Dear Chief Plain,

The City of Windsor (City) has initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study to consider the construction of a Wildlife Crossing at Ojibway Parkway. Approximately 20,000 vehicles per day travel along the Ojibway Parkway and E.C. Row Expressway, which contributes heavily to wildlife mortality. The Wildlife Crossing would provide safe passage for area wildlife and species at risk in the Ojibway Prairie Complex.

The City has retained Wood Environment & Infrastructure (Wood) to undertake this Class EA. The Class EA study will evaluate potential solutions to address the wildlife mortality on Ojibway Parkway. Various alternatives will be examined, including the impacts of alternatives on the social, cultural and natural environment. To advance the study, an evaluation was completed to determine if the wildlife crossing should be developed as an underpass or overpass. The detailed results of the evaluation will be available on the City's website and a link will be provided.

The City has received direction from the Provincial Crown that the Aamjiwnaang First Nation may have an interest in the study. The City is committed to involving stakeholders and Indigenous communities in this Class EA. For information, the City has attached the Notice of Study Commencement and project summary. Please feel free to share this information within your community as you feel appropriate.

We are interested in understanding any interests or questions that the Aamjiwnaang First Nation may have about this study and if there is a potential for the study to affect Indigenous and treaty rights. 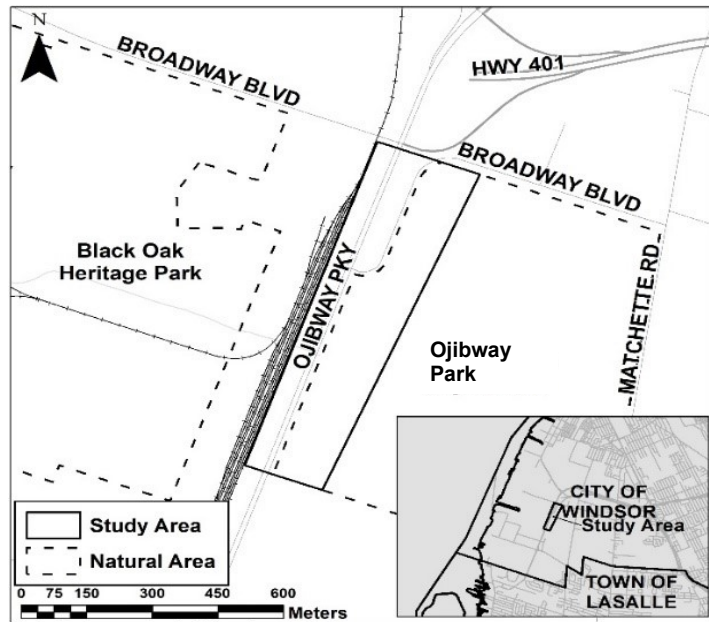

Project Summary

Ojibway Parkway Wildlife Crossing in the City of Windsor - Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study

A Municipal Class EA is a decision-making and planning process that identifies the potential effects of projects, such as bridge improvements, so that they can be managed prior to implementation.

Project Description

The City of Windsor has started a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study for the construction of a Wildlife Crossing at Ojibway Parkway. Approximately 20,000 vehicles per day travel along the Ojibway Parkway and E.C. Row Expressway, which contributes heavily to wildlife mortality. Ojibway Parkway is located within the Ojibway Prairie Complex and separates Black Oak Heritage Park (located to the west) and Ojibway Park (located to the east) (see the key map). The crossing would provide safe passage for wildlife and species at risk in the Ojibway Prairie Complex and create an ecological connection between the parks. The City has retained Wood Environment & Infrastructure Solutions (Wood) to undertake the Study.



Municipal Class Environmental Assessment

The purpose of this Class EA is to:

- Confirm the need for the wildlife crossing
- Identify and evaluate potential crossing options (underpass and overpass)
- Complete a thorough assessment to select the most feasible solution
- Identify the potential effects associated with the recommended solution and identify practical measures to avoid or mitigate potential negative effects

The first step in the study process is to develop an understanding of the current conditions in the study area. Once baseline conditions are determined, the City will develop potential alternatives to address wildlife mortality. The Class EA planning process helps identify the potential effects of proposed projects. Each proposed alternative is assessed against baseline conditions to determine the potential effects, and where necessary, identify mitigation measures to minimize or avoid those impacts. From these alternatives, the most feasible alternative will be identified. A key component of this study is to consult with the public, regulatory agencies, key stakeholders and Indigenous groups.

Baseline Studies

Baseline studies are prepared to describe the current biological, human and physical environment conditions. The following investigations will be completed as part of this study:

Targeted field studies within the right-of-way were completed to confirm existing environmental information and fill in minor data gaps.

Potential Project Related Effects

To advance the study, an evaluation was completed to determine if the wildlife crossing should be developed as an underpass or overpass. The results of the evaluation identified a preference for an overpass to provide landscape connectivity, wildlife preference for an overpass, stormwater and drainage opportunities, potential to add a gateway feature, opportunities to incorporate urban design guidelines and limited impacts on traffic flow from construction. The detailed results of the evaluation will be available on the City's website and a link will be provided.

Potential effects will be identified through an evaluation of the alternatives, and for the preferred alternative mitigation measure to address identified effects will be developed. This may include effects on:

- Heritage properties, cultural heritage landscapes and archaeology
- Environmental features including land-based and water-based environments

Schedule and Next Steps

- Public Information Sessions: Scheduled for November 19, 2020 and tentatively planned for winter 2021
- Environmental Study Report (*final report*): submission tentatively planned for spring 2021

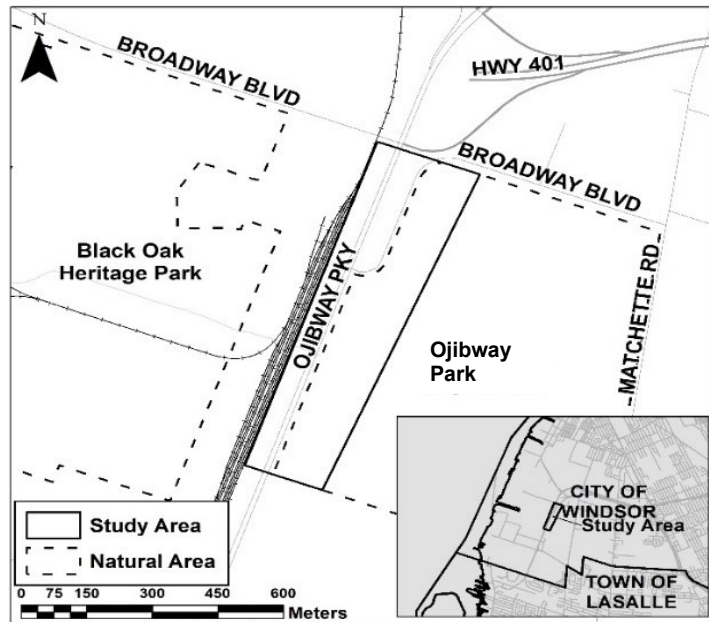

Project Summary

Ojibway Parkway Wildlife Crossing in the City of Windsor - Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study

A Municipal Class EA is a decision-making and planning process that identifies the potential effects of projects, such as bridge improvements, so that they can be managed prior to implementation.

Project Description

The City of Windsor has started a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study for the construction of a Wildlife Crossing at Ojibway Parkway. Approximately 20,000 vehicles per day travel along the Ojibway Parkway and E.C. Row Expressway, which contributes heavily to wildlife mortality. Ojibway Parkway is located within the Ojibway Prairie Complex and separates Black Oak Heritage Park (located to the west) and Ojibway Park (located to the east) (see the key map). The crossing would provide safe passage for wildlife and species at risk in the Ojibway Prairie Complex and create an ecological connection between the parks. The City has retained Wood Environment & Infrastructure Solutions (Wood) to undertake the Study.



Municipal Class Environmental Assessment

The purpose of this Class EA is to:

- Confirm the need for the wildlife crossing
- Identify and evaluate potential crossing options (underpass and overpass)
- Complete a thorough assessment to select the most feasible solution
- Identify the potential effects associated with the recommended solution and identify practical measures to avoid or mitigate potential negative effects

The first step in the study process is to develop an understanding of the current conditions in the study area. Once baseline conditions are determined, the City will develop potential alternatives to address wildlife mortality. The Class EA planning process helps identify the potential effects of proposed projects. Each proposed alternative is assessed against baseline conditions to determine the potential effects, and where necessary, identify mitigation measures to minimize or avoid those impacts. From these alternatives, the most feasible alternative will be identified. A key component of this study is to consult with the public, regulatory agencies, key stakeholders and Indigenous groups.

Baseline Studies

Baseline studies are prepared to describe the current biological, human and physical environment conditions. The following investigations will be completed as part of this study:

Targeted field studies within the right-of-way were completed to confirm existing environmental information and fill in minor data gaps.

Potential Project Related Effects

To advance the study, an evaluation was completed to determine if the wildlife crossing should be developed as an underpass or overpass. The results of the evaluation identified a preference for an overpass to provide landscape connectivity, wildlife preference for an overpass, stormwater and drainage opportunities, potential to add a gateway feature, opportunities to incorporate urban design guidelines and limited impacts on traffic flow from construction. The detailed results of the evaluation will be available on the City's website and a link will be provided.

Potential effects will be identified through an evaluation of the alternatives, and for the preferred alternative mitigation measure to address identified effects will be developed. This may include effects on:

- Heritage properties, cultural heritage landscapes and archaeology
- Environmental features including land-based and water-based environments

Schedule and Next Steps

- Public Information Sessions: Scheduled for November 19, 2020 and tentatively planned for winter 2021
- Environmental Study Report (*final report*): submission tentatively planned for spring 2021

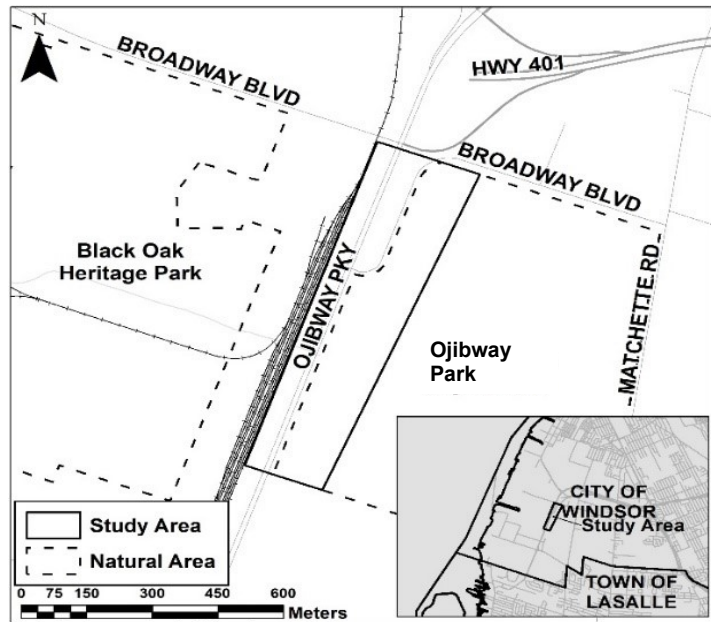

Ojibway Parkway Wildlife Crossing in the City of Windsor - Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study

A Municipal Class EA is a decision-making and planning process that identifies the potential effects of projects, such as bridge improvements, so that they can be managed prior to implementation.

Project Description

The City of Windsor has started a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study for the construction of a Wildlife Crossing at Ojibway Parkway. Approximately 20,000 vehicles per day travel along the Ojibway Parkway and E.C. Row Expressway, which contributes heavily to wildlife mortality. Ojibway Parkway is located within the Ojibway Prairie Complex and separates Black Oak Heritage Park (located to the west) and Ojibway Park (located to the east) (see the key map). The crossing would provide safe passage for wildlife and species at risk in the Ojibway Prairie Complex and create an ecological connection between the parks. The City has retained Wood Environment & Infrastructure Solutions (Wood) to undertake the Study.



Municipal Class Environmental Assessment

The purpose of this Class EA is to:

- Confirm the need for the wildlife crossing
- Identify and evaluate potential crossing options (underpass and overpass)
- Complete a thorough assessment to select the most feasible solution
- Identify the potential effects associated with the recommended solution and identify practical measures to avoid or mitigate potential negative effects

The first step in the study process is to develop an understanding of the current conditions in the study area. Once baseline conditions are determined, the City will develop potential alternatives to address wildlife mortality. The Class EA planning process helps identify the potential effects of proposed projects. Each proposed alternative is assessed against baseline conditions to determine the potential effects, and where necessary, identify mitigation measures to minimize or avoid those impacts. From these alternatives, the most feasible alternative will be identified. A key component of this study is to consult with the public, regulatory agencies, key stakeholders and Indigenous groups.

Baseline Studies

Baseline studies are prepared to describe the current biological, human and physical environment conditions. The following investigations will be completed as part of this study:

Targeted field studies within the right-of-way were completed to confirm existing environmental information and fill in minor data gaps.

Potential Project Related Effects

To advance the study, an evaluation was completed to determine if the wildlife crossing should be developed as an underpass or overpass. The results of the evaluation identified a preference for an overpass to provide landscape connectivity, wildlife preference for an overpass, stormwater and drainage opportunities, potential to add a gateway feature, opportunities to incorporate urban design guidelines and limited impacts on traffic flow from construction. The detailed results of the evaluation will be available on the City's website and a link will be provided.

Potential effects will be identified through an evaluation of the alternatives, and for the preferred alternative mitigation measure to address identified effects will be developed. This may include effects on:

- Heritage properties, cultural heritage landscapes and archaeology
- Environmental features including land-based and water-based environments

Schedule and Next Steps

- Public Information Sessions: Scheduled for November 19, 2020 and tentatively planned for winter 2021
- Environmental Study Report (*final report*): submission tentatively planned for spring 2021

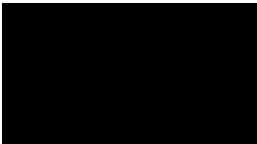

Thank you for your letter dated February 7, 2024 (attached) regarding the City of Windsor's Ojibway Parkway Wildlife Crossing Municipal Class Environmental Assessment.

Please note that as part of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process, the City of Windsor (City) reaches out to the public, residents, Indigenous Nations, government agencies, and stakeholders and invites them to provide their comments and concerns about the subject matter. The City's current policy does not allow for the provision of funding to any party in order to obtain their input, as participation in this aspect of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process is not considered obligatory. In relation to archaeology works, the City will follow the standards set out in the Province of Ontario's Standards and Guidelines for Consultant Archaeologists which includes consultation and engagement with First Nations Communities. These standards are reflected in the province's bulletin *Engaging Aboriginal Communities in Archaeology (2011)*, as well as the current *Draft City of Windsor Archaeological Management Plan 2023*, which has been circulated to the First Nations Communities for comment and review.

With respect to the Ojibway Parkway Wildlife Crossing Municipal Class Environmental Assessment, the project team is working towards finalizing the draft Environmental Study Report (ESR), which will include the recommendations on the preferred design solution. 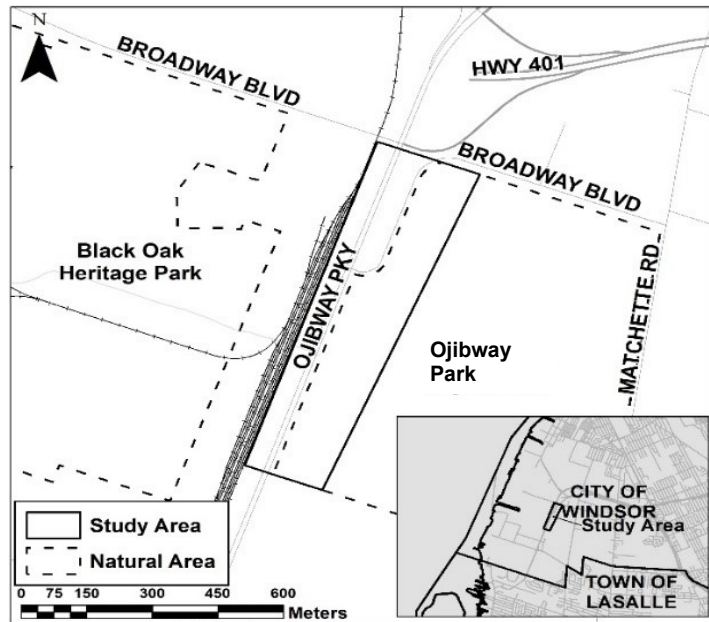

Project Summary

Ojibway Parkway Wildlife Crossing in the City of Windsor - Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study

A Municipal Class EA is a decision-making and planning process that identifies the potential effects of projects, such as bridge improvements, so that they can be managed prior to implementation.

Project Description

The City of Windsor has started a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study for the construction of a Wildlife Crossing at Ojibway Parkway. Approximately 20,000 vehicles per day travel along the Ojibway Parkway and E.C. Row Expressway, which contributes heavily to wildlife mortality. Ojibway Parkway is located within the Ojibway Prairie Complex and separates Black Oak Heritage Park (located to the west) and Ojibway Park (located to the east) (see the key map). The crossing would provide safe passage for wildlife and species at risk in the Ojibway Prairie Complex and create an ecological connection between the parks. The City has retained Wood Environment & Infrastructure Solutions (Wood) to undertake the Study.



Municipal Class Environmental Assessment

The purpose of this Class EA is to:

- Confirm the need for the wildlife crossing
- Identify and evaluate potential crossing options (underpass and overpass)
- Complete a thorough assessment to select the most feasible solution
- Identify the potential effects associated with the recommended solution and identify practical measures to avoid or mitigate potential negative effects

The first step in the study process is to develop an understanding of the current conditions in the study area. Once baseline conditions are determined, the City will develop potential alternatives to address wildlife mortality. The Class EA planning process helps identify the potential effects of proposed projects. Each proposed alternative is assessed against baseline conditions to determine the potential effects, and where necessary, identify mitigation measures to minimize or avoid those impacts. From these alternatives, the most feasible alternative will be identified. A key component of this study is to consult with the public, regulatory agencies, key stakeholders and Indigenous groups.

Baseline Studies

Baseline studies are prepared to describe the current biological, human and physical environment conditions. The following investigations will be completed as part of this study:

Biological Environment	Human Environment	Physical Environment

Targeted field studies within the right-of-way were completed to confirm existing environmental information and fill in minor data gaps.

Potential Project Related Effects

To advance the study, an evaluation was completed to determine if the wildlife crossing should be developed as an underpass or overpass. The results of the evaluation identified a preference for an overpass to provide landscape connectivity, wildlife preference for an overpass, stormwater and drainage opportunities, potential to add a gateway feature, opportunities to incorporate urban design guidelines and limited impacts on traffic flow from construction. The detailed results of the evaluation will be available on the City's website and a link will be provided.

Potential effects will be identified through an evaluation of the alternatives, and for the preferred alternative mitigation measure to address identified effects will be developed. This may include effects on:

- Heritage properties, cultural heritage landscapes and archaeology
- Environmental features including land-based and water-based environments

Schedule and Next Steps

- Public Information Sessions: Scheduled for November 19, 2020 and tentatively planned for winter 2021
- Environmental Study Report (*final report*): submission tentatively planned for spring 2021

1.0 Introductions

The City and Wood welcomed the participants and offered an opportunity for introductions. The meeting presentation was shared with the attendees in advance of the meeting and reviewed virtually as part of this discussion during the meeting. It was noted that if there is a need for a follow up meeting, it could be scheduled.

The City offered a land acknowledgement and thanked everyone for coming together in a good way.

2.0 Background

Wood provided an overview of the outreach and engagement with Chippewas of Kettle and Stony Point First Nation. Wood, on behalf of the City began reaching out to CKSPFN in late 2019 and has shared information and conducted outreach since that time with CKSPFN and other Indigenous Nations that may have interest in the Project.

IBA Braiding (Waverley) identified that their proposed review budget was not approved by the City. The City had offered a reduced amount and held this meeting to support that review.

Wood provided an overview of the Project background, including the makeup of the Ojibway Prairie Complex.

2.1. Need for Wildlife Crossing

Wood identified that the Ojibway Parkway separates Black Oak Heritage Park and Ojibway Park. Ojibway Parkway contributes to wildlife mortality, so a wildlife crossing is proposed to begin reestablishing ecological connectivity and to provide safe passage for area wildlife and Species at Risk.

2.2. Overview of Study Process

Wood provided an overview of the Study process and its phases, noting that the Project is in Phase 4. Once comments from agencies and Indigenous Nations are received, the Environmental Study Report (ESR) will be formally submitted for a 30-day public review period. After comments are received and responded to, a Notice of Completion will be issued.

2.3. Study Area Overview

Wood provided an overview of the Project Study Area. Ojibway Park is located on the east side of the Ojibway Parkway within the Study Area. This park includes various species at risk plants.

Ojibway Parkway Trail is located on the west side of Ojibway Parkway, within the Study Area.

There is a railway yard on the west side of the Study Area that is owned by Essex Terminal Railway (ETR) . An approximately 90 m wide strip of land west of the railway yard is also owned by Essex Terminal Railway.

2.4. Alternative Solutions

Two alternatives for the location of the wildlife crossing structure were identified within the Study Area. Option 1 - the North Option, does not impact species at risk plant species or their habitat. Whereas Option 2 - the South Option, would impact species at risk and their habitats. Each option also considered structural alternatives – either an underpass or an overpass.

2.5. Evaluation of Alternative Solutions

Wood provided an overview of the evaluation criteria and findings. It was noted that the overpass option has more benefits, such as more opportunities for connectivity to landscape and majority of wildlife prefer overpasses due to their attributes, such as, air flow and openness.

2.6. Preferred Solution

Based on the evaluation of alternatives, the Wildlife Overpass at North Location (Option 1) was identified as Preferred Solution. This option avoids impacts to species at risk plants.

Question: IBA Braiding (Waverley) asked if the alternatives were evaluated to determine if they would be an ecological trap.

Response: Wood responded that the underpasses could pose an ecological trap depending on the length. Ecological trap was not considered as an evaluation criterion.

Question: IBA Braiding (Waverley) asked if specific species circumstances, such as turtle vs. deer, were evaluated for each option.

Response: Wood explained the evaluation was not performed on a species-specific basis but rather a consideration of which alternative would benefit the most species. Wood noted that the overpass would be planned to mimic prairie soil to the preference of the plant species. It was also noted that feedback from Windsor Police service preferred the overpass as the underpass presented crime-related risks.

2.7. Alternative Design Concepts

Wood explained that four variations of an overpass was considered. There were technical design issues related to elevation and grades that had to be considered. Alternative 2 and Alternative 4 had required either retaining walls or steeper slopes at the western approach. Alternative 2 had a full suite of benefits for wildlife and did not have public safety concerns due to the existing multi-use trail being in open sight. Of the variations, Alternative 2 was identified as preferred design concept.

Question: IBA Braiding (Waverley) asked if there would be a possibility of a complete bridge going over the ETR railway tracks.

Response: Wood explained that Essex Terminal Railway has identified some concerns. Currently ETR own an approximately 90 m wide swath of land adjacent to the railway. It is not practical for a bridge to be built over that entire width since the rail lines themselves only occupy a portion of it (approximately 40m). For an extension to be considered the City would likely need to acquire the unused ETR owned land adjacent to the rail lines. An additional consideration for extending the crossing is that on the other side of the railyard, there is wetland which will need to be evaluated to determine the preferred location of the end of the bridge crossing the ETR tracks. The current option alleviates the most severe wildlife mortality concerns associated with Ojibway Parkway. As well, Wood noted that the railyard is a switching yard and the trains move slowly, roughly 16km/hr. It is a unique situation since the area still experiences a notable amount of train traffic just at lower speeds. Trains parked in this area also represent a reduced line of sight for some wildlife.

Question: IBA Braiding (Don) asked if Ontario Ministry of Transportation monitors ongoing Herb Gray Parkway and the movement of Species at Risk. There are tunnel top crossings at grade that have been successful for Eastern Foxsnake in the area.

Response: The City mentioned that they will receive reports in approximately a year from MTO related to wildlife monitoring on Herb Gray Parkway. Wood responded that they have been involved with the ongoing monitoring of wildlife (Eastern Foxsnake and Butlers Gartersnake) passage over the tunnel top crossings and are aware of the successes which have been achieved with those crossings.

Question: IBA Braiding (Don) asked about if it would be same type of soil that was used on wildlife crossings over Herb Gray Parkway?

Response: Wood identified that the soil type and depth proposed for the Ojibway Parkway Wildlife Crossing is consistent with the soil type and depth used for Wildlife Crossings over Herb Gray Parkway.

Question: IBA Braiding (Don) asked whether the City had engaged and heard from Walpole Island First Nation?

Response: Wood identified that the City met with Walpole Island First Nation in December 2020 and have shared materials and conducted outreach since then. No concerns have been received from Walpole Island First Nation.

2.10 Proposed Wildlife Fencing

Question: IBA Braiding (Waverley) asked if exclusion and connectivity structures are needed? Is there a plan for a fence?

Response: Wood responded, yes, and identified that there is existing fencing but it does not keep wildlife out. There is a plan to run exclusion fencing along Ojibway Parkway on both sides. It would be similar to a chain link fence with smooth mesh at the bottom to deter snakes from climbing the structure.

2.8. Potential Environmental Effects and Mitigation Measures

Wood explained that the ESR identifies project's potential effects and proposes mitigation measures. Wood shared few examples of potential effects and mitigation measures were shared during the meeting. For example, the City will perform a Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment on areas of archaeological potential that may require disturbance during construction. A tree inventory and replacement plan would be developed in addition to the erosion and sediment plan. Construction will be phased to minimize traffic on both sides.

Question: IBA Braiding (Don) requested that CKSPFN be provided a copy of the Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment report.

Response: Wood confirmed that CKSPFN will be invited to participate in the archaeological fieldwork and also receive a draft copy of the report review as well as a final copy.

2.9. Overview of Engagement Process

Wood provided an overview of the engagement process, including outreach and engagement with Indigenous Nations. Wood also met with Essex Regional Conservation Authority, Essex Terminal Railway and held two virtual Public Information Centres.

Question: IBA Braiding (Don) identified that it is unusual to see Oneida Nation of the Thames; was the City asked to engage them?

Response: Wood confirmed that the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks provided direction on which Indigenous Nations to engage as part of the Project. Wood explained their approach to engagement and that after this meeting, notes will be developed and shared for validation, and welcomes feedback.

2.10. Next Steps

Question: Wood provided an overview of the next steps and inquired to the participants if they required more time to review the ESR or wanted to meet again.

Response: IBA Braiding (Waverley) identified that they will provide some comments next week and would like to review the updated consultation log.

Wood mentioned that the updated ESR, Section 12, will contain the consultation log related to the review of Draft ESR.

Question: Wood inquired if there were any gaps noted and if this presentation was helpful.

Response: IBA Braiding (Waverley, Samantha and Don) responded that it was helpful and nice to hear about the process.

The City of Windsor is undertaking a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study to consider the construction of a Wildlife Crossing at Ojibway Parkway to begin to re-establish an ecological connection between Ojibway Park and Black Oak Heritage Park. This study was initiated in 2020.

Public Information Centre #2 was held from April 19, 2021, to May 3, 2021. Key feedback received during this event was to consider a Wildlife Crossing that connects the Ojibway Park and Black Oak Heritage Park by crossing the Essex Terminal Railway (ETR) tracks in addition to Ojibway Parkway. Accordingly, the Study Team has identified and evaluated additional design options for the Wildlife Crossing and identified a preferred design that crosses the Ojibway Parkway and the ETR tracks and connects Ojibway Park and the natural areas associated with Black Oak Heritage Park.

The City of Windsor previously contacted **Chippewas of Kettle and Stony Point First Nation (CKSPFN)** about this study (please see below the email correspondence). 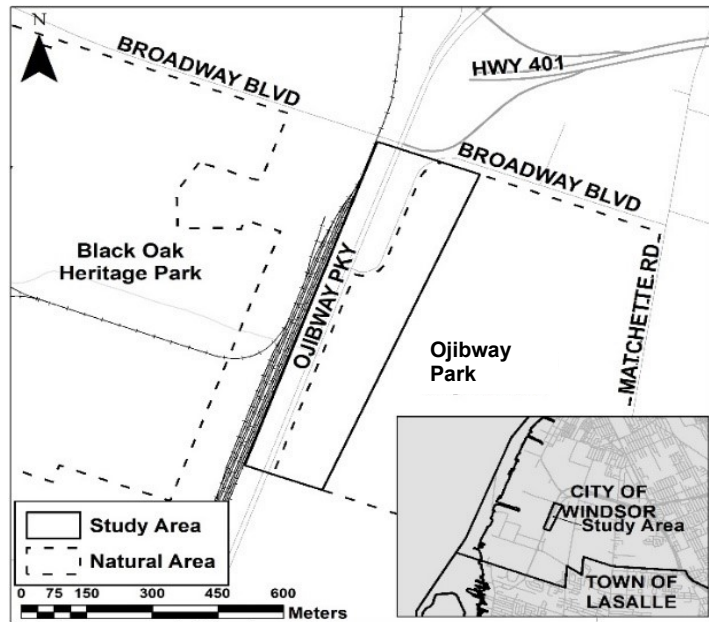

Ojibway Parkway Wildlife Crossing in the City of Windsor - Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study

A Municipal Class EA is a decision-making and planning process that identifies the potential effects of projects, such as bridge improvements, so that they can be managed prior to implementation.

Project Description

The City of Windsor has started a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study for the construction of a Wildlife Crossing at Ojibway Parkway. Approximately 20,000 vehicles per day travel along the Ojibway Parkway and E.C. Row Expressway, which contributes heavily to wildlife mortality. Ojibway Parkway is located within the Ojibway Prairie Complex and separates Black Oak Heritage Park (located to the west) and Ojibway Park (located to the east) (see the key map). The crossing would provide safe passage for wildlife and species at risk in the Ojibway Prairie Complex and create an ecological connection between the parks. The City has retained Wood Environment & Infrastructure Solutions (Wood) to undertake the Study.



Municipal Class Environmental Assessment

The purpose of this Class EA is to:

- Confirm the need for the wildlife crossing
- Identify and evaluate potential crossing options (underpass and overpass)
- Complete a thorough assessment to select the most feasible solution
- Identify the potential effects associated with the recommended solution and identify practical measures to avoid or mitigate potential negative effects

The first step in the study process is to develop an understanding of the current conditions in the study area. Once baseline conditions are determined, the City will develop potential alternatives to address wildlife mortality. The Class EA planning process helps identify the potential effects of proposed projects. Each proposed alternative is assessed against baseline conditions to determine the potential effects, and where necessary, identify mitigation measures to minimize or avoid those impacts. From these alternatives, the most feasible alternative will be identified. A key component of this study is to consult with the public, regulatory agencies, key stakeholders and Indigenous groups.

Baseline Studies

Baseline studies are prepared to describe the current biological, human and physical environment conditions. The following investigations will be completed as part of this study:

Targeted field studies within the right-of-way were completed to confirm existing environmental information and fill in minor data gaps.

Potential Project Related Effects

To advance the study, an evaluation was completed to determine if the wildlife crossing should be developed as an underpass or overpass. The results of the evaluation identified a preference for an overpass to provide landscape connectivity, wildlife preference for an overpass, stormwater and drainage opportunities, potential to add a gateway feature, opportunities to incorporate urban design guidelines and limited impacts on traffic flow from construction. The detailed results of the evaluation will be available on the City's website and a link will be provided.

Potential effects will be identified through an evaluation of the alternatives, and for the preferred alternative mitigation measure to address identified effects will be developed. This may include effects on:

- Heritage properties, cultural heritage landscapes and archaeology
- Environmental features including land-based and water-based environments

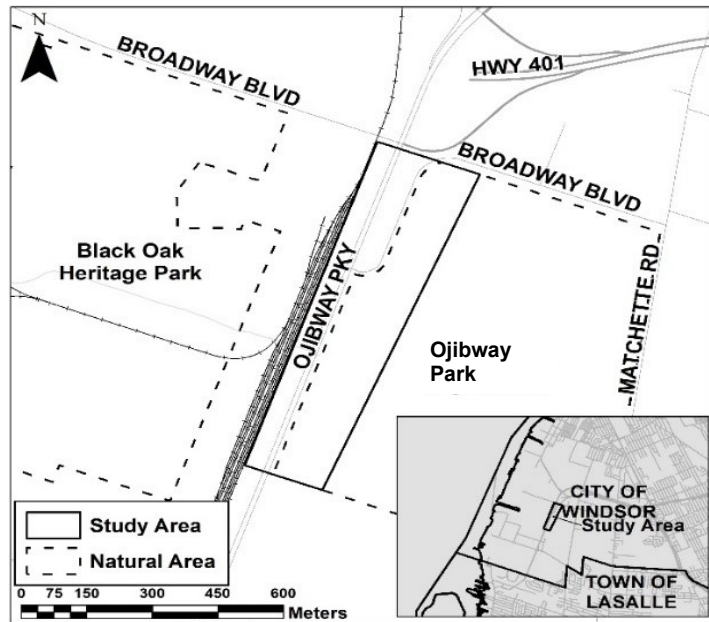

Ojibway Parkway Wildlife Crossing in the City of Windsor - Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study

A Municipal Class EA is a decision-making and planning process that identifies the potential effects of projects, such as bridge improvements, so that they can be managed prior to implementation.

Project Description

The City of Windsor has started a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study for the construction of a Wildlife Crossing at Ojibway Parkway. Approximately 20,000 vehicles per day travel along the Ojibway Parkway and E.C. Row Expressway, which contributes heavily to wildlife mortality. Ojibway Parkway is located within the Ojibway Prairie Complex and separates Black Oak Heritage Park (located to the west) and Ojibway Park (located to the east) (see the key map). The crossing would provide safe passage for wildlife and species at risk in the Ojibway Prairie Complex and create an ecological connection between the parks. The City has retained Wood Environment & Infrastructure Solutions (Wood) to undertake the Study.



Municipal Class Environmental Assessment

The purpose of this Class EA is to:

- Confirm the need for the wildlife crossing
- Identify and evaluate potential crossing options (underpass and overpass)
- Complete a thorough assessment to select the most feasible solution
- Identify the potential effects associated with the recommended solution and identify practical measures to avoid or mitigate potential negative effects

The first step in the study process is to develop an understanding of the current conditions in the study area. Once baseline conditions are determined, the City will develop potential alternatives to address wildlife mortality. The Class EA planning process helps identify the potential effects of proposed projects. Each proposed alternative is assessed against baseline conditions to determine the potential effects, and where necessary, identify mitigation measures to minimize or avoid those impacts. From these alternatives, the most feasible alternative will be identified. A key component of this study is to consult with the public, regulatory agencies, key stakeholders and Indigenous groups.

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Baseline studies are prepared to describe the current biological, human and physical environment conditions. The following investigations will be completed as part of this study:

Targeted field studies within the right-of-way were completed to confirm existing environmental information and fill in minor data gaps.

Potential Project Related Effects

To advance the study, an evaluation was completed to determine if the wildlife crossing should be developed as an underpass or overpass. The results of the evaluation identified a preference for an overpass to provide landscape connectivity, wildlife preference for an overpass, stormwater and drainage opportunities, potential to add a gateway feature, opportunities to incorporate urban design guidelines and limited impacts on traffic flow from construction. The detailed results of the evaluation will be available on the City's website and a link will be provided.

Potential effects will be identified through an evaluation of the alternatives, and for the preferred alternative mitigation measure to address identified effects will be developed. This may include effects on:

- Heritage properties, cultural heritage landscapes and archaeology
- Environmental features including land-based and water-based environments

- Public Information Sessions: Scheduled for November 19, 2020 and tentatively planned for winter 2021
- Environmental Study Report (*final report*): submission tentatively planned for spring 2021

5. Wood provided a summary of the Project to date. The following key points were identified:
 - The City of Windsor is undertaking this Class EA to provide an ecological connection between Black Oak Heritage Park and Ojibway Parkway.
 - There are currently 20,000 vehicles per day travelling on Ojibway Parkway and E.C. Row Expressway, which contributes heavily to wildlife mortality. The study area is Ojibway Parkway, between Broadway Boulevard and Sprucewood Avenue.
 - Natural environment: The study area contains woodlands, provincially significant wetlands, areas of natural and scientific interests, significant wildlife habitat and diverse vegetation communities.
 - Stage 1 archaeological assessment: The Stage 1 archaeological assessment has been completed for this Project. The results indicate the need to complete a Stage 2 archaeological assessment.
 - Cultural heritage: No cultural or built heritage features are within the study area
 - Active transportation: There is a multi-use trail along Ojibway Parkway, which will be considered with the construction of the wildlife crossing.
 - Drainage and stormwater: There are currently no existing stormwater management facilities in the study area; this project provides an opportunity to incorporate stormwater management.
 - Technical studies: Several studies that are underway or will be undertaken after the preferred solution is chosen, including stormwater management assessment, traffic review, natural environment assessment, restoration ecology, contamination overview and bridge engineering/structural assessment.
 - The three alternative solutions included: Do nothing, underpass wildlife crossing and overpass wildlife crossing.
 - The preferred solution was chosen based on natural, social, technical and cost factors. Alternative 3A (Overpass Wildlife Crossing – North Option) was selected as the preferred solution because it avoids impacts to species at risks, allows crossing for various species, provides an open structure, provides a gateway feature, integrates passive stormwater management, does not impact traffic flow and allows for landscape connectivity.
 - The next steps include finalizing the preferred solution, completing technical studies, preparing alternative design concepts, and preparing the final Environmental Study Report.

6. Brandon requested clarification regarding whether the overpass will be crossing over the adjacent rail tracks and if not, will this contribute to further wildlife mortality.
 - o Post Meeting Note: The property along the west side of railway yard is owned by the Essex Terminal Railway. As a result of feedback received from the first stage of the Study, the City of Windsor is consulting with Essex Terminal Railway to understand their interest in the project and property considerations. City of Windsor will evaluate the option of property acquisition on the west side of the railyard. At this time, the Study will proceed on the assumption that the western slope of the Wildlife Overpass will end at the Ojibway Trail, east of railway yard. Design considerations will be incorporated to allow for future extension of the Wildlife Overpass to the west across railway yard. Monitoring will be conducted to monitor performance of the Wildlife Overpass and mortality on railway tracks. If the need to extend the Wildlife Overpass across the railway yard, the City of Windsor will consider extending the structure, subject to the availability of funding to support additional studies, design, property acquisition and construction.
7. Brandon asked if there will be planned vegetation along the passage. Anika responded that there will be fencing provided to guide animals to the passage and the passage itself will include vegetation.
8. Brandon explained that there is typically an Oneida Environment Committee meeting twice a month, which would be the first gateway to receiving feedback. Due to COVID-19, this meeting will be held online. The Oneida Nation of the Thames is very interested in this Project and would like the City of Windsor to attend to present and discuss this Project. The attendees include Chief Chrisjohn, Councillors, representatives of the Clan Mothers and a few committee members. At this meeting, a determination is made about the project's impact on Treaty rights. Brandon expects this Project to be considered low impact, however in the chance that it is deemed medium or high impact, further consultation will be required. This will include more community involvement, including involvement of the Clan Mothers. The next committee meeting will be on December 8 and will only be attended by limited participants. If this is too short of a notice to participate, Brandon identified the subsequent meeting to be on January 12, 2021, from 10 am to 12 pm via Microsoft Teams. This Project would be allocated 30 minutes to present and discuss.
9. Brandon explained that this Project is a great opportunity, and he is happy to see the City of Windsor taking a unique and innovative approach to address the problem.

3. Brandon explained that this Project falls within the Traditional Territory of the Oneida Nation of the Thames. Brandon is part of the Bear Clan.
4. Oneida Nation of the Thames is a signatory of the Nanfan Treaty of 1701 and their Traditional Territory extend across southern Ontario from Otonabee River around Peterborough to as far south as the Ohio River and Chicago River in the United States. Oneida Nation of the Thames is made up of three communities with a population of approximately 20,000. About 6,300 people live in this community. Oneida Nation of the Thames are also part of the Two Row Wampum Treaty, which is the first treaty between Indigenous Peoples and Europeans. In terms of governance, there are two systems: the elected council and traditional governance system. There are also Clan Mothers, who are Title Holders and lead the conversation.
5. The Nanfan Treaty of 1701 identifies hunting and economic rights, as well as the rights to live on this land. This Treaty is about non-interference, where our goal is to work together and coexist. Regarding economic rights, the Oneida Nation of the Thames is interested in involvement in the Archaeological Assessments, through the participation of field monitors.
6. Oneida Nation of the Thames is unique as they were not given this land from the Federal Government, but instead when they moved here in 1840, the land was purchased. Oneida Nation of the Thames manages their own lands, and that information is not given to the Federal Government. Oneida Nation of the Thames will determine the impact level of this Project and notify the Project Team. The impact level will determine involvement. This Project is likely considered low impact, which means involvement in archaeological work and protecting the environment through other means such as building bat roosting boxes to provide habitat support.

7. Paul provided a summary of the Project to date. The following key points were identified:
 - The City is undertaking this Class EA to provide an ecological connection between Black Oak Heritage Park and Ojibway Parkway.
 - About 20,000 vehicles per day travel on Ojibway Parkway and E.C. Row Expressway, which contributes heavily to wildlife mortality. The Project's study area is Ojibway Parkway, between Broadway Boulevard and Sprucewood Avenue.
 - Natural environment: The study area contains woodlands, provincially significant wetlands, areas of natural and scientific interests, significant wildlife habitat and diverse vegetation communities.

- The three alternative solutions included: Do nothing, underpass wildlife crossing and overpass wildlife crossing.
- The preferred solution was chosen based on natural, social, technical and cost factors. Alternative 3A (Overpass Wildlife Crossing – North Option) was selected as the preferred solution because it avoids impacts to species at risk, allows crossing for various species, provides an open structure, provides a gateway feature, integrates passive stormwater management, does not impact traffic flow and allows for landscape connectivity.
- The next steps include finalizing the preferred solution, completing technical studies, preparing alternative design concepts, and preparing the final Environmental Study Report.

Open Discussion

8. Councillor Cornelius asked what the measurements were for the Parkway?
 - a. Nathan answered that the right-of-way from Ojibway Park to Essex Terminal Railway is 40 m. The road itself is approximately 20 m and the right-of-way is another 20 m.
9. Brandon requested that the Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment, once completed to be sent to Oneida Nation of the Thames for review. If a Stage 3 and 4 Archaeological Assessment is required, field monitors must be present.
10. Councillor George-Antone asked how to direct animals to cross the bridge.
 - a. Nathan explained that fences will be provided along Ojibway Parkway. Currently, there is a chain link fence, which is acceptable for larger animals like deer but not effective for reptiles. Additionally, the existing fence has numerous gaps under it which allow for wildlife to pass through it.
11. Councillor Cornelius inquired about why this Project was not started before.
 - a. Paul explained that wildlife crossings are more accepted and recognized as important now. Historically, as a society we have not acknowledged the value in nature. The Herb Gray Parkway has made these types of crossings more accepted within area. Funding is an important factor and the Detroit Bridge Authority offered to fund this Project.
12. Brandon asked how much acreage of habitat will the overpass be connecting?
 - a. Nathan explained that from the City's website, Black Oak Heritage Park, Ojibway Park, Tallgrass Prairie Heritage Park and Spring Garden Natural Area are approximately 604 acres (244 hectares). Of these 604 acres, Black Oak Heritage Park is approximately 180 acres and Ojibway Park is approximately 140 acres.
13. Brandon expressed appreciation for the City on undertaking this Project. Brandon asked if there are others in Ontario?
 - a. Paul explained that the best example is the Herb Gray Parkway in Windsor. There is also one on Highway 69 (near Sudbury), one on the east side of Georgian Bay, a few near Collingwood and a few in the prairies, along the TransCanada Highway. These are smaller ones, focused primarily on deer.

- b. Councillor Cornelius identified that they should propose one on Highway 401, near Dorchester Road to the City of London.
- 14. Brandon asked if there are any records of eastern wolf or hognose snake and will there be any further biological studies completed.
 - a. Nathan identified that there is no firm evidence of eastern wolf, however feedback from the public shows there might be some grey fox in this area. The City and Wood are unsure if there are any hognose snakes in the area. Further biological work will occur during detailed design.
- 15. Brandon requested clarification if there is an existing overpass that this Project is building on.
 - a. Paul answered that there is no overpass of any kind currently.
- 16. Brandon requested clarification of the bats listed as species within this area. Oneida Nation of the Thames can assist with the protection of bats by creating bat boxes or other items like bee boxes.
 - a. Herb Gray Parkway and the associated multi-use trail system are owned and controlled by the Ministry of Transportation. The contact person at the Ministry of Transportation is Jaclyn Charlton (Jaclyn.Charlton@ontario.ca). If Oneida Nations of the Thames has any comments or suggestions for the Herb Gray Parkway, please contact Jaclyn Charlton. She will be able to advise on what was done for bat mitigation on the Herb Gray Parkway. For bat migration and bat boxes, and trail signs with Indigenous content as part of Ojibway Park, please contact Karen Cedar (kcedar@citywindsor.ca). Ojibway Park is owned and managed by the City of Windsor through Ojibway Nature Centre. She would be happy to discuss incorporating Indigenous content.
- 17. Councillor George-Antone asked about the likelihood that humans will be using this overpass, resulting in the residue of human scent, which will deter animals from using the overpass.
 - a. Nathan explained that the Project Team is aware of this problem and is looking into how we can reduce human presence. This can be done through education, signage and cameras.
- 18. Brandon explained that his mother was concerned about deer potentially jumping over the overpass onto the road.
 - a. Paul explained that high fencing will be provided. The alternative design options which are currently being assessed involve a 1.8 m high concrete parapet (similar to a jersey barrier) supplemented with a 2.3 m high chain link fence mounted atop it, for a total height of 4.1 m (functional height of 3.3 m since there will be 0.8 m of fill on the overpass). The chain link fence will have additional mesh panels on the inside facing side of the fence to reduce risk of snake species getting through the fence and falling onto the road.
- 19. Brandon asked for clarification on the trail adjacent to the overpass and if there is any type of Indigenous content is on the trail, such as Haudenosaunee language and knowledge? Conestogo has a trail system and is implementing a sign with a QR code, which allows the user to scan the code on their phone and have a video come up where an elder discusses the importance of the species in the area.

As mentioned in number 16, please contact both Karen Cedar and Jaclyn Charlton for more information. Although the trail system is not included in this Project, the City will investigate other opportunities to incorporate Indigenous content in their trail systems.
- 20.** Brandon asked what the construction timeline is.
 - a. Nathan explained that 2022 is the earliest for construction. The goal is to complete the Class EA by mid this year, then proceed with detailed design. The City will be working with relocating utilities during detailed design and then construction can start, with considerations given to funding restrictions.

- 21.** City to investigate the possibility of having Oneida Nation of the Thames involved in creating bat roosting boxes or bee boxes. Please contact Karen Cedar directly (kcedar@citywindsor.ca).
- 22.** City to investigate the possibility of incorporating Indigenous content on its trail systems, or within the multi-use pathway which would be modified as part of the Ojibway Parkway Wildlife Crossing Project. Please contact Karen Cedar directly (kcedar@citywindsor.ca).
- 23.** Any further archaeology work (Stage 3 and 4) will require Oneida Nation of the Thames to be present with field monitors. The Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment once completed will be provided to Oneida Nation of the Thames for their review and comment. Wood will document the commitment to provide the Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment and the need for field monitors for Stage 3 and 4 Archaeological Assessment in the Environmental Study Report.

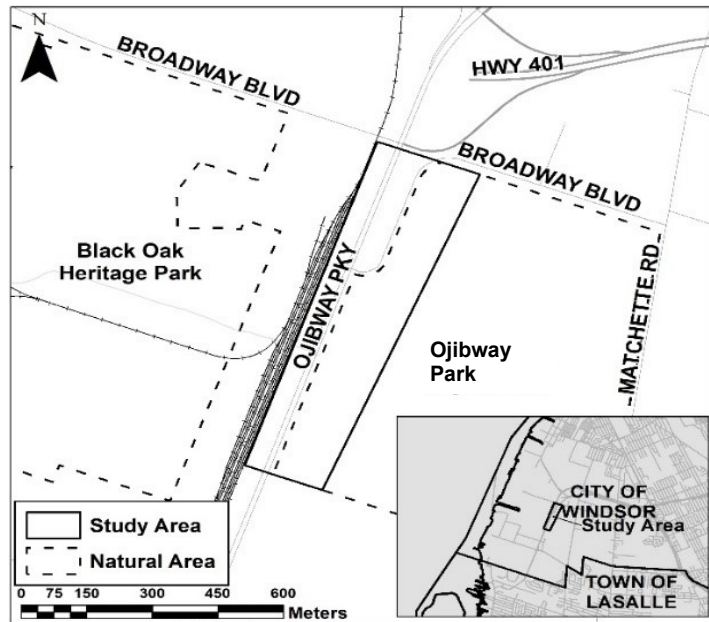

Ojibway Parkway Wildlife Crossing in the City of Windsor - Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study

A Municipal Class EA is a decision-making and planning process that identifies the potential effects of projects, such as bridge improvements, so that they can be managed prior to implementation.

Project Description

The City of Windsor has started a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study for the construction of a Wildlife Crossing at Ojibway Parkway. Approximately 20,000 vehicles per day travel along the Ojibway Parkway and E.C. Row Expressway, which contributes heavily to wildlife mortality. Ojibway Parkway is located within the Ojibway Prairie Complex and separates Black Oak Heritage Park (located to the west) and Ojibway Park (located to the east) (see the key map). The crossing would provide safe passage for wildlife and species at risk in the Ojibway Prairie Complex and create an ecological connection between the parks. The City has retained Wood Environment & Infrastructure Solutions (Wood) to undertake the Study.



Municipal Class Environmental Assessment

The purpose of this Class EA is to:

- Confirm the need for the wildlife crossing
- Identify and evaluate potential crossing options (underpass and overpass)
- Complete a thorough assessment to select the most feasible solution
- Identify the potential effects associated with the recommended solution and identify practical measures to avoid or mitigate potential negative effects

The first step in the study process is to develop an understanding of the current conditions in the study area. Once baseline conditions are determined, the City will develop potential alternatives to address wildlife mortality. The Class EA planning process helps identify the potential effects of proposed projects. Each proposed alternative is assessed against baseline conditions to determine the potential effects, and where necessary, identify mitigation measures to minimize or avoid those impacts. From these alternatives, the most feasible alternative will be identified. A key component of this study is to consult with the public, regulatory agencies, key stakeholders and Indigenous groups.

Baseline Studies

Baseline studies are prepared to describe the current biological, human and physical environment conditions. The following investigations will be completed as part of this study:

Targeted field studies within the right-of-way were completed to confirm existing environmental information and fill in minor data gaps.

Potential Project Related Effects

To advance the study, an evaluation was completed to determine if the wildlife crossing should be developed as an underpass or overpass. The results of the evaluation identified a preference for an overpass to provide landscape connectivity, wildlife preference for an overpass, stormwater and drainage opportunities, potential to add a gateway feature, opportunities to incorporate urban design guidelines and limited impacts on traffic flow from construction. The detailed results of the evaluation will be available on the City's website and a link will be provided.

Potential effects will be identified through an evaluation of the alternatives, and for the preferred alternative mitigation measure to address identified effects will be developed. This may include effects on:

- Heritage properties, cultural heritage landscapes and archaeology
- Environmental features including land-based and water-based environments

- Public Information Sessions: Scheduled for November 19, 2020 and tentatively planned for winter 2021
- Environmental Study Report (*final report*): submission tentatively planned for spring 2021

Project Summary

5. Wood provided a summary of the Project to date.
 - The City of Windsor is undertaking this Class EA to provide an ecological connection between Black Oak Heritage Park and Ojibway Parkway.
 - There are currently 20,000 vehicles per day travelling on Ojibway Parkway and E.C. Row Expressway, which contributes heavily to wildlife mortality. The study area is Ojibway Parkway, between Broadway Boulevard and Sprucewood Avenue.
 - Natural environment: The study area contains woodlands, provincially significant wetlands, areas of natural and scientific interests, significant wildlife habitat and diverse vegetation communities.
 - Stage 1 archaeological assessment: The Stage 1 archaeological assessment has been completed for this Project. The results indicate the need to complete a Stage 2 archaeological assessment.
 - Cultural heritage: No cultural or built heritage features are within the study area.
 - Active transportation: There is a multi-use trail along Ojibway Parkway, which will be considered with the construction of the wildlife crossing. Human access will not be provided on the wildlife crossing; the multi-use trail will be below the crossing.
 - Drainage and stormwater: There are currently no existing stormwater management facilities in the study area; this project provides an opportunity to incorporate stormwater management.
 - Technical studies: Several studies that are underway or will be undertaken after the preferred solution is chosen, including stormwater management assessment, traffic review, natural environment assessment, restoration ecology, contamination overview and bridge engineering / structural assessment.
 - The three alternative solutions included: Do nothing, underpass wildlife crossing and overpass wildlife crossing.
 - The preferred solution was chosen based on natural, social, technical and cost factors. Alternative 3A (Overpass Wildlife Crossing – North Option) was selected as the preferred solution because it avoids impacts to species at risk, allows crossing for various species, provides an open structure, provides a gateway feature, integrates passive stormwater management, does not impact traffic flow and allows for landscape connectivity.

6. Janet indicated that WIFN prefers an overpass structure (rather than an underpass) for the wildlife crossing. Wood will document this preference in the Environmental Study Report Consultation Record.

7. Janet identified that WIFN needs to be involved in the Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment field work. Currently, WIFN is revising their rates for field monitors to be consistent with the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation rates. WIFN would like an agreement to be established as soon as possible. This agreement can be established with the proponent or the consultant. Once the rates are determined, WIFN will provide the draft agreement to the City for review. 10. Janet requested a comprehensive list of species within the study area. Specifically, Janet inquired about why snakes were not included on the presentation slides, as snake relocation was an important consideration for the Herb Gray Parkway project.

- a. **Post meeting note: As the Project is in its early stages, a comprehensive list of species is not available at this time. Once the natural environment report is complete, Wood will provide the report to WIFN for review.**

11. Janet inquired about data to back up the need for this wildlife crossing. She requested any mortality studies or location data that have been completed to date or is available for this area.

- a. **Post meeting note: Road mortality data is often used to determine hotspots and is regularly used for some animal groups, such as reptiles. However, this crossing structure is to accommodate all wildlife (including plants). Wildlife-vehicle collisions can not always be relied on (e.g., the bias in reporting, low volume roads, generalize location reporting), and other methods have evolved to determine crossing locations. Road mortality data can not replace incorporating information about the surrounding habitat and landscape structure into an analysis of crossing locations. The location of the crossing considers that wildlife-vehicle collisions tend**

to occur where animals find it easier to cross roads. The current Parkway does not have appropriate fences or large steep embankments to deter animals from crossing or funnel animals to better crossing points. The preferred design will also incorporate fencing to direct animal use to the crossing structure. Wildlife-vehicle collision data has been requested and mapping illustrating this data will be provided within the Natural Assessment Environment Report.

12. Janet requested clarification on how the location of the wildlife crossing (south option and north option) was chosen.

- a. **Post meeting note: Overall, the landscape was used to determine where the crossing should be located. This overpass crossing is intended for more than just herptile species. Habitat availability on either side of road was considered as a factor in determining where most animals will choose to cross. The main purpose of the crossing is to provide tall grass prairie and Areas of Natural and Scientific Interest connection for habitats, with appropriate fencing.**
 - i. The south option was selected as it is located where the existing multi-use trail is closest to the parkway. This will be the most cost-effective option as it will not require moving the trail and it is within an area with fewer trees on the railway side. The natural environment assessment identified that there are SAR plants near the proposed south option; however, the number of individuals are limited, so mitigation requirements would not be extensive.
 - ii. The north option was selected as it is a more balanced distance between SAR plant species and in an area of canopy opening on both sides of the parkway. This will require less tree removal. However, in this area, the trail will have to be reconfigured.

13. Janet requested a timeline for the project.

- a. **Post meeting note: The preferred solution will be finalized by the end of 2020. Winter and spring 2021 will be focused on completing various technical studies and the preliminary design. The Environment Study Report is scheduled to be completed by summer 2021. The construction timeline is unknown at this time.**

The City of Windsor is undertaking a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study to consider the construction of a Wildlife Crossing at Ojibway Parkway to begin to re-establish an ecological connection between Ojibway Park and Black Oak Heritage Park. This study was initiated in 2020.

Public Information Centre #2 was held from April 19, 2021, to May 3, 2021. Key feedback received during this event was to consider a Wildlife Crossing that connects the Ojibway Park and Black Oak Heritage Park by crossing the Essex Terminal Railway (ETR) tracks in addition to Ojibway Parkway. Accordingly, the Study Team has identified and evaluated additional design options for the Wildlife Crossing and identified a preferred design that crosses the Ojibway Parkway and the ETR tracks and connects Ojibway Park and the natural areas associated with Black Oak Heritage Park.
