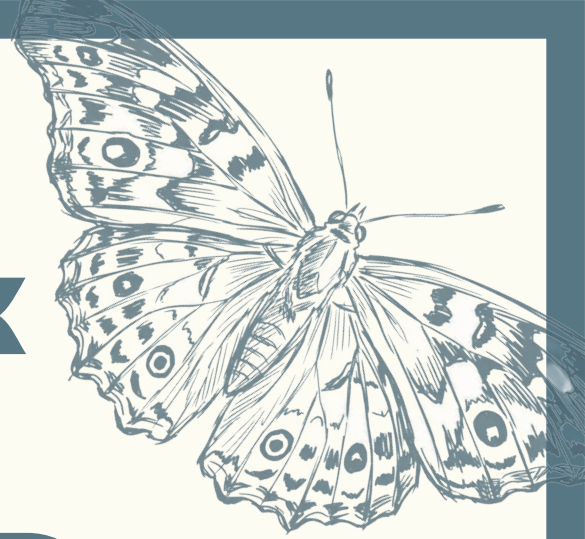

SPECIES SPOTLIGHT:

Hackberry Emperor Butterfly

The hackberry trees found in Black Oak Heritage Park are essential to this butterfly's life cycle: females lay their eggs on the trees, and the caterpillars feed on the leaves.

Unlike most butterflies that drink flower nectar, hackberry emperors seek unusual food sources such as tree sap, rotting fruit, animal droppings, and even the salt in human sweat!

LOOK FOR:

Eastern American toads, indigo buntings, mature black oak trees, underwing moths
