

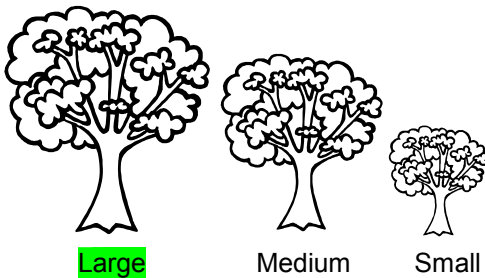
Shagbark Hickory

Carya ovata

Hardiness Zone	4
Mature Height	50-60 feet
Mature Form	Round to oblong
Features	The bark is first smooth and gray. Later broken into long plates attached at the middle, curving away from the trunk resulting in a coarsely shaggy appearance
Insect or Diseases	No common problems
Culture	Prefers deep, moist, rich, well-drained soils under sunny conditions, but is often found in the dry upland soils of woods or fields because of its superior drought tolerance. It tolerates the shade of nearby trees when young, develops its deep taproot system.
Notes	Difficult to transplant due to a deep taproot
