

Prince Road Storm Sewer Outlet Schedule 'C' Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Project Update and Recommended Design

In February 2021, the City of Windsor initiated a Schedule C Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) study for the proposed Prince Road storm sewer outlet at McKee Creek. This study is building on work completed under the Sewer & Coastal Flood Protection Master Plan (SCFPMP) and is focusing on finding the preferred location and design of the outlet and associated pumping station. The study area is shown on the key map.

Through evaluation and consultation with key stakeholders (property owners, Hydro One, ETR, Essex Region Conservation Authority, Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks), a recommended location has been selected on lands owned by Russell Street Property Holdings Inc. within the study area. In addition, the recommended design of the outlet and pumping station has been developed.

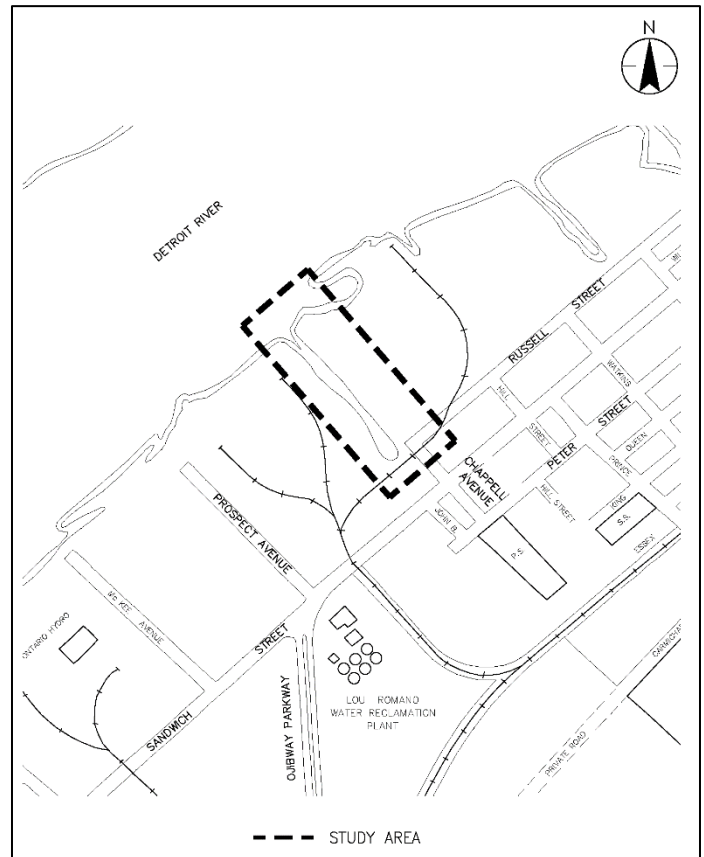
