The City of Windsor is committed to making our community cleaner, greener, healthier and more sustainable. As the quote above suggests, each of us has an important role to play and is responsible for helping to protect and preserve our environment. Our individual day-to-day choices and actions directly impact our planet. As a community, we are on the right track. However, we can always do more.

Windsor was recently recognized by the Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP) with an A rating. Additionally, the development and implementation of the Sewer and Coastal Flood Management Plan, as well as local economic development projects, such as the NextStar electric vehicle battery plant and Stellantis' retooling for electric vehicles are steps Windsor is taking to support the net-zero transition. These projects make a big difference in our community, and so can you as a valued resident of Windsor.

The City of Windsor continues to look to undertake more zero-waste initiatives. In July, the Can-Am Police Fire Games were an example of what we want to do with more local events. The seven-hour opening ceremonies welcomed over 2,000 people but resulted in only two garbage bags being used as the incorporation of recycling and compost accounted for the remainder of the waste. While the event was not entirely waste free, it is certainly a step in the right direction. It is important that residents continue to aim for zero waste, eliminating as much unnecessary waste from their lives as possible.

This calendar provides valuable information and tips on what items can be recycled, and how to prepare them. We ask Windsorites to continue making positive strides in this area. We are all in this together, and I ask you to join me in the worthy cause to sustain the land that sustains us. Thank you for contributing to the success of our recycling program and doing your part to responsibly reduce, reuse and recycle.

Windy Days: Please stack your Blue Box on top of your Red Box. This will help secure the paper products so they don't blow out of the box.

All new homeowners can pick up their first recycling Red and Blue Box for **FREE** at our office located at 3540 North Service Road East (corner of Central), between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday thru Friday.

Waste Disposal Information

 You will receive WEEKLY garbage collection. Your garbage day will be identified by a garbage can symbol.



- DO NOT set out garbage prior to 7:00 p.m. on the day before your collection.
- Street Collection: Place at the curb/road edge.
- Alley Collection: Place on the ground or on a stand (no higher than 16") at the alley edge.
- Your time of collection can vary. Please place your garbage out the night before or by 6:00 a.m. on your scheduled collection day.
- If you have questions regarding your garbage collection (ie. what is acceptable) please call 311.
- Unacceptable Garbage These items will NOT be collected curbside:
 Renovation and construction debris, animal waste, grass clippings,
 yard waste, cardboard, fluorescent tubes/lights, household chemical
 waste, paint products, medical waste, syringes, tires, couches,
 concrete, asbestos, bricks, appliances, metal items & electronic
 waste. Bring these items to the Public Drop Off Depot.
- Non Compliant Containers: Do not place garbage out in containers that are Oversized & Overweight. Containers cannot weigh over 20kg/45lb.

Acceptable Garbage Containers









125 Litres maximum size.

Garbage must be placed in bags inside a hard sided container.

Metal or Plastic Containers

- Maximum 125L capacity limit
- Containers cannot exceed 20kg/45lb.
- Maximum 78 cm/31" tall, 51 cm/20" diameter
- 2 handles and a water tight lid
- Do not secure lid to pail
- Collectors will not reach into pails to pull bags out.
 This is unsafe as it could injure workers.

Roll-out Carts

- Carts must have a lower bar 18" from the ground and an upper lift attachment that is 33" from the ground.
- For more information go to youtube.com and search "acceptable garbage cart."
- Roll out carts will only be collected by use of mechanical cart mechanism placed on all garbage trucks. No manual lifting of bags out of carts.
- Capacity limit 363L (96 gallon) or 181.5L (48 gallon) approved roll-out cart.
- No loose garbage inside cart

Split Load Policy:

If you have free and chargeable items in the same load you must go over the scale twice – first with the materials that are 'charged a tipping fee' and the second time to drop off the materials that are free. Otherwise you will be charged the tipping fee on the whole load.



Leaf & Yard Waste

 Place Yard Waste out BEFORE 6:00 a.m. ONLY on your scheduled collection day.

 Brush and branches should be tied in bundles no more than 3' in diameter and weigh no more than 45 lbs/20 kg. Do not use wire to tie the bundles.



- Thorny branches should be placed in boxes, pails or yard waste bags.
- Any untied, loose piles of brush will NOT be collected.
- Place leaves, garden waste, branches, brush, tree & hedge trimmings in acceptable yard waste containers.
- NOT ACCEPTABLE: Yard Waste will not be collected in plastic bags.
- The City of Windsor is NOT responsible for large quantities of brush
- left by commercial tree trimmers working on private property.
- Do not blow leaves onto the roadway. Our street sweeping machines will not collect them.





Missed Collections

Missed collections are upsetting, but there is usually a reason why material was not collected as expected.

To ensure your materials are collected, please make sure they are:

- In acceptable containers (see page 3). Garbage must be placed in bags inside hard sided containers.
- Out by 6:00 a.m.
- Do not overfill containers or place bags on top of containers.
- Not altered. Lids must not be tied to pails.
- Within the weight limit of 20 kg (45 lbs).
- Not hidden behind a vehicle, snow bank, or other obstruction.
- Material is not frozen in pails and /or containers.
- Free of prohibited material (e.g. hazardous or construction/renovation waste).

Other reasons for missed collections are:

- Recyclables not separated properly in Red/Blue Box.
- Syringes found in garbage pails or recycling boxes.
- Garbage/Recyclables/Yard Waste not scheduled for collection that particular day/week.
- Damaged containers/carts i.e. missing bar, wheels or handle.

If an item is not collected for reasons other than the above, please call 311.

TIP: Put drainage holes in the bottom of your container to allow liquids to drain out.








Did you know? Dumping any material on public or private property is illegal, makes our community less attractive, and requires costly clean up.

To dispose of unwanted furniture and large items:

- Consider donation or selling any item in good condition (see page 14).
- Bring the item to the Public Drop Off Depot (see back cover; fees apply).
- Call 311 to schedule a Bulk Item Pick Up
 - Items must be placed at the curb (not in the alley) by 6am on designated day.
 - Items must be less than 200 lbs, under 4ft. wide and 8ft. in length.
 - Restrictions apply; visit www.citywindsor.ca or call 311 for more details.
 - Fees may apply; program is subject to Council approval.



SHIPPING BOXES

How to **PACKAGE** your **CARDBOARD** for recycling.

When recycling your cardboard/shipping boxes, please keep these rules in mind. All plastic materials (shipping wrap, bubbles, liners, etc.) must be removed.


Do NOT tape or tie your cardboard together.



Cardboard (shipping) boxes should be broken down and recycled with other cardboard boxes.







Breakdown large boxes to:

76 cm x 76 cm / 30" x 30" Bundled cardboard should be NO LARGER than a Red Box. Nest smaller boxes inside larger boxes to make a group of cardboard boxes. Nested boxes together should be NO LARGER than 76 cm x 76 cm / 30" x 30".

Rat Extermination Program

Are Rats making it difficult to enjoy your yard?

Minimize interaction by following these simple steps:

- Ensure your garbage container is in good condition and has a secured lid.
- Eliminate sources of water in bird baths, ponds, etc.
- If you feed any animals outside, limit the length of time pet food is placed out.
- Keep your yard free of debris, unsecured garbage and rotting fruits/vegetables.
- If you suspect rats are living on your property, call 311 to inquire about City baiting services.
 Residential external baiting service only (Program subject to Council approval).

Top 8 Windsor CULPRITS

These plastic items go in the GARBAGE!

These are **the top 8 plastic items** sneaking into Windsor recycle boxes. These products cannot be recycled and **need to be thrown in the garbage!**

Throw these plastic items in the garbage!

- Plastic Grocery Bags
 - Chip / Snack Bags
- Frozen Veggie Bags
 - Newspaper Bags
 - Plastic Ziplock (Storage) Bags
- Blue Recycling Bags
- Plastic Case Wrap
- Plastic Product Bags (soil, seed, salt, etc.)

Keep 'Em Separated!

There are two compartments in each recycle truck— one side is for paper and one side is for containers.

Please use the Red Box for paper only and the Blue box for containers only.
