With the Recycle Coach App, you have your collection calendar (garbage, yard waste, recycling) on your phone! **'Real time' updates** (delays, holidays, events, etc.) are sent out and the app also includes a search function to tell you **"What Goes Where"**.

Waste Disposal Information

- You will receive **MULTIPLE** collections on the same day starting this year. Please keep materials separate from each other when setting out for collection.
- **DO NOT set out garbage prior to 7:00 p.m.** on the day before your collection.
- Street Collection: Do not place containers on roadway. Place at the curb/road edge.
- April 1, 2025: Collection in residential alleys will be discontinued. All material **must be set out to the curb for collection**.
- Your time of collection can vary. Please place your garbage out the night before or **by 6:00 a.m. on your scheduled collection day.**
- If you have questions regarding your garbage collection (ie. what is acceptable) please call 311.
- Unacceptable Garbage These items will NOT be collected curbside: Renovation and construction debris, animal waste, grass clippings, yard waste, cardboard, fluorescent tubes/lights, household chemical waste, paint products, medical waste, syringes, tires, couches, concrete, asbestos, bricks, appliances, metal items & electronic waste.

• Non-Compliant Containers: Do not place garbage out in containers that are **Oversized & Overweight.** Containers cannot weigh over 20kg/45lb.

Acceptable Garbage Containers





Garbage must be placed in bags inside a hard sided container.

Metal or Plastic Containers

- Maximum 125L capacity limit
- Containers cannot exceed 20kg/45lb.
- Maximum 78 cm/31" tall, 51 cm/20" diameter
- 2 handles and a water tight lid
- Do not secure lid to pail
- Collectors will not reach into pails to pull bags out. This is unsafe as it could injure workers.

Roll-out Carts

- Carts must have a lower bar 18" from the ground and an upper lift attachment that is 33" from the ground.
- For more information go to youtube.com and search "acceptable garbage cart."
- Roll out carts will only be collected by use of mechanical cart mechanism placed on all garbage trucks. No manual lifting of bags out of carts.
- Capacity limit 363L (96 gallon) or 181.5L (48 gallon) approved roll-out cart.
- No loose garbage inside cart

Garbage User Fee: 4 loads \$5.00 each annually if load weighs 1-100 kgs. Further loads weighing 0-100 kg AFTER 4 loads will be assessed a flat fee of \$10.00 each. Loads weighing more than 100 kg will be assessed as \$10.50/100 kg (on total weight). Fees subject to change without notice.

Split Load Policy:

If you have free and chargeable items in the same load you must go over the scale twice – first with the materials that are 'charged a tipping fee' and the second time to drop off the materials that are free. Otherwise you will be charged the tipping fee on the whole load.

Missed Collections

Missed collections are upsetting, but there is usually a reason why material was not collected as expected.

To ensure your materials are collected, please make sure they are:

- In acceptable containers (see page 3). Garbage must be placed in bags inside hard sided containers.
- Out by 6:00 a.m.
- Do not overfill containers or place bags on top of containers.
- Not altered. Lids must not be tied to pails.
- Within the weight limit of 20 kg (45 lbs).
- Not hidden behind a vehicle, snow bank, or other obstruction.
- Material is not frozen in pails and /or containers.
- Free of prohibited material (e.g. hazardous or construction/renovation waste).

Other reasons for missed collections are:

- Syringes found in garbage pails or recycling boxes.
- Garbage/Organics/Yard Waste not scheduled for collection that particular day/week.
- Damaged containers/carts i.e. missing bar, wheels or handle.

If an item is not collected for reasons other than the above, please call **311**.

TIP: Put drainage holes in the bottom of your container to allow liquids to drain out.



Leaf & Yard Waste

- Place Yard Waste out BEFORE 6:00 a.m. ONLY on your scheduled collection day.
- Brush and branches should be tied in bundles no more than 3' in diameter and weigh no more than 45 lbs/20 kg. Do not use wire to tie the bundles.



- Thorny branches should be placed in boxes, pails or yard waste bags.
- Any untied, loose piles of brush will NOT be collected.
- Place leaves, garden waste, branches, brush, tree & hedge trimmings in acceptable yard waste containers.
- NOT ACCEPTABLE: Yard Waste will not be collected in plastic bags.
- The City of Windsor is NOT responsible for large quantities of brush left by commercial tree trimmers working on private property.

Do not blow leaves onto the roadway. Our street sweeping
machines will not collect them.



The EWSWA is rolling out the new Green Bin collection program to keep food waste and organics out of the Essex-Windsor Regional Landfill. Bin delivery to all single-family households in Phase1 runs from July to October. Over 150,000 homes will receive Green Bins, so please be patient – yours will be delivered before the October 21st program launch.

- Your 120L EWSWA Green Bin has a gravity lock and comes with a Starter Kit that includes a kitchen catcher, sample compostable

bag, and information on using the Green Bin.

Collection starts in October, so please be sure to store your Green Bin safely until then.



- Your collection day. Check your municipal collection calendar for your weekly collection dates, and download Recycle Coach for updates and notifications.
- Your set-out time. Put your Green Bin out by 6 AM so you don't miss the truck.
- How to use your Green Bin. Know the do's and don'ts of using your Bin. Refer to your Starter Kit for details.
- What bags to use. Only compostable bags can be used in this program. Refer to your Starter Kit for details.
 - Proper Bin set-out. "Park-Point-Space". Due to automated collection, you must:
 - * Park the Bin about 30 cm (1 ft) from the curb.
 - * **Point** the arrows on the Bin to the street.
 - * Space the Bin at least 1 metre apart from other carts or structures.

Bulk Item Collection

Did you know? Dumping any material on public or private property is illegal, makes our community less attractive, and requires costly clean up.

To dispose of unwanted furniture and large items:

- Consider donation or selling any item in good condition (see page 13).
- Bring the item to the Public Drop Off Depot (see back cover; fees apply).
- Call 311 to schedule a Bulk Item Pick Up
 - Items must be placed at the curb (not in the alley) by 6am on designated day.
 - Items must be less than 200 lbs, under 4ft. wide and 8ft. in length.
 - Restrictions apply; visit **www.citywindsor.ca** or **call 311** for more details.
 - Fees may apply; program is subject to Council approval.

DON'T FREEZE THIS WINTER Keep It Green with the Green Bin Program

Winter's cold weather can present unique challenges. Here are some useful cold weather tips to help you "stay green" all year.

- **1.** Line the bottom of your Green Bin with a layer of cardboard, newspaper, or a paper egg carton to prevent contents from freezing to the Bin.
- **2.** Drain liquids before you put food waste and other organics into your Bin.
- **3.** Where possible, try to set out your Bin the morning of collection (by 6 AM) to avoid material freezing to the Bin.



- Keep your yard free of debris, unsecured garbage and rotting fruits/vegetables.
- If you suspect rats are living on your property, call **311** to inquire about City baiting services. Residential external baiting service only (Program subject to Council approval).
