribed instruments" (such as permits and licences are used to manage risks to drinking water.

You can submit comments on this proposal through the Environmental Registry at ero.ontario.ca, ERO Notice 025-1060 for the legislative proposal and ERO Notice 025-1104 for the regulatory proposal, or by emailing us directly at source.protection@ontario.ca.

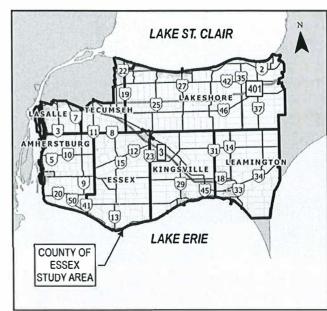

Re: Essex Region Source Protection Committee – Municipal Representation

As required by the Clean Water Act, 2006, the Essex Region Source Protection Authority (ERSPA) has an established Source Protection Committee (SPC), which follows the guidance of Ontario Regulation 288/07 (O.Reg. 288/07). The SPC is composed of 15 members, including five (5) representatives from the municipal sector. The remaining two-thirds of the SPC are representatives of key industries (e.g. agriculture, greenhouse operations, and fuel suppliers) and members of the public at large.

In 2007, the ERSPA striking committee proposed the following composition of municipal representation on the SPC.

- City of Windsor 2 members
- Union Water Supply System 1 member
- Town of Lakeshore 1 member
- Town of Amherstburg 1 member

The striking committee felt that those municipalities responsible for the Water Treatment Plants that provide the largest water supplies should have the opportunity to have representation on the SPC. A letter was sent to all Clerks of Member Municipalities on 30 July 2007 to this effect, and this distribution of representation was subsequently endorsed by all municipalities in 2007 and has remained as such. At this time one municipal member has taken a new position and can no longer sit on the SPC in this role, one municipal member has retired, and one municipal member is being re-appointed to the SPC.

Kevin Webb, who has represented the City of Windsor since 2021 announced his retirement in the fall of 2025. Taryn Azzopardi, Environmental Compliance, has been selected by the City of Windsor as their new representative on the SPC. Mr. Webb has been a valued member of the SPC and will be missed. We look forward to working with the newly selected member.

Municipal Councils are asked to endorse the municipal candidates prior to their formal appointment by the Essex Region Source Protection Authority as a regular SPC member. In keeping with our previous practices, at this time we are asking that all member Municipalities endorse the following individuals' appointment to the Essex Region Source Protection Committee:

• **Taryn Azzopardi**, **City of Windsor** expected appointment date: February 12, 2026; term of appointment: 5 years

Responses in the form of Council Resolutions are kindly requested by **December 22, 2025**. The Essex Region Source Protection Authority is tentatively scheduled to address this matter at their meeting on February 12, 2026.

This letter is sent under separate cover to municipal staff who have been appointed by their municipality to assist with Source Water Protection. Please contact me if you require any further information.

Integrity Commissioner's Periodic Report City of Windsor

The purpose of an Integrity Commissioner's periodic report is to provide the public with the opportunity to understand the ethical well-being of the Municipality's elected and appointed officials through the lens of our activities. Principles *Integrity* is pleased to submit this report, covering the period from January 1, 2022, the beginning of our tenure as Integrity Commissioner for the City of Windsor, through August 31, 2025.

About Us:

Principles *Integrity* is a partnership focused on accountability and governance matters for municipalities. Principles *Integrity* currently serves as Integrity Commissioner (and as Lobbyist Registrar/Closed Meeting Investigator/Municipal Ombudsman for some clients) in over 60 Ontario municipalities and other public bodies.

The Role of Integrity Commissioner, Generally:

An Integrity Commissioner's statutory role is to carry out, in an independent manner, the following functions:

- Advice on ethical policy development
- Education on matters relating to ethical behaviour
- Providing on request, advice and opinions to Council, members of Council and members of Local Boards
- Providing a mechanism to receive inquiries (often referred to as 'complaints') which allege a breach of ethical responsibilities
- Resolving complaints informally, where appropriate, and
- Investigating, reporting and making recommendations to Council on those complaints that cannot be resolved informally, while being guided by Council's codes, policies and protocols.

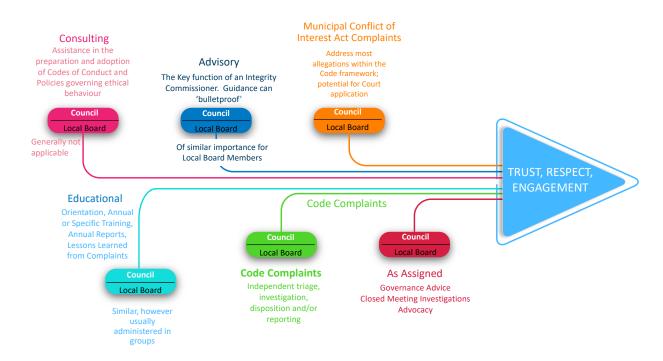
This might contrast with the popular yet incorrect view that the role of the Integrity Commissioner is primarily to hold elected officials to account; to investigate alleged transgressions and to recommend 'punishment'. The better view is that Integrity Commissioners serve as an independent resource, coach, and guide, focused on enhancing the municipality's ethical culture.

The operating philosophy of Principles *Integrity* recites this perspective. We believe there is one overarching objective for a municipality in appointing an Integrity Commissioner, and that is to raise the public's perception that its elected and appointed officials conduct themselves with integrity:

The perception that a community's elected representatives are operating with integrity is the glue which sustains local democracy. We live in a time when citizens are skeptical of their elected representatives at all levels. The overarching objective in appointing an Integrity Commissioner is to ensure the existence of robust and effective policies, procedures, and mechanisms that enhance the citizen's perception that their Council (and local boards) meet established ethical standards and where they do not, there exists a review mechanism that serves the public interest.

The practical effect of achieving this objective is an increase in trust, respect and engagement in local and upper tier affairs.

In carrying out our broad functions, the role falls into two principal areas. 'Municipal Act' functions, focused on codes of conduct and other policies relating to ethical behaviour, and 'MCIA' or *Municipal Conflict of Interest Act* functions. From an activity perspective, an Integrity Commissioner's role can be depicted this way:



The emphasis of Principles *Integrity* is to help municipalities enhance their ethical foundations and reputations through the drafting of effective codes of conduct and other policies governing ethical behaviour, to provide meaningful education related to such policies, and to provide pragmatic binding advice to Members seeking clarification on ethical issues. As noted in the graphic, we believe that the support we give to Members of Council increases the public's perception of them, which in turn leads to greater trust, respect and engagement.

Because the development of policy and the provision of education and advice is not in every case a full solution, the broad role of the Integrity Commissioner includes the function of

seeking and facilitating resolutions when allegations of ethical transgressions are made, and, where it is appropriate and in the public interest to do so, conducting and reporting on formal investigations. This in our view is best seen as a residual and not primary role.

Confidentiality:

Much of the work of an Integrity Commissioner is done under a cloak of confidentiality. While in most cases secrecy is required by statute, the promise of confidentiality also encourages full disclosure by the people who engage with us. We maintain the discretion to release confidential information when it is necessary to do so for the purposes of a public report, but those disclosures would be limited and rare.

City of Windsor Activity:

During the period covered by this report, we have been engaged in a moderate level of activity as Integrity Commissioner for the City of Windsor which subdivides roughly into three categories:

1. Policy Development and Education

During the period covered by this report we were not required to provide updates to policies for the Municipality. An orientation training session for Council was held on January 30, 2023.

2. Advice

The advice function of the Integrity Commissioner is available to all Members of Council and where applicable their staff and Members of local boards on matters relating to the code of conduct, the *Municipal Conflict of Interest Act* and any other matter touching upon the ethical conduct of Members. Advice provided by the Integrity Commissioner is confidential and independent, and where all the relevant facts are disclosed, is binding upon the Integrity Commissioner.

Our advice is typically provided in a short Advice Memorandum which confirms all relevant facts and provides with clarity our analysis and a recommended course of action.

During the period covered by this report, we responded to twelve (12) such requests for advice.

3. Complaint Investigation and Resolution

Our approach to reviewing complaints starts with a determination as to whether an inquiry to us is within our jurisdiction, is beyond a trifling matter, is not either frivolous or vexatious, and importantly, whether in its totality it is in the public interest to pursue. We always look to the possibility of informal resolution in favour of formal investigation and reporting. Once a formal investigation is commenced, the opportunity to seek informal resolution is not abandoned.

Where we are able to resolve a matter without concluding a formal investigation, our

practice is to provide a written explanation in the form of a Disposition Letter to the complainant to close the matter. Often the respondent Member is involved in preliminary fact-finding and will also be provided with a summary of the disposition.

Where formal investigations commence, they are conducted under the tenets of procedural fairness and Members are confidentially provided with the name of the Complainant when that information is necessary to enable them to respond to the allegations raised.

During the period covered by this report, we received twelve (12) complaints. Eleven (11) of these complaints were able to be resolved without a report to Council, while the investigation of the remaining complaint is ongoing.

Observations from across Ontario

With due regard to our obligation to maintain confidentiality, this report enables us to identify learning opportunities gleaned from our experience in municipalities across Ontario.

Disclosure of confidential information from closed meeting sessions

There have been some examples where elected or appointed officials fail to recognize the serious implications of disclosing confidential information, particularly information learned of through attendance in closed session.

A Member's obligation to maintain confidentiality is clear. They may not unilaterally decide to share confidential information, even if they believe the information should be publicly disclosed. This extends to releasing information even to their own legal counsel to obtain a 'second opinion'.

We treat this breach of ethical responsibility as breach of a cardinal rule, and if an allegation in this regard is proved to be true, it tends to attract a recommended sanction at the upper end of the prescribed range. Left unchecked, a confidentiality breach undermines not only Council's interests on the matter subject to the breach, but destroys the trust required of elected officials, and the staff that support them, to ensure that all relevant, and sensitive, information required to support the deliberation on a matter is freely supplied.

Non-disparagement

An area of prominence continues to be the failure of some Members of Council to adhere to rules against disparagement. Members of Council are entitled to, and indeed expected to, disagree on all manner of issues. However, one of the cornerstones to democracy must be the recognition that different opinions and perspectives are to be respected, and disagreement should not devolve into disrespect, disparagement and name-calling.

Disrespectful interactions and/treatment of others can fall along a continuum which may manifest as occasional incivility and micro-aggressions, but when unchecked can culminate in bullying and harassment. Members of Council should be mindful to treat each other, staff and the public with appropriate respect and professionalism at all times.

Some Members of Council hold a view was that they are entitled to their freely express their opinion, even if that includes disparagement of others, and so long as they share it via personal email, and not on the municipal server, they are not constrained by any rules around decorum. This is incorrect. Members are bound by the Code provisions of respectful and non-disparaging communication, whether sharing views on their own email, social media, or elsewhere.

Participation in social media discussions lends its own opportunity for attracting Code of Conduct complaints alleging disparagement. Members should be mindful that comments can be used or amplified in ways that bring municipal integrity into disrepute. It is important that Members be careful, accurate, and non-disparaging even as they attempt to offer what they see as a fair critique of municipal policy and actions. Municipal policy is advanced through the deliberations of Council and so wherever possible the focus should be on facilitating a discussion 'in the Chamber', and not in internet channels, so the general public, staff, and Council colleagues, can participate in the mechanisms through which a variety of important interests can be balanced and distilled into Council decisions made through democratic process.

Regardless of the medium, regardless of the intended audience, and regardless of motive, we have observed several instances where Members of Council in municipalities around the province have been found to have breached ethical standards by saying or recording things they have come to regret.

Recognizing and avoiding conflicts of interest

Recognizing and appropriately avoiding conflicts of interest when they might arise is the topic of most advice requests we receive. As confirmed by the Collingwood Judicial Inquiry (November 2020) there can be a complex array of circumstances that can give rise to conflicts of interest, including those that though not covered by the *Municipal Conflict of Interest Act*, are nevertheless covered by the common law

In any event, obtaining clear and reliable advice from the Integrity Commissioner can help avoid costly and time-consuming investigations if there is any uncertainty about the application of the Rule.

Staying in your lane

One area of concern that continues to arise relates to members of Council overstepping their role, attempting to 'take the reins' to fix a constituent's problem, or directing staff how to do their job. Members of Council serve an important role in putting constituents in touch with appropriate staff, and leading them to established processes, but it is important to strike the correct balance between guiding constituents and becoming their personal advocate.

It continues to be the case that elected officials attempt to inject themselves in quasi-judicial matters such as by-law enforcement, or with respect to insurance claims. While it is important for Council to retain an oversight role and have the ability to monitor how its by-laws and programs affect the community, file-level interference by individual elected officials must be

avoided.

Stronger Mayor Powers

On April 9, 2025, the Government of Ontario announced plans to expand Strong Mayor Powers to a further 169 municipalities. These changes are effective May 1, 2025. In municipalities subject to 'stronger mayor powers¹' the question arises as to whether a mayor with those powers can give direction to staff beyond the specific circumstances mentioned in the Act (essentially to carry out 'Mayoral Decisions' authorized by the Act, or to direct that staff conduct research and provide advice).

For non-'stronger mayors' and for stronger mayors exceeding their jurisdiction, inappropriate interference arises because of a misinterpretation of the *Municipal Act* provision which identifies the role of the Head of Council as 'Chief Executive Officer'. This provision has led to confusion and, occasionally, overreach by Heads of Council in erroneously perceiving a role in leading the municipality's administration. Elected officials – even Heads of Council – have no role in the day-to-day administration of municipal government unless specifically authorized by statute.

Failing to recognize this, stepping outside of their proper role as elected officials to 'take the reins' of administration, undermines staff and can be perceived as interfering with management. This overstepping of the proper role by Members, even Mayors, must be recognized as inappropriate under the Code of Conduct and the Council-Staff Relations Policy, both mandated under the *Municipal Act*.

As always, obtaining clear and reliable advice can help avoid a costly and time-consuming investigation.

Provincial Review of Code of Conduct/Integrity Commissioner System

In December 2024, proposed amendments to the Municipal Act were introduced by the province in the form of Bill 241, titled 'An Act to amend the City of Toronto Act, 2006 and the Municipal Act, 2001 in relation to codes of conduct'. After the last provincial election that Bill was been replaced by Bill 9 of the same name (the short title of the proposed legislation is now "Municipal Accountability Act, 2025"). The Standing Committee on Heritage, Infrastructure and Cultural Policy conducted hearings at several locations in the province, with its work becoming completed on August 26th when the Bill was sent to the House with only minor amendments.

Principles *Integrity* made oral submissions on the Bill and also coordinated the written submission by MICO, the Municipal Integrity Commissioners of Ontario. Disappointingly, to this point in time, the province has not engaged in any meaningful consultations on the Bill,

including with those of us who have pragmatic experience in the field and who can, and have, offered suggestions for improvement.

Code of Conduct development for various municipalities has been paused because Bills 241/9 contemplate a universal code of conduct for all municipalities in Ontario. No detail has been provided with respect to the form or content of such a code, nor to the future role of the Integrity Commissioner of Ontario in developing training or in otherwise influencing the approach municipal integrity commissioners are to take in serving their client municipalities.²

What the Bill does specify is a mechanism to remove elected officials from office should a municipal integrity commissioner find after a complaint investigation:

- 1. The member has contravened the code of conduct.
- 2. The contravention is of a serious nature.
- 3. The member's conduct that is the subject of the inquiry has resulted in harm to the health, safety or well-being of any person.
- 4. The penalties set out in subsection 223.4 (5) [reprimand or suspension of pay] are insufficient to address the contravention or to ensure that the contravention is not repeated.

If such is the case, the municipal integrity commissioner will refer the matter to the Integrity Commissioner of Ontario who will conduct their own inquiry. Upon the completion of that inquiry the Integrity Commissioner of Ontario, if they agree the above criteria have been met, will report to the respective municipal council with a recommendation that the elected official be removed from office. Council must vote unanimously (the respondent elected official cannot vote and is not counted) in order to cause the member's seat to become vacant.

In our view the mechanism set out in the Bill is lengthy, uncertain and expensive, and does not adequately deal with what might be done to achieve course correction while the process is underway, nor at the conclusion of a non-unanimous Council vote should the Integrity Commissioner of Ontario recommend that removal from office is appropriate.

Regrettably the Bill represents a virtually single-minded approach to remedying the deficiencies of the current system by focusing primarily on mechanisms leading to removal from office. It is hoped that there will be more fulsome consultations, including with practicing municipal integrity commissioners, prior to any further legislative action.

Conclusion:

We look forward to working with Members of Council to ensure a strong ethical framework. We embrace the opportunity to elevate Members' familiarity with their obligations under the Code and to respond to emerging issues. As always, we welcome Members' questions and look forward to continuing to serve as your Integrity Commissioner.

² It should be noted that the Integrity Commissioner of Ontario does not currently have any role in the administration of municipal code of conduct/integrity commissioner matters.

We recognize that public service is not easy and the ethical issues that arise can be challenging. The public rightly demands the highest standard from those who serve them, and we congratulate Council for its aspirational objective to strive to meet that standard.

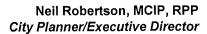

ZONING BY-LAW AMENDMENT PROCESS

The application will be terminated without notice after 60 days of inactivity. The following is for your information only. Review the Planning Act and relevant regulations for statutory requirements. The processing of the application is subject to change. Direct all guestions to the assigned Planner. The process is generally as follows:

- 1. The application is reviewed to ensure all prescribed and required information and the fee have been submitted. Within 30 days of the receipt of the application, you will be notified in writing that the application is deemed incomplete or complete.
- 2. If deemed incomplete, the application and fee will be returned. If deemed complete, fees are not refundable, the application is circulated to departments and external agencies for review and comment, and all submitted documents are made available to the public.
- 3. Following circulation, a draft staff report containing a recommendation and any conditions is prepared. The City Planner and other staff review the draft staff report.
- 4. When the staff report is approved by appropriate municipal staff, it will be scheduled for a future meeting of the Development and Heritage Standing Committee (DHSC).
- 5. The DHSC meeting is the public meeting required by the Planning Act. Public notice of the DHSC meeting is advertised in the Windsor Star, a local newspaper, at least 20 days in advance of the DHSC meeting. A courtesy notice may be mailed to property owners and/or tenants within 120 metres or more of the subject land.
- 6. 10 days prior to the DHSC meeting, the staff report is circulated to the applicant and DHSC members and made available to the public. All supporting documentation submitted by the applicant is available for review.
- 7. At the DHSC meeting, a staff planner may make a presentation. The applicant and other parties have an opportunity to provide verbal and/or written submissions. The DHSC may ask questions of staff, the applicant, agent, and other parties. The DHSC may decide to defer or recommend approval or denial of the application.
- 8. If deferred, the application along with any additional information or a new staff report will be considered at a future DHSC meeting. If recommended for approval or denial, the staff report, the minutes of the DHSC meeting, and the amending by-law are forwarded to City of Windsor Council for consideration at a future date. The applicant, agent and all interested parties will be notified by Council Services of the date, time, and location of the Council meeting. Call 311 or contact Council Services at 519-255-6211 or clerks@citywindsor.ca.
- 9. The application may be placed on the Consent Agenda of the Council Meeting, a part of the meeting where Council approves several matters with a single motion. If the application is not on the Consent Agenda, the staff planner may introduce the application, review the staff recommendation and any additional information provided to Council, and advise Council of any differences between the staff and DHSC recommendations. The applicant and other interested parties have an opportunity to make verbal and/or written submissions. Council may decide to approve, deny, or defer the application. If Council approves the application, the amending by-law may be approved at the same Council meeting, otherwise it will be approved at a future Council meeting.
- 10. When the amending by-law is passed, Council Services will mail a notice of the passing of the amending by-law to property owners and various public agencies within 15 days. There is a 20-day appeal period commencing the day after this notice is given. The notice will include the last day to file an appeal. An appeal is made to the Ontario Land Tribunal (OLT) through Council Services. If no appeal is filed, the amending by-law is final and binding as of the date of Council's passing of the by-law. A courtesy notice may be mailed to property owners and/or tenants within 120 metres or more of the subject land.

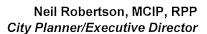

The application will be terminated without notice after 60 days of inactivity. The following is for your information only. Review the Planning Act and relevant regulations for statutory requirements. The processing of the application is subject to change. Direct all questions to the assigned Planner. The process is generally as follows:

- The application is reviewed to ensure all prescribed and required information and the fee have been submitted.
 Within 30 days of the receipt of the application, you will be notified in writing that the application is deemed incomplete or complete.
- 2. If deemed incomplete, the application and fee will be returned. If deemed complete, fees are not refundable, the application is circulated to departments and external agencies for review and comment, and all submitted documents are made available to the public.
- 3. Following circulation, a draft staff report containing a recommendation and any conditions is prepared. The City Planner and other staff review the draft staff report.

- 1. The application is reviewed to ensure all prescribed and required information and the fee have been submitted. Within 30 days of the receipt of the application, you will be notified in writing that the application is deemed incomplete or complete.
- If deemed incomplete, the application and fee will be returned. If deemed complete, fees are not refundable, the
 application is circulated to departments and external agencies for review and comment, and all submitted documents

- 3. Following circulation, a draft staff report containing a recommendation and any conditions is prepared. The City Planner and other staff review the draft staff report.

- 6. 10 days prior to the DHSC meeting, the staff report is circulated to the applicant and DHSC members and made available to the public. All supporting documentation submitted by the applicant is available for review.
- 7. At the DHSC meeting, a staff planner may make a presentation. The applicant and other parties have an opportunity to provide verbal and/or written submissions. The DHSC may ask questions of staff, the applicant, agent, and other parties. The DHSC may decide to defer or recommend approval or denial of the application.
- 8. If deferred, the application along with any additional information or a new staff report will be considered at a future DHSC meeting. Executive Summary:

N/A

Background:

A connectivity gap currently exists within the City's Regional Cycling Network from the western terminus of E.C ROW Avenue East, south along Devon Drive, west along Sydney Avenue, south along Marentette Avenue and west along Sydney Avenue to Division Road (refer to Appendix A).

Enhancements are proposed (i.e. multi-use path, bike sharrows, dedicated intersection crossings) to address this connectivity gap in the Regional Cycling Network (primary route) in South Windsor. This proposed enhanced segment will connect into new cycling infrastructure that is being constructed along Sydney Avenue (as part of the current Howard Avenue/Division Road construction project) and integrate into the existing network to the west at South Cameron Boulevard.

In addition to the City led project improvements to Howard Avenue/Division Road, ENWIN is concurrently undertaking a water feeder main construction project within the above noted limits (the "ENWIN Project").

Discussion:

Administration proposes utilizing a portion of its remaining uncommitted 2025 Bikeways Development budget for the installation of a Multi Use Trail (MUT) along Sydney Ave (Division Road to Marentette Avenue) and on Marentette Avenue (both North and South sides of Sydney Avenue) as well as bike sharrow painting and signage along Sydney Avenue (Marentette Avenue to Devon Drive) and on Devon Drive (Sydney Avenue to EC Row Avenue East) (refer to Appendix B).

Based on the escalating cost of labour, materials, traffic control, mobilization and demobilization as well as the current climate in the construction industry, it is deemed the most efficient and cost-effective option to integrate MUT installation in conjunction with the ENWIN Project. As ENWIN's contractor is currently on site with traffic control in place there would be a substantive savings of mobilization, demobilization and traffic control costs, not to mention cost avoidance of removing new asphalt surface and reinstating the same if this MUT work were to be undertaken by another contractor in a separate standalone project.

In addition to the proposed work to be added to the ENWIN project, the Transportation Maintenance Division will be undertaking the installation of bike sharrows on Sydney Avenue (Marentette Avenue to Devon Drive) and on Devon Drive (Sydney Avenue to EC Row Avenue East), along with installing dedicated PXOs at high traffic intersection areas at Sydney Avenue/Marentette Ave and Devon Drive/EC Row Avenue East as an additional safety enhancement to cyclists and pedestrians.

In addressing this connectivity gap, approximately 13 km of cycling infrastructure would be made contiguous from California Avenue (at Grand Marais Road West) to Lauzon Parkway (at Forest Glade Drive) along this primary east-west cycling network spine. Regional Cycling Network Map is included in Appendix A.

In accordance with Schedule A to Bylaw 93-2012 – Exemptions, Utility or Rail Works Services where the public utility or the railway, as the case may be, carries out works at the behest of the City it is exempt from the application of Purchasing Bylaw 93-2012. As a result, an RFP for a contractor is not necessary given ENWIN's contractor is able to perform the work on the City's behalf as they are currently undertaking a major construction project within the noted area.

Climate Change Risks:

Climate Change Mitigation

Shifting to more active forms of transportation assists in the reduction of air pollution, traffic congestion, and associated greenhouse gas emissions.

Climate Change Adaptation

As climate change presents more global and local threats, active transportation provides an alternative and affordable mode of travel, where other methods of travel may not be available.

Financial Matters:

An annual allotment of funding is approved under the capital budget for Bikeway Development Projects, OPS-014-07.

As shown in the table below, the total cost to carry out the MUT installation under this project is approximately \$379,719 (including non-refundable HST) which includes the main construction, a contingency allowance and applicable ENWIN administrative fees. There are no direct tariff impacts to the pricing of materials for this job per confirmation received from ENWIN.

In addition to the MUT installation costs noted above, the estimated cost to install PXOs, sharrows and associated signage and pavement markings for this project is \$76,000. This infrastructure will be separately installed by the City's Transportation Maintenance Division after the ENWIN project is complete.

There is approximately \$780,000 in uncommitted funds remaining in the Bikeway Development Project 7111031, which is sufficient to fund the \$455,719 (\$379,719 in ENWIN MUT work and \$76,000 in other work) identified above.

Tendering the MUT project separately at a future date is unlikely to yield better contractor pricing than what has been received through ENWIN. A future standalone tender is estimated to cost up to 45% more compared to doing the work now as part of the ENWIN project, considering additional mobilization/demobilization, asphalt restoration, traffic control costs and typical construction inflation.

Conclusion:

Administration recommends the MUT be installed as part of the ENWIN project in 2025. By integrating this work with ENWIN Utilities now, notable project efficiencies and cost savings can be achieved. In addressing this connectivity gap within the City's Regional Cycling Network, approximately 13 km of cycling infrastructure would be made

contiguous from California Avenue (at Grand Marais Road West) to Lauzon Parkway (at Forest Glade Drive) along this primary east-west cycling network spine.

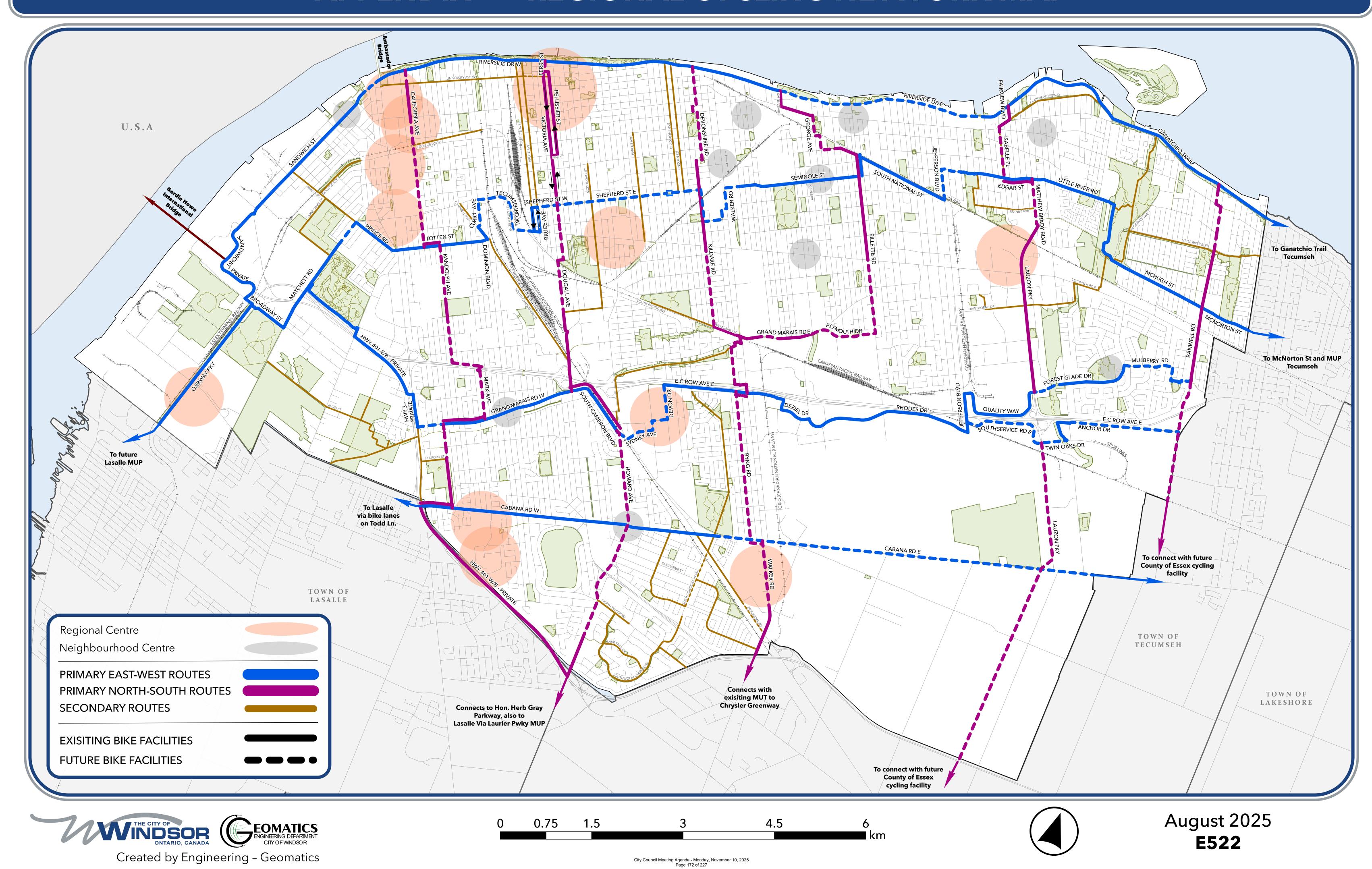

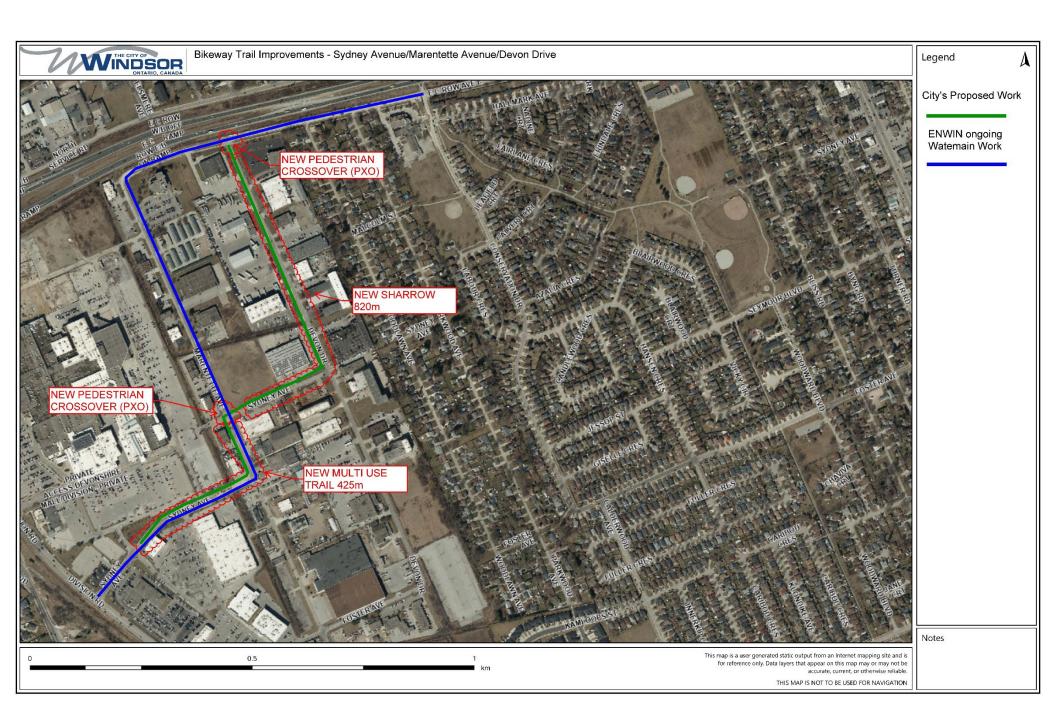

D.17, to proceed with the abandonment of the Grand Marais Branch Drain (formerly the Pillette No. 1 Drain), in accordance with Section 58 of the Drainage Act, R.S.O 1990, by **PASSING** By-law ____-2025.

Executive Summary:

N/A

Background:

The Pillette No. 1 Drain is a municipal drain and is located on City of Windsor property within the upper Grand Marais watershed. It serves as the storm outlet for the lands between Central Avenue and Pillette Road, from Grand Marais Road to Plymouth Road. The Pillette No. 1 Drain has been enclosed over the years from Tourangeau Road to Pillette Road, with an open section remaining from the Central Pond just east of Central Avenue, to just west of Tourangeau Road.

On February 26, 2024, Council initiated the abandonment of the Grand Marais Branch Drain, also known as the Pillette No. 1 Drain, under Section 84 of the Drainage Act through CR77/2024. On March 6, 2024, notices were issued to affected property owners, providing ten days to notify the clerk if they require an engineer's report for the proposed abandonment. A request was received, and Landmark Engineers Inc. was appointed under Section 84(3) through CAO 266/2024.

The engineer's report titled, "Grand Marais Branch Drain Abandonment Under Section 84(3) of the Drainage Act" and dated August 1, 2025, did not recommend against the abandonment (refer to Appendix 1).

At the City Council Meeting of September 22, 2025, Council approved the abandonment of the drain. Council Resolution CR395/2025 approved the first and second readings of Provisional By-law 156-2025. The engineer's report did not include any assessments, allowances, or compensation. Therefore, a Court of Revision meeting was not required.

Discussion:

Following passage of the provisional by-law, a copy was mailed to all affected property owners, along with notice of their right to appeal to the Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs Tribunal. No appeals were received and Council may proceed with the third and final reading of the by-law.

Risk Analysis:

A minor risk associated with the abandonment of the drain is that, once it is no longer classified as a municipal drain under the *Drainage Act*, certain maintenance protocols and streamlined approval processes will no longer apply. These protocols were established to facilitate approvals from agencies such as the Essex Region Conservation Authority (ERCA) and to satisfy requirements under the *Fisheries Act* and the *Ontario Endangered Species Act*.

However, this is offset by the benefit that the City will no longer be required to follow the rigorous procedural framework of the Drainage Act for future improvements or modifications to the drain. This will provide greater flexibility and efficiency in managing the infrastructure as part of the City's broader stormwater system.

Climate Change Risks:

Climate Change Mitigation

Future construction projects will result in Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions that are accounted for within the annual Community GHG emissions inventory.

Climate Change Adaptation

Future significant storms are likely to occur again and could lead to further instances of flooding within the City. While there will always be the risk of flooding, the risk can be mitigated by taking steps to reduce the amount of storm water entering into the sewer system. Drain improvements will improve the conveyance capacity of the system, reducing the potential risk of property damage to residents.

Financial Matters:

In accordance with the *City of Windsor Act, 1968*, the City has historically funded municipal drain maintenance through either the general tax levy or the sewer surcharge levy, depending on location. Following its abandonment under the *Drainage Act*, the Grand Marais Branch Drain (Pillette No. 1 Drain) will no longer be subject to the provisions of either the *Drainage Act* or the *City of Windsor Act, 1968*. However, the drain will continue to function as part of the City's municipal stormwater infrastructure and be maintained accordingly.

The only costs incurred are the cost of a survey in the amount of \$6,850 and the cost of the engineer's report in the amount of \$19,232.60, for a total of \$26,082.60 (excl. HST).

This amount is charged to Project ID 7086004 - Municipal Drains Program - Drainage Reports and Assessments.

The Financial Planning Administrator for Engineering has confirmed that there is approximately \$1.07M in available funding remaining in this project after commitment of the cost of the report and survey. The balance of funds will be used for ongoing reports for Municipal Drains as required.

Pursuant to instructions received from the City's Drainage Superintendent, Mr. Tom Graziano, we have completed our assessment into the proposed abandonment of the Grand Marais Branch Drain and are pleased to provide our report thereon.

Background

On October 14, 2019, Landmark issued a report entitled "Drainage Report for the Grand Marais Drain City of Windsor – County of Essex", which defined the Grand Marais Drain within the City of Windsor. Included in the report was a recommendation to abandon the Pillette No. 1 Drain and to establish the Grand Marais Branch Drain in its place. We understand that that report was adopted by bylaw.

At this time, we understand that the City wishes to proceed with abandonment of the Grand Marais Branch Drain – the segment of drain that extends from Plymouth Drive to Tourangeau Avenue. The balance of this report addresses the warrants for its abandonment.

Usual Basis of Assessment

The Drainage Act is very clear with regard to the usual circumstances under which a municipal drain would be abandoned, more specifically:

- The drain may have been physically removed by storm sewers due to development
- The drain is sufficiently old, undersized or out of repair

- The drain cannot be maintained to the standards of the original engineer's report
- The Drain has been built over or destroyed
- The drain no longer serves a useful purpose
- Property owners are unwilling to invest in improvements or assessment schedule updates to the drain (Section 76 or 78)

We note that none of the foregoing circumstances apply to the proposed abandonment. Rather the City has identified that the designation of "municipal drain" may limit flexibility for future infrastructure planning and coordination. As such the City is seeking to streamline its approach while maintaining the same level of service. We note that the entire segment of drain to be abandoned lies on either City owned lands, or lands over which the City has secured right-of-way.

In accordance with Section 84(2) of the *Act*, the City issued a notice to potentially affected residence of its intention to abandon the Pillette No. 1 Drain, and a request for preparation of a report under Section 84(3) was received from the owners of 2746 Cappelletto Road. A copy of the request is appended heret. The City subsequently appointed Landmark Engineers Inc. to prepare a report on the matter.

On-Site Meeting

An on-site meeting was held on May 22nd. A copy of the notice and minutes of the meeting are attached hereto, and a summary of the meeting is provided below.

It was emphasized that the proposed abandonment would not have any immediate effect on the drain. Mr. Graziano expressed the City's commitment to continuing to maintain the drain. Some attendees expressed their objection to the proposed abandonment, without indicating a clear reason.

Summary of Assessment

As noted, none of the usual reasons for abandonment are applicable to the City's intention to abandon the Grand Marais Branch Drain. More specifically, the subject segment of drain is remnant from the Pillette Drain No. 1, and continues to function in the intended manner. It was incorporated into a report that was adopted by the City for the Grand Marais Drain in 2019, renamed then as the Grand Marais Branch Drain. Following a review of current practices and infrastructure needs, the City has determined that continued maintenance under the drainage Act is no longer necessary or beneficial for this segment of drain.

We note that the City had originally sent out the notice under Section 84(2) of the *Act*, mistakenly referring to the subject segment of the drain as the Pillette Drain No. 1. This is of no consequence to the present undertaking, since the outcome would have been exactly the same – request under Section 84(3) for preparation of this engineer's report. This report addresses the request that was received.



Regarding our assessment of the appropriateness for abandonment of the drain, we note the following:

- The subject segment of drain continues to serve its intended purpose. It conveys stormwater from upstream land parcels and is sized appropriately for the intended function. The drain has experienced significant overgrowth along the drain banks and therefore would benefit from a substantial clearing and grubbing of trees and woody vegetation pursuant to the maintenance recommendations provided in the 2019 report for the Grand Marais Drain.
- Abandonment of the drain would not change anything in terms of service or maintenance of the drain. Due to the manner in which the City implements the *Drainage Act* in terms of assessments, the cost to maintain the drain would continue to be borne by the City's general tax levy, rather than the direct beneficiaries of the maintenance works. If the drain is abandoned under the *Act*, the obligation for the City to maintain the drain would not change. Rather than undertaking maintenance under the Act, maintenance would be undertaken under the Municipal Act, which authorizes municipalities to provide, manage and maintain such systems.
- Abandonment of the drain will not physically alter the existing drain. It will remain functional and in place, with future maintenance being undertaken by the City under the provisions of the *Municipal Act* in lieu of the *Drainage Act*. We would recommend that the drain be maintained in accordance with the recommendations provided in our aforementioned report entitled "Drainage Report for the Grand Marais Drain City of Windsor County of Essex".
- A significant aspect of the *Drainage Act* is the authority it grants to municipalities to trespass on private property. We note that the City owns or controls (through easements) all lands associated with the drain. Therefore, the *Drainage Act* is not required to secure access for future maintenance or improvements of the drain segment.
- While the Municipal Act does not impose a statutory duty to maintain stormwater infrastructure, it authorizes municipalities to provide, manage, and maintain such systems. This authority is supported by legislation such as the OWRA, EPA, Planning Act, and Conservation Authorities Act. If the drain is abandoned, it would be the City's intention to maintain the drain under this alternative legislation. Local by-laws reinforce the City's role in managing and funding stormwater infrastructure, including Sewer Use By-law 11446, Stormwater Service Charge By-law 171-2024, Wastewater Service Charge By-law 172-2024, and the City's Stormwater Management Requirements.

Adverse consequences of abandoning the drain under the *Drainage Act*:

There are two potential disadvantages to removing the Municipal Drain designation.

One concerns the lost ability of the drainage community to directly petition the City under the *Drainage Act* to undertake improvements and repairs, when the drainage community feels such works are warranted. As noted, the City maintains the same ability to undertake repairs or improvements when the City deems works are warranted, in the same manner that the City has the ability to maintain its storm sewer system within its jurisdiction.



The second disadvantage concerns the regulatory approval process. A principal reasons that the City commissioned the 2019 Grand Marais Drain report was to simplify the approval process for future works from a natural heritage perspective. For example, improvements along the drain that had been undertaken in 2012 and 2014 were subjected to very rigorous approval process in terms of habitat impacts. In comparison, projects undertaken under the *Drainage Act* were subject to registration of the project by the proponent, in lieu of seeking authorization with the MNRF. Abandonment of the segment of drain may subject any future improvements or maintenance works to more rigorous environmental review under such legislation as the provincial *Endangered Species Act*, and potentially the federal *Fisheries Act*. We understand that the City remains committed to maintaining the drain and will continue to navigate applicable regulatory requirements as it does for other infrastructure projects.

Cost Estimate

No physical works are associated with the subject drain abandonment and therefore there are no associated costs, except for the cost of this report. The total engineering fees associated with this undertaking, related to attendance at the onsite meeting and preparation of this report total \$19,232.60 all of which shall be assessed to the City of Windsor pursuant to CR388/2007.

Conclusion

Our assessment revealed that the usual criteria for abandonment of a drain is not realized with the subject segment of drain. Notwithstanding, if the City prefers to abandon the drain, it can do so without compromising any of the significant interests of the drainage community, or significant aspects of the *Drainage Act*. It is proposed that the segment of drain will remain unaffected and that future maintenance would be undertaken by the City under alternative legislation such as the City's Sewer Use By-law 11446, Stormwater Service Charge By-law 171-2024, Wastewater Service Charge By-law 172-2024, and the City's Stormwater Management Requirements.

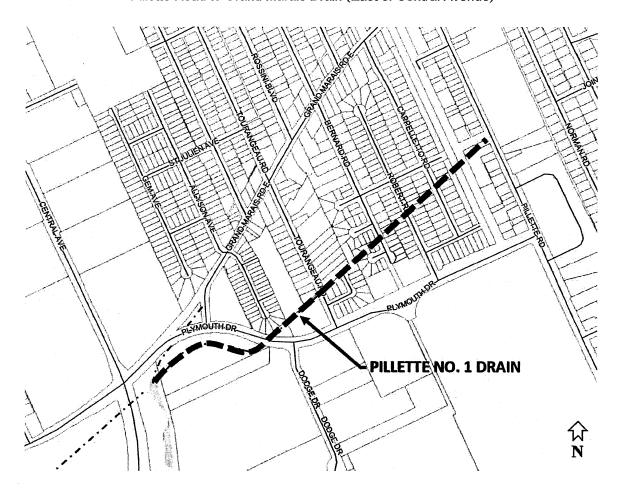

The following is a general summary of the items discussed at the above-noted meeting.

Item

1.0 Review Agenda and Highlight Purpose of Meeting

The purpose of the meeting was reviewed. The meeting intent was to provide information to all property owners and stakeholders in an open forum and obtain feedback on the proposed abandonment of the Grand Marais Branch Drain. Convening of an on-site meeting is prescribed under Section 9(1) of the *Act* for this purpose.

2.0 Present Brief History and Background

Some relevant history was provided. A report under the *Drainage Act* was filed in 2019, which established The Grand Marais Branch Drain and effectively abandoned the Pilette No. 1 Drain. The current undertaking has been initiated by the City to abandon the Grand Marais Branch Drain. If abandoned, the drain will no longer be maintained under the Drainage Act, but instead it will be deemed infrastructure under the Municipal Act. No physical changes or alterations to the open drain are proposed at this time. If maintenance or improvements are



proposed in the future, then the works would be undertaken by the City under the Municipal Act.

3.0 Discussions

Attendees asked what is happening on the vacant lands west of the properties that front Tourangeau Rd. Neither Mr. Graziano nor Mr. Krutsch had any knowledge of the particulars of any proposal for the site.

Concerns were expressed with regard to the overgrown condition of the open channel. Most of the residents present expressed interest in seeing the drain cleaned.

One resident expressed concern with the historic disposal of excavated material adjacent to the drain. It was expressed by Mr. Krutsch that if the drain ever required excavation, excavated material would probably be trucked away from the site.

Bill Boucas objected to the proposed drain abandonment. Other attendees were not sure whether to oppose or consent to the abandonment. Mr. Krutsch explained that when the City mailed out the notice to residents, someone requested preparation of a report under Section 84(3) of the *Act*.

Messrs. Krutsch and Graziano expressed that abandonment of the drain under the Act will not have any immediate effect on the drain or properties that drain to it. Abandonment will change the way that approvals are undertaken. Some of the changes would make the process of maintenance simpler and some may make it more difficult (e.g., Endangered Species Act compliance).

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 11:30 a.m.

Background:

The Lauzon Parkway Improvements Class Environmental Assessment Study (the Class EA Study) was approved in 2014, which included planned improvements to the Cabana Road East corridor (formerly County Road 42).

City Council approved the Lauzon Parkway and County Road 42 Infrastructure Improvements Project (7197000) for the multi-phased corridor improvement work related to the Class EA Study.

CAOP 149/2023 approved retaining Stantec Consulting Ltd. for the design and tender of Cabana Road East (formerly County Road 42) from 9th Concession to the east City limit, and Lauzon Parkway between the CP Tracks to Cabana Road East under RFP 107-23 on October 27, 2023.

The property requirements for utility relocations and road widening on both Cabana Road East and Lauzon Parkway have been determined as part of the detailed design by Stantec.

Discussion:

In expropriation cases Council sits as an "approving authority" and has broad discretion on whether to approve or reject a proposed expropriation. The approving authority shall:

- a) approve the proposed expropriation;
- b) not approve the proposed expropriation; or
- approve the proposed expropriation with such modifications as the approving authority considers proper, as long as the modifications do not affect the lands of a registered owner who was not a party to the hearing.

Where there has been a Hearing of Necessity, the Act also requires the approving authority to consider a report of the Tribunal and give reasons for its decision. Statutory notices were published and served and no request for a Hearing of Necessity was received.

Executive Summary:

N/A

Background:

Under Development Charges Bylaw 1-2021 (DC), the City of Windsor is allowed to collect development charges from developers to recover the growth-related capital costs associated with residential and non-residential growth within the municipality.

The *Development Charges Act* (DCA) previously required that a new DC Background Study and DC Bylaw be prepared every five years. Under Bill 23, municipalities can extend the expiry of a DC Bylaw from five to ten years. The current DC Bylaw is set to expire on January 17, 2026. Therefore, to be able to collect DC Fees beyond this date, an extension of the current bylaw to January 17, 2031 is being recommended.

The previous City-Wide DC Background Study was completed on November 5, 2020, and the DC Bylaw passed on January 18, 2021. The 2020 DC Study and maximum permissible DC rates were calculated using 2019 growth projections for the City. The DC Study projected growth for the Sandwich South Planning District (SSPD) over a longer time horizon (2020-2041). In addition, only preliminary engineering cost estimates for the infrastructure requirements (i.e., Roads and Related, Sanitary Sewer,

Storm Sewer and Municipal Drains, and Water) for the SSPD were included in the background study. Given the lack of development details available for the 2020 DC Study, all other services were based on the ten-year City-wide forecast for Library Services, Fire Services, Police Services, Indoor Recreation, Park Development, Transit, Waste Diversion, Buildings and Fleet, City-wide Studies, and Sewage Treatment development charges.

Following the completion of the 2020 Study, the City of Windsor and surrounding areas experienced significant economic growth due to the strong local economy with development exceeding growth projections in the 2020 DC Study. As a result, new infrastructure to support accelerated development was projected to be required sooner than originally planned.

On February 26, 2024, City Council approved (CR78/2024) commencing the DC Background Study earlier than required for implementation ahead of the current DC Bylaw expiration. In addition, the new DC Study would capture all the new infrastructure projects and updated costs, which saw significant inflationary increases required to support the projected growth. Furthermore, the announcement of the Nextstar Battery Plant in the SSPD stimulated additional development in the area by other manufacturers and various suppliers looking to be located near the new battery plant.

The new DC Bylaw was expected to be updated with new rates and policies to maximize the DC Revenue from development, thus minimizing funding from existing residents through the tax levy and user fees.

In 2025, the newly elected U.S. administration announced substantial import tariffs that have adversely affected the regional manufacturing sector and economic conditions. The resulting uncertainty has led many developers to adopt a cautious "wait and see" approach, with some deciding to postpone projects.

Additionally, several DCA legislative changes introduced by the Provincial government in recent years have added further uncertainty regarding the interpretation and application of DC Bylaws. These legislative changes, along with more revisions expected have impacted the City's ability to reliably forecast DC revenues, which are critical to planning and funding future capital infrastructure needs.

Discussion:

DC Task Force Committee

As in previous DC Background Studies, a Development Charges (DC) Task Force was established with Councillors McKenzie, Kaschak, Marignani, Sleiman, and Morrison being appointed by the Striking Committee. The Committee subsequently elected Councillor McKenzie Chairperson. Additionally, the Striking Committee appointed five non-voting members from the community. These members are: Evangelo Kalmantis, John Miller, Tony Rosati, Settimo Vilardi, and Frazier Fathers.

An initial meeting of the Task Force was held July 29, 2024 during which Craig Binning of Hemson Consulting provided the members with an overview of development charges in general and the *Development Charges Act* in particular. A second meeting was held November 18, 2024 during which Mr. Binning presented the preliminary inventories of engineered services as compiled by Hemson Consulting working with administration. Mr. Binning also presented preliminary draft development charge rates based on the completed general and engineered services inventories, as well as Hemson Consulting's ten-year development forecast for Windsor. The DC Task Force Committee also considered administrative recommendations on policies affecting the DC Bylaw. Feedback from the Task Force members was obtained and documented during this meeting to inform next steps. A subsequent meeting originally planned in early 2025 was deferred in light of the uncertainty caused by the US import tariffs announcements. The DC Task Force Committee had their third meeting on September 25, 2025, and received a revised timeline to complete the DC background Study that recommended pausing the processing of the new bylaw until more economic certainty is received as it relates to tariffs and their impact on the local development community. The DC Task Force Committee unanimously approved the following Recommendation:

"Extending the City's Current DC Bylaw up to 5 years (January 2031)"

Administration recommends that Council implement the DC Task Force Committee recommendation for the reasons noted in this report.

When preparing a new DC Bylaw or making amendments to it, the DC Act requires the completion of mandatory statutory procedures. These include the completion of a development charges background study which has to be made available to the public, holding a public meeting before passing the new bylaw, and providing notice of the passing the bylaw. Such a bylaw is subject to appeal and a hearing before the Ontario Land Tribunal. The DC Act was recently amended to allow certain bylaw amendments to proceed without the need to undertake these statutory requirements. In particular, where the only amendment to a DC Bylaw is to extend its expiry date, s.19(1.1) DC Act permits such a bylaw to be exempt from these statutory requirements. Therefore the proposed amendment to DC Bylaw 1-2021 to extent its expiry date is exempt from the statutory requirements that would otherwise apply. Accordingly the amending bylaw can be passed at this meeting of Council.

Extending the DC Bylaw for another five years does not preclude the City from passing a new DC bylaw during this five year period.

Risk Analysis:

Based on the impacts of continued uncertainty of tariffs on our local economy and development, it is recommended that the current DC Bylaw expiry date be extended for five years. Hemson Consulting and city staff will continue to monitor the impacts of new DCA legislation and regulations, along with the impacts of tariffs on our development community. There is a potential risk that funding for the growth-related capital program may not be available within the timeframe of the planned capital expenditures. This could result in the need for short term financing, project deferral, and/or reprioritization.

Climate Change Risks:

Climate Change Mitigation

Climate Change Adaptation

New construction will incorporate the latest building standards for improving residential and institutional structures to withstand extreme weather events. This is an essential strategy for climate change adaptation. It also results in lower utility bills and other related benefits.

Financial Matters:

Development charges are an important component the City of Windsor capital budget funding strategy. Capital projects relative to roads, sewers, fire services, libraries, community centres, etc., can be projects that aim to maintain the existing infrastructure in good condition or expand the existing infrastructure for growth related needs.

The recommendation to maintain current DC rates for up to an additional five (5) years means that while rates will continue to be indexed annually, they will otherwise remain unchanged during this period.

As a result, Administration may need to reprioritize growth-related capital projects outlined in the 10-year capital plan to align then with available DC funding. This process will be undertaken collaboratively with all affected departments, considering the reduced incremental DC revenues that would have been generated under higher rates. The objective will be to minimize impacts on critical growth-related capital projects and on municipal levy and wastewater & stormwater rates. Once the DC Bylaw is updated, any priority growth related projects, along with any interest costs incurred to fund the projects will be included to calculate the maximum permissible DC Fees.

Conclusion:

Administration, along with Hemson Consulting will be monitoring the legislative changes to the DCA and its related regulations, and plan on restarting the DC Background Study update in the fall of 2026. This deferral will also hopefully allow for some clarity on the tariff situation, allowing us to bring forward a new DC Bylaw in the spring of 2027.

Councillor Kieran McKenzie, Chair calls the meeting to order at 1:32 o'clock p.m. and the Development Charges Task Force considers the Agenda being Schedule A, attached hereto, matters which are dealt with as follows:

2. Declaration of Conflict

3. Adoption of the Minutes

4. Business Items

Craig Binning, Project Manager, Hemson Consulting Limited provides an overview of where development charges are today as follows:

- Are expecting some additional regulations to come forward possibly in October 2025.
- The Federal Budget will be coming out on November 4, 2025, and notes there may
 be some commentary on development charges and some monies available for
 municipalities to choose, maintain or discount rates to encourage the delivery of
 housing.
- That will provide the City an opportunity to see how things progress economically and bring back an updated DC Background Study & Bylaw for implementation in 2027.
- This has been the most turbulent time with respect to DC legislative changes.
- Since 2019, there has been a series of legislative changes with the province looking to create more housing supply and to address issues over affordability.
- The idea is that development charges and other municipal elements were slowing the supply of housing.
- Bill 23: Changes to the Development Charges Act including the new exemptions and new discounts.
- Bill 185: Cutting Red Tape to Building More Homes Act which includes the DC provisions and the DC exemptions
- Development charges are the central focus of Bill 17.
- Potential Future Changes to DC Landscape expecting regulations this Fall.
- The services applicable in the City of Windsor which includes Municipal -Wide, Area-Specific, and other available and not applicable services are discussed.
- Current Development Charges in Windsor.
- Phase 1, 2 and 3 of the 2025 DC Study Status are provided.

Councillor Kieran McKenzie, Chair asks if there is a timeline that would prompt another discussion. Craig Binning responds that upon receiving the transitional rules he may come back to the city and advise this needs to be advanced rather than waiting a year or two to initiate the Study. The Chair adds that timeline is built into the recommended motion, that it could be up to an additional five years, and if there is flexibility built into that motion.

Tony Ardovini, Deputy Treasurer, Financial Planning responds that the intent is to come back before the 10 years (probably in 2027) unless regulations require it sooner.

Councillor Jim Morrison refers to Bill 23 and the changes to the Development Charges Act and asks if a total rebuild would be exempt. Craig Binning responds affirmatively and adds this was one of the important changes to the legislation.

Councillor Ed Sleiman questions if long-term care homes will be exempt from development charges. Craig Binning responds that a long-term care home meets the definition in the legislation and is fully exempt.

In response to a question asked by Tony Rosati regarding if development charges can be decreased without a study, Craig Binning responds that Council always has that discretion. It allows a Council to reduce a charge for any class of development without going through a study.

Frasier Fathers asks if there is any risk of maintaining these DC rates when the city was projecting Sandwich South being in the hundred million plus range and how is that funding gap going to be made up. Janice Guthrie, Commissioner, Finance & City Treasurer responds they are looking at what projects by necessity need to be move forward. While the recommendation says that we are looking to extend the by-law until 2031, their intent is to regroup through 2026 to look at what the new regulations will say with the expectation they would be looking at implementation in 2027.

Tony Rosati indicates that the previous study projected the number of houses being built and asks what the actual numbers are. Tony Ardovini responds up to six months ago, things had really progressed and exceeded the actual projections.

Tony Rosati asks for the increase in the development charges collected versus what was projected. He further asks where this surplus money goes. Craig Binning states that surplus goes into the Development Charges Reserve Funds.

The Chair requests that an update be provided that reflects any surplus in the revenue that was collected. Tony Ardovini responds that annual Reserve Fund Activity is provided to Council and available on the City's website and when the grants are announced it will be factored in along, with any additional or lack of revenue now that there is a slow down.

Councillor Angelo Marignani refers to financial consequences to the taxpayer and possible future unfavourable forecasts, and questions if this burden would be passed onto the taxpayer.

Janice Guthrie responds they would have to strategize what projects move forward and adds there is an element of tax levy contribution to any project because in many cases only some of the project is eligible for DC, however the city may decide to do some enhancements.

Councillor Gary Kaschak refers to the November 18, 2024, minutes and the DC Background Study forecasting building permits between 2020 to 2023 and asks if data is available for 2023 to 2025. John Revell, Chief Building Official responds what they are hearing from the development community is there is a general drawback in residential development; some is being driven by economics and the uncertainly in what is going to happen in the City of Windsor in terms of the tariffs. There is also some turmoil with what the Federal Government is doing, so some developers have paused waiting to see what happens, so they are generally seeing a slow down.

Councillor Jim Morrison states that there is a need to increase the development charges.

Moved by Councillor Gary Kaschak, seconded by Councillor Ed Sleiman, That the City of Windsor's current Development Charges By-law **BE EXTENDED** to up to 5 years (January 2031). Carried.

 - 2) Power Generation Facility.
 - b) Permitted Buildings and Other Structures

No building or structures shall be used or erected in Defined Area M1-17 except for the following purposes:

- 1) buildings and structures for the permitted uses.
- 2) accessory buildings and structures for the permitted uses.
- c) Other Requirements
 - 1) The regulations of subsection 14.1.3 to 14.2.4 and all other applicable regulations shall apply to any use permitted in subsection 14.3.17 a).

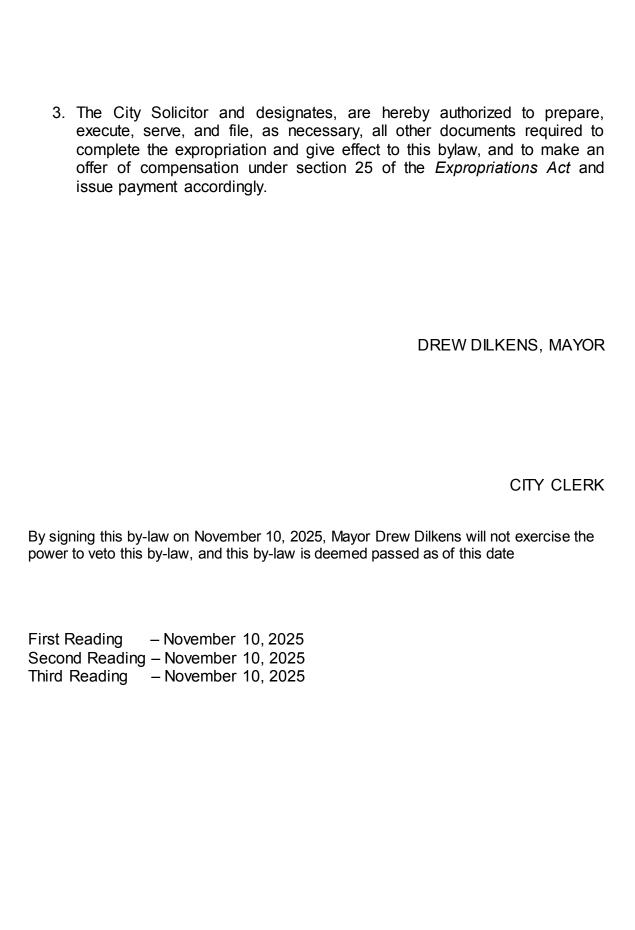
AND WHERAS notice of such application was published and served on the registered owners of the Lands in accordance with the *Expropriations Act*;
