✓ 1 candidate citywide

CITY COUNCILLORS

✓ 1 candidate from each of 10 wards

SCHOOL BOARD TRUSTEES

✓ Greater Essex County District School Board

✓ Windsor–Essex Catholic District School Board

✓ Conseil scolaire catholique Providence

✓ Conseil scolaire Viamonde

WHO IS RUNNING?

WHO CAN VOTE?

To be eligible to vote in this municipal election, you must be:

- A **resident** in the city of Windsor, or the **owner or tenant of land** in the city of Windsor, or the **spouse** of such owner or tenant; and
- A Canadian citizen; and
- 18 years of age or older on Voting Day, Monday, October 26, 2026; and
- Not prohibited from voting or otherwise prohibited by law (see Municipal Elections Act, 1996)

WHERE DO I VOTE?

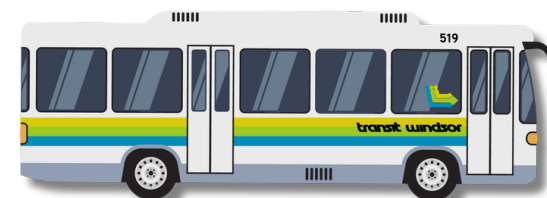
You must vote according to your qualifying address (usually where you reside) at one of the voting locations assigned to your ward.

For a list of voting locations in your ward:

- Refer to your City of Windsor **voter notification card** (to be mailed in September), or
- Visit www.WindsorElections.ca, or
- Contact 311

WHAT IDENTIFICATION DO I NEED TO BRING WITH ME?

- Bring identification showing **your name** and **qualifying address** to receive your ballot.
- A complete list of acceptable identification is available by contacting 311 or visiting **WindsorElections.ca**.



FREE TRANSIT FOR VOTERS

All eligible voters may ride the bus for free when you go to vote on Voting Day or any advance voting day (see reverse).

CAN'T MAKE IT TO THE POLLS ON VOTING DAY?

NO PROBLEM!

If you're unable to vote on Voting Day, you can cast your ballot at one of the advance voting locations (see reverse) or vote by proxy.

To vote by proxy, appoint a qualified elector in the city of Windsor to vote on your behalf. Additional restrictions may apply.
