(1) Consider re-appointment to the ***Windsor Utilities Commission*** for an additional 4 year term ending January 16, 2031.

(2) Consider the appointment of members to the ***Compliance Audit Committee*** for the 2026 Municipal Election.

NOTE:

In accordance with sections 88.33 to 88.37 of the *Municipal Elections Act, 1996* (MEA), the 2026–2030 Municipal Election Compliance Audit Committee must be established by City Council composed of three to seven members for the purpose of considering applications made by electors with regard to candidates' financial statements filed with the City Clerk for the 2026 municipal election. The Municipal Election Compliance Audit Committee's term of office begins on November 15, 2026, and ends on November 14, 2030.

The purpose of the 2026–2030 Municipal Election Compliance Audit Committee is to:

- Review compliance audit applications made by electors and decide whether they should be granted or rejected;
- Appoint an auditor, if the application is granted;
- Receive the auditor's report;
- Consider the auditor's report and decide if legal proceedings should be commenced; and
- Review the report from the Clerk or secretary of a local board in respect of each campaign contributor or third party advertiser who appears to have contravened any of the contribution limits; and
- Decide whether to commence a legal proceeding against a contributor or third party advertiser for an apparent contravention.
